Compliance with Chapter 394, Part I, 408, Part II, and Subsection 409.1678(3), F.S. shall be a condition of licensure. Application for licensure shall be made to the Agency on AHCA Form 3180-5004, February 2015, Health Care Licensing Application Residential Treatment Center for Children and Adolescents, which is incorporated by reference and available online at http://ahca.myflorida.com/MCHQ/Health_Facility_Regulation/Hospital_Outpatient/rte.shtml.~~

~~(3) License fee. An application fee of \$240 per bed shall accompany an initial license application, change of ownership application, and license renewal application. For capacity changes effective during the license period, a \$25 license reprint fee applies. In addition, the application fee for capacity increases shall be the per bed fee for each additional bed to be added to the license. All fees are non refundable. The fee shall be reasonably calculated annually and adjusted by the agency to cover the cost of regulation.~~

 NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on June 2, 2015, the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission received a petition for a waiver of paragraph 11B-27.00213(4)(b), F.A.C., from Stacy Arias, Florida Department of Corrections, on behalf of Ishwan Spradley. The Petitioner wishes to waive that portion of the rule that states: (4) Agencies applying to temporarily employ or appoint an individual who has had a previous TEA registered with the Commission in the same discipline, may do so only if: (b) The individual was

previously hired on a TEA and has separated from the employing agency or discontinued training while still in good standing, and has had a break-in-service from the last employment for a minimum of four years. Such individual shall comply with the firearms training requirements pursuant to Rule 11B-35.0024, F.A.C. and paragraph 943.17(1)(a), F.S., unless the agency administrator has waived such requirements in subsection (2) of this rule section, and shall enroll in a Commission-approved Basic Recruit Training Program within 180 days of employment in the first training program offered in the geographic area, or in the first assigned state training program for a state officer.

Petitioner states that Mr. Spradley was hired by the Department of Corrections on January 17, 2014 as a correctional officer in a Temporary Employment Authorization (TEA) status. Petitioner states that Mr. Spradley began active military duty on May 27, 2014, prior to being enrolled in a training academy. Petitioner states that Mr. Spradley was released from active duty on January 14, 2015 and on April 11, 2015 Mr. Spradley notified Jefferson Correctional Institution of his intent to return to duty. Petitioner states that a human resource officer with the Department of Corrections contacted FDLE regarding the period that could be tolled due to Mr. Spradley's military service and was advised that tolling only applied to the time covered by the DD-214 which ended January 17, 2015. Petitioner states that the waiver is requested so that Mr. Spradley can be rehired under a second Temporary Employment Authorization. Petitioner states that the purpose of the underlying statute would be served if the waiver were to be granted and that a strict application of the rule would result in unreasonable, unfair and unintended results in this instance.  NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on July 9, 2015, the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission received a petition for a waiver of paragraph 11B-35.002(2)(a), F.A.C., from the Miami-Dade Corrections and Rehabilitation Department on behalf of Venda Milton. The Petitioner wishes to waive that portion of the rule that states: Within four years of the beginning date of a Commission-approved Basic Recruit Training Program, an individual shall successfully complete the program, achieve a passing score on the

applicable State Officer Certification Examination (SOCE) pursuant to Rule 11B-30.0062, F.A.C., and gain employment and certification as an officer. Petitioner states that Ms. Milton began the Correctional Officer basic recruit program with the Miami-Dade Corrections and Rehabilitation Department on February 23, 2010. Petitioner states that Ms. Milton was unable to complete the basic recruit program in part because of an injury. Petitioner states that Ms. Milton subsequently completed the program on March 30, 2011 and passed the State Officer Certification Exam on May 25, 2011.

Petitioner states that Ms. Milton applied for employment as a certified correctional officer with the Miami-Dade Corrections and Rehabilitation Department on August 10, 2013. Petitioner states that because of a hiring freeze and application processing delays, Ms. Milton was not approved for employment until February 2, 2015. Petitioner states that due to an administrative oversight it was believed that Ms. Milton had until May 25, 2015 to become employed; however, the four-year grace period ran out on February 23, 2014. Petitioner states that Miami-Dade Corrections and Rehabilitation Department has an immediate need for Ms. Milton as a certified corrections officer; the purpose of the underlying statute would be served if the waiver is granted and a strict application of the rule would result in unreasonable, unfair and unintended results in this instance.

Petitioner states the purpose of the underlying statute would be served if the waiver is granted and a strict application of the rule would result in a substantial financial hardship for Mr. Carlton creating an unreasonable, unfair and unintended result in this instance.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on July 17, 2015, the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission received a petition for a waiver of paragraph 11B-27.00212(14)(e), F.A.C., from J.D. Patterson, Director, Miami-Dade Police Department on behalf of Officer Willie McFadden. The Petitioner wishes to waive that portion of the rule that states: In the event a law enforcement officer is injured in the line of duty or has a chronic illness and fails to meet this standard by June 30 of a reporting year, the agency administrator or designee shall complete the Injury or Illness Exemption for the Firearms Law Enforcement Officer Qualification Standard, form CJSTC-86B, created January 29, 2009, hereby incorporated by reference: <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-01097>, and revised December 16, 2010, (effective 5/2012). Form CJSTC-86B can be obtained at the following FDLE Internet address:

<http://www.fdle.state.fl.us/Content/CJST/Publications/Professionalism-Program-Forms.aspx>, or by contacting Commission staff at (850)410-8615. The agency shall submit form CJSTC-86B and the supporting medical documentation to Commission staff prior to the June 30 deadline to ensure the officer's certificate does not become inactive on the reporting deadline for that two-year reporting cycle. An additional form CJSTC-86B shall be submitted for each subsequent reporting

cycle. Petitioner states that Officer McFadden was involved in a severe off-duty motorcycle accident on August 19, 2012 resulting in him being medically unable to work for several months. Petitioner states that Officer McFadden was able to return to work on light-duty status November 6, 2012 however, during recovery Officer McFadden was diagnosed with cancer and began a regimen of chemotherapy and other surgeries. Petitioner states that Officer McFadden was again able to return to work on light-duty status December 31, 2014. Petitioner states that as a result of Officer McFadden's injuries and illness, he is unable to meet firearm qualifications.
