PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Rule 14-15.0081 to incorporate the toll rate schedule effective October 29, 2017.

SUMMARY: The rule adjusts tolls in accordance with s. 338.165(3), F.S. based on the consumer price index. The rule provides the five year adjustment of cash tolls in accordance with s. 338.165(3), F.S. and Rule 14-51.0081(2)(f)(3), F.A.C.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Rule 14-100.003 is being amended to reflect recent legislative changes to s. 338.2216, F.S., on turnpike express lane tolling. Rule 14-100.004 is being amended to expand I-95 toll exemptions for registered vehicles from a single segment to three counties.

SUMMARY: These rule amendments provide for variable tolling on turnpike express lanes based on level of service. A toll exemption for registered vehicles travelling on I-95 express lanes is expanded from a select segment to express lanes in three counties.

1. All authorized users, except for school buses, public transit buses, Over-the-Road buses, or vanpools that register in the manner described in subparagraph (3)(c)2., will pay: ~~at least \$0.25 more than the SunPass toll for the general toll lanes that are adjacent to the express lanes.~~

a. The SunPass toll for the adjacent general toll lanes when the express lane is operating at Level of Service A.

b. The SunPass toll for the adjacent general toll lanes plus \$0.25 when the express lane is operating at Level of Service B.

c. A variable toll when the express lane is operating at Level or Service other than Level of Service A or Level of Service B.

The provisions of this section apply to ~~the~~ any express lanes on I-95 ~~from just south of SR 112/I 195 in Miami-Dade County, Broward and Palm Beach counties to just north of I-595 in Broward County.~~

(1) Purpose. To address congestion and to offer travel-choice options to motorists in South Florida, the 95 Express project implements a combination of tolling, technology, travel demand management and transit elements into a single project along the Interstate 95 corridor ~~from just south SR 112/I 195 in Miami-Dade County to just north of I-595 in Broward County.~~ Tolls will be collected electronically. Toll exemptions are allowed for certain vehicle types as specified in this section. Both the tolls and toll exemptions are intended to provide incentives for increased vehicle occupancy, shift in travel demand, and overall congestion relief.

(2) South Florida Commuter Services (SFCS) along with SunPass are partnering to administer the fulfillment and registration process pertaining to this portion of 95 Express Project. SFCS is the regional commuter assistance program funded by the Florida Department of Transportation. SunPass is the Florida Department of Transportation's Prepaid Toll Program. This rule sets forth the process to register for exemption from payment of tolls on 95 Express ~~Phases 1 and 2~~ in Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach counties.

~~(3) Definitions.~~

~~"95 Express Phases 1 and 2" is defined to mean the express lanes on I-95 from just south of SR 112/I 195 in Miami-Dade County to just north of I-595 in Broward County.~~

~~(4)(3) Exemptions. The following qualify for an exemption from payment of tolls on 95 Express Phases 1 and 2 in Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach Counties:~~

(a) Carpools with three or more occupants, traveling to and from work in one motor vehicle, and registered in the manner described in subsection (5) ~~(6)~~, below. ~~This exemption from payment of tolls on 95 Express Phases 1 and 2 shall not apply to any other express lanes.~~

(b) Vanpools meeting the definition in paragraph 14-100.006(2)(d), F.A.C., and registered pursuant to subsection 14-100.006(4), F.A.C. ~~This exemption from payment of tolls on 95 Express Phases 1 and 2 shall not apply to any other express lanes.~~

(c) Inherently Low Emission Vehicles (ILEV) or Hybrid vehicles, as defined in Section 316.0741, F.S., with valid Department of Motor Vehicles decals, and registered in the manner described in subsection (5) ~~(6)~~, below. ~~This exemption from payment of tolls on 95 Express Phases 1 and 2 shall not apply to any other express lanes.~~

(g) Motorcycles, as defined in Section 316.003, F.S. ~~This exemption from payment of tolls on 95 Express Phases 1 and 2 shall not apply to any other express lanes.~~

~~(5)(4)~~ Registered carpools shall only be granted free passage if the motor vehicle has the minimum number of occupants specified in paragraph ~~(4)(3)(a)~~, above; otherwise such user shall be required to pay the applicable tolls.

