The project involves roofing repairs, water intrusion repairs and minor interior renovations in various buildings on the UNF campus. The scope includes roofing and flashing repairs, replacement and sealant replacement. Third party water testing of repaired conditions will be required. Note – the work is to be broken out, with each building to be a separate phase. Work may occur all at one time or in separate phases as determined by UNF. The selected contractor must warrant that it will neither utilize the services of, nor contract with, any supplier, subcontractor or consultant in excess of \$15,000 in connection with this project for a period of 36 months from the date of their being placed on the convicted vendor list.
