PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The Department is initiating rulemaking to update the Water Quality Credit Trading Rule in Chapter 62-306, F.A.C. Pursuant to Section 403.067, Florida Statutes, Chapter 62-306, F.A.C., was initially adopted in 2010 to establish the requirements for a water quality credit trading (WQCT) program among pollutant sources for purposes of meeting reduction allocations in a Department’s basin management action plan or reasonable assurance plan. Section 373.4134, Florida Statutes, created a new category of credit generator who may sell credits to meet certain water quality requirements of the Environmental Resource Permitting program in Section 373.414, Florida Statutes, as well as allocation reduction requirements in Chapter 62-306, F.A.C. This rulemaking is intended to amend Chapter 62-306, F.A.C., consistent with the statutory changes, as well as update the rules as necessary to effectively and efficiently address the requirements of Section 403.067, Florida Statutes.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: During discussion of the economic impact of this rule at its Board meeting, the Board concluded that this rule change will not have any impact on licensees and their businesses or the businesses that employ them. The rule will not increase any fees, business costs, personnel costs, will not decrease profit opportunities, and will not require any specialized knowledge to comply. This change will not increase any direct or indirect regulatory costs. Hence, the Board determined that a Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs (SERC) was not necessary and that the rule will not require ratification by the Legislature. The 2026 Campus Student Housing project will provide 670 beds on FAU's Boca Raton Campus. This new residence hall will provide accommodation for non-first year students housed in communities of fifty (50) students per RA (Resident Assistant). Estimated at approximately 203,000 GSF, the project will provide a mix of 3- and 4-bedroom semi suite units, equipped with a kitchenette and with each bedroom designed for single occupancy. The communities are supported by a mix of study space, kitchen facilities, laundry units, and flex space distributed on each level and throughout the building to encourage student gathering. Site configuration needs to address connectivity to the campus core, provide shaded outdoor spaces for gathering and passive recreation. The university is committed to building facilities that comply with sustainable energy conservation strategies and standards (minimum LEED silver or equivalent). The

construction budget (including site development) is approximately \$89.5 million; with a total project cost of \$107.5 million.