~~(6)(5)~~ With registration, decals will be provided by SFCS for the following motor vehicles eligible for an exemption from payment of tolls on 95 Express ~~Phases 1 and 2~~ in Miami-Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach Counties: 3+ occupant carpools, ILEV, and hybrid vehicles.

1. (b)(g) Application of principles and methods related to strength training, cardiovascular fitness, and performance enhancement Conditioning;

(c)(h) Performance of tests and measurements to prevent, evaluate and monitor acute and chronic injuries or conditions;

(d)(i) Selection of preventive and supportive devices, temporary splinting and bracing, protective equipment, taping, strapping, and other immobilization devices or and techniques to protect an injury or condition injured structure, facilitate ambulation and restore normal functioning;

(e)(j) Organization and administration including the development and implementation of strategies and procedures to minimize risk and to promote safety and wellness of facilities within the scope of the profession;

(f) Recognition of factors related to injuries, illnesses, and conditions within the scope of the profession as well as correcting or modifying inappropriate, unsafe, or dangerous activity;

(g) Design, review and/or revise policies and procedures related to prevention, care, and rehabilitation as well as emergency action plans to guide appropriate patient care, establish a sound, unified response to events, and to optimize outcomes overall;

(k) Creating, maintaining, and completing patient care and administrative documentation consistent with professional practice guidelines or requirements;

(l) Knowledge of professional standards of practice and ethics, and ensure those standards are implemented as part of an athletic trainer's duties and responsibilities;

(m) Knowledge of basic business principles, policies and procedures, organizational, and resource management;

(3)(2) For treatment and rehabilitation of musculoskeletal muscle skeletal injuries the athletic trainer may utilize administer the following therapeutic interventions:

(a) Therapeutic Exercise;

(b) Massage and soft tissue mobilization;

(c) Mechanical Devices (e.g., continuous passive motion, isokinetics, treadmill with or without differential air pressure);

(d) through (e) No change.

(f) Other therapeutic agents with the properties of water (e.g., whirlpool); electricity (e.g., electrical stimulation, diathermy); light (e.g., infrared, ultraviolet, laser therapy); or sound (e.g., ultrasound).

(4)(3) The athletic trainer may apply topical prescription medications (e.g., steroid preparation for phonophoresis) only at the direction of a physician.

(5) A licensed athletic trainer shall report new or recurring injuries or conditions to a physician in a timely fashion and in the manner requested by the physician.

(6) Nothing herein shall be construed to prevent a person from administering standard first aid treatment. In the absence of a physician being available at a practice, competitive event, or other setting where a licensed athletic trainer is present, the licensed athletic trainer may provide first aid and preventative measures and implement appropriate procedures and strategies for transport and/or referral to a physician's office, hospital, or other healthcare facility.

(7) A licensed athletic trainer shall maintain the following regarding the standards of practice:

(a) A licensed athletic trainer shall neither practice nor condone discrimination on the basis or race, creed, national origin, sex, age, handicap, disease entity; social status, financial status or religious affiliation;

(b) A licensed athletic trainer shall provide competent care consistent with both the requirements and the limitation of the athletic training profession;

(c) A licensed athletic trainer shall comply with applicable local, state, and federal laws;

(d) A licensed athletic trainer shall preserve the confidentiality of privileged information and shall not release such information to a third party not involved in the patient's care unless the patient consents to such release or release is permitted or required by law;

(e) A licensed athletic trainer shall report illegal or

unethical practice pertaining to athletic training to the appropriate person or authority:

(f) A licensed athletic trainer shall not misrepresent in any manner, either directly or indirectly, their skills, training, professional credentials, qualifications, identity, or services;
