PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The amendments conform the rules to the current federal Uniform System of Accounts applicable to electric utilities. The rules have been generally updated and clarified for greater usability.

SUMMARY: The amendments clarify and update the rules to current accounting standards and principles as found in the U.S. Code of Federal Regulations. The amendments also eliminate the requirement that electric utilities retain original source documents for a minimum of three years where the documents have been added to a storage and retrieval system, remove provisions of the rules that reiterate statutory language, and reflect accounting practices presently used by electric utilities.
SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION: The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has been prepared by the Agency.

The SERC examined the factors required by Section 120.541(2)(c), F.S., and concluded that the rule amendment will not have an adverse impact on economic growth, business competitiveness, or small business and that there would likely be transactional cost savings to the individual and entities, including government entities, required to comply with the rule. It is anticipated that investor-owned electric utilities may benefit from the rule updating and clarification efforts.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: based upon the information contained in the SERC.

(i) "Retirement Unit" means an item of utility plant which, when placed into service, is capitalized and when removed from service, with or without replacement, is always retired. (3) All depreciable property is considered as consisting of (a) retirement units and (b) minor items of property. ~~Each utility shall implement the list of retirement units referred to in subsection (12) of this rule as of the beginning of the next fiscal year following the adoption of this rule.~~ This list can be expanded by any utility without other authorization from this Commission as long as the cost of the additional item is more than \$500. In the case of such expansion, the utility should notify the ~~Division of Economics Commission Clerk~~ within thirty days as to the nature and justification of the expansion.

(4) The addition and retirement of retirement units should be accounted for as follows:

(b) When a retirement unit is replaced, the cost of the replacing item should be accounted for in the same manner as in paragraph (a) if the ~~item is~~ cost meets the criteria set forth in the "List of Retirement Units," referred to in subsection (12). Any cost of removal and gross salvage associated with the retirement should likewise be debited and credited, respectively, to the account reserve. Costs of the retiring unit, removal and salvage should be recorded within one month of the retirement date and may be estimated with corrective adjustment entries made when the transactions are finalized.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the rule is to adopt Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs), and their allocations, for certain waters impaired for nutrients in the Peace River Basin. Furthermore, in accordance with paragraph 62-302.531(2)(a), F.A.C., the nutrient TMDLs for Lake Bonny, Lake Hollingsworth, Lake Lena, and Deer Lake will constitute site specific numeric interpretations of the narrative nutrient criterion set forth in paragraph 62-302.530(47)(b), F.A.C., that will supersede the otherwise applicable numeric nutrient criteria in subsection 62-302.531(2), F.A.C., for these surface water segments.

SUMMARY: These TMDLs address certain nutrient impairments in the Peace River Basin. Specifically, the nutrient TMDL rules being proposed for adoption are for Lake Bonny (WBID 1497E), Lake Hollingsworth (WBID 1549X), Lake Lena (WBID 1501), and Deer Lake (WBID 1521P). These waterbodies were verified for nutrient impairments due to elevated chlorophyll a concentrations using the methodology established in Chapter 62-303, F.A.C., Identification of Impaired Surface Waters. The methodology used to develop the TMDLs was the percent reduction method. This rulemaking has been given an OGC case number 14-0451.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION: The Agency has determined that this will have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. 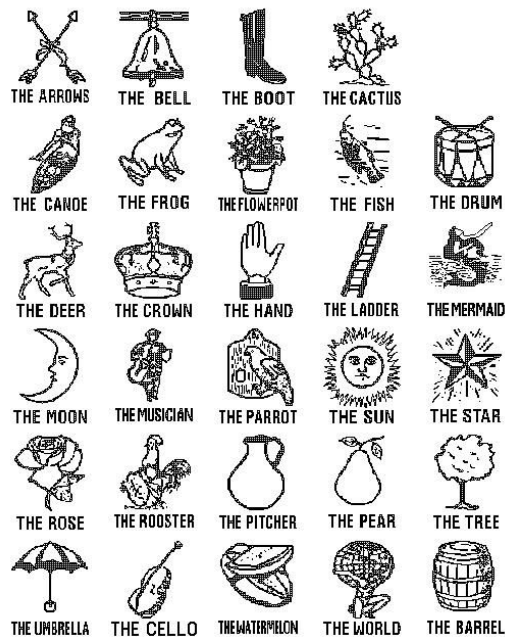

(1) Beginning December 2, 2014, and continuing through February 10, 2015, the Florida Lottery (or “Lottery”) will conduct the \$25,000 Dream Makeover Second Chance Promotion (or “Promotion”) in which players can enter their non-winning Florida Lottery \$25,000 DREAM MAKEOVER Scratch-Off tickets (or “\$25,000 DREAM MAKEOVER Scratch-Off tickets”) on the Florida Lottery website for a chance to win \$100, \$500 or \$25,000 in The Home Depot® gift cards. Winning \$25,000 DREAM MAKEOVER Scratch-Off tickets cannot be used for entry into the second chance promotion.

In each drawing, the Lottery will draw a total of three hundred fifty-one entries using a certified random number generation process.  APPROVING MONROE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 013-

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to §§ 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes, approving land development

regulations adopted by Monroe County, Florida, Ordinance No. 013-2014 (the "Ordinance").

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Florida Keys Area is designated by § 380.0552, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. Monroe County is a local government within the Florida Keys Area.
2. The Ordinance was adopted by Monroe County on August 20, 2014, and rendered to the Department on October 9, 2014.
3. The Ordinance amends the Monroe County Land Development Code by modifying Chapter 101 (General Provisions), Section 101-1 (Definitions – mobile businesses) and Chapter 130 (Land Use Districts), Article IV (Overlay Districts), Section 130-24 (Home occupation special use permit.) These specific sections were revised to add a definition for Mobile Businesses and to modify and add language and criteria for home occupations and the special use permits that govern them.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. § 380.05(6) and § 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes.
5. "Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. § 380.031(8), Florida Statutes. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.
6. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. §§ 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in § 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes.
7. The Ordinance is consistent with the Monroe County Comprehensive Plan generally, and specifically with Goal 101, and Objectives 101.3, 101.4, and 105.1.
8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development in section 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes, as a whole, and is specifically consistent with the following Principle:
 - (a) Strengthening local government capabilities for managing land use and development so that local government is able to achieve these objectives without continuing the area of critical state concern designation.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that Monroe County Ordinance No. 013-2014 is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby APPROVED.

This Order becomes effective 21 days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below.
