 62-304.515 Kissimmee River Basin TMDLs

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the rule is to adopt Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs), and their allocations, for certain waters impaired for nutrients in the Kissimmee River Basin. Furthermore, in accordance with paragraph 62-302.531(2)(a), F.A.C., the nutrient TMDLs for Lake Persimmon will constitute site specific numeric interpretations of the narrative nutrient criterion set forth in paragraph 62-302.530(48)(b), F.A.C., that will supersede the otherwise applicable numeric nutrient criteria in subsection 62-302.531(2), F.A.C., for these surface water segments.

SUMMARY: These TMDLs address certain nutrient impairments in the Kissimmee River Basin. Specifically, the nutrient TMDL rules being proposed for adoption are for Lake Persimmon (1938E). This waterbody was verified for nutrient impairments due to elevated chlorophyll a concentrations, using the methodology established in Chapter 62-303, F.A.C. This rulemaking has been given an OGC case number 18-1094.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has been prepared by the Agency.

The SERC estimates that there will be no additional costs within one year after the rule becoming effective, but total costs after implementation of the rule are estimated to be \$57,361 per year for Lake Persimmon; the majority of which is expected to be borne by governmental entities in the watersheds.

Pursuant to paragraph 403.067(6)(c), Florida Statutes, the proposed rules do not require legislative ratification.

62-304.515 Kissimmee River Basin TMDLs.

(1) through (5) No change.

(6) Lake Persimmon. The nutrient TMDL for Lake Persimmon is a seven-year rolling average of annual loads of 1,247 pounds per year (lb/year) TN and 58 lb/year TP, which is intended to achieve the applicable annual geometric mean chlorophyll *a* criterion for low color and high alkalinity lakes, and is allocated as follows:

(a) The WLA for wastewater point sources is not applicable.

(b) The WLA for discharges subject to the Department's NPDES MS4 Permitting Program is a 42 % reduction of TN (calculated from 2,153 lb/year) and a 51 % reduction of TP (calculated from 119 lb/year), which are based on the highest seven-year rolling average of annual loads from the 2005-2016 period.

(c) The LA for nonpoint sources is a 42 % reduction of TN (calculated from 2,153 lb/year) and a 51 % reduction of TP (calculated from 119 lb/year), which are based on the highest seven-year rolling average of annual loads from the 2005-2016 period, and

(d) The Margin of Safety is implicit.

(e) While the LA for TN and TP has been expressed as the percent reduction needed to attain the applicable Class III nutrient criteria, it is the combined reductions from both anthropogenic point and nonpoint sources that will result in the restoration of nutrient conditions in the impaired waterbody. However, it is not the intent of this TMDL to abate natural background conditions.

68B-13.010 Stone Crab Trap Limitation Program

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this rule amendment is to improve the management of the stone crab trap fishery by modifying the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's (Commission) stone crab regulations found in Chapter 68B-13, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.).

The effect of this rule amendment will be to create a Recreational Stone Crab Trap Registration system to improve estimates of participation and fishing effort in the recreational stone crab trap fishery, and to improve recreational harvest data collection by identifying the population of recreational harvesters targeting stone crabs with traps. This rule amendment will require certain recreational harvesters to report their intention to harvest or attempt to harvest stone crabs using traps in Florida waters or adjacent federal waters by completing the Recreational Stone Crab Trap Registration each year, and will require recreational harvesters to permanently mark each trap used to target stone crabs with a unique recreational stone crab trap identification number assigned by the Commission. Children under 16 years of age, as well as harvesters fishing from state-licensed for-hire vessels or harvesters fishing from a state-licensed recreational fishing vessel would be exempt from the reporting and trap marking requirements. Additionally, this rule amendment will modify the commercial Stone Crab Trap Limitation Program regulations to require that commercial stone crab harvesters maintain active commercial licenses to retain their stone crab trap allotment.

SUMMARY: This rule amendment would create a Recreational Stone Crab Trap Registration system, which would require certain recreational harvesters to report their intention to harvest or attempt to harvest stone crabs using traps in Florida

waters or adjacent federal waters each year, and would also require recreational harvesters to permanently mark each trap used to target stone crabs with unique recreational stone crab trap identification numbers assigned by the Commission. Additionally, this rule amendment would require commercial harvesters to maintain active commercial licenses to retain their commercial stone crab trap allotment.

68B-13.009 Recreational Stone Crab Harvest: Bag Limit, Trap Limit, Trap Marking Requirements, Trap Pulling, Recreational Stone Crab Trap Registration Requirement.

(1) through (2) No Change.

(3) TRAP MARKING REQUIREMENTS.

(a) The buoy attached to each trap used to harvest stone crabs, other than those used to harvest for commercial purposes, shall have a legible "R", at least two inches high, permanently affixed to it. A buoy is not required on a trap fished from a dock.

(b) Each ~~The~~ trap shall have the harvester's full name, and address, and unless exempt pursuant to paragraph (4)(d), a valid recreational stone crab trap identification number assigned by the Recreational Stone Crab Trap Registration pursuant to subsection (4), permanently affixed to it in legible letters. ~~The buoy requirements of this subparagraph shall not apply to traps fished from a dock.~~

(4) REPORTING REQUIREMENT. The purpose and intent of this subsection is to improve recreational harvest data collection capabilities and estimates of trap effort for the recreational stone crab trap fishery by identifying the population of recreational harvesters participating in this trap fishery.

(a) Recreational harvesters are required to report their intention to harvest or attempt to harvest stone crabs using traps in the upcoming year. A recreational harvester may not deploy a stone crab trap authorized by subsection 68B-13.008(2) or harvest from or attempt to harvest from, fish with, set, or place such a trap within or without Florida Waters, unless that person has reported their intention to do so by completing the Recreational Stone Crab Trap Registration within the previous 12 months. Upon completion of the Recreational Stone Crab Trap Registration, a recreational harvester will be assigned a series of five recreational stone crab trap identification numbers.

(b) Under Section 379.401(1), F.S., failure to file reports required of persons who hold recreational licenses is a non-criminal infraction.

(c) Proof of registration required in paragraph (a) must be in the personal possession of the recreational harvester while the recreational harvester is harvesting from or attempting to harvest from, fish with, set, or place a stone crab trap authorized by subsection 68B-13.008(2) within or without Florida Waters, or in possession of a stone crab trap authorized by subsection 68B-13.008(2) within or without Florida Waters.

(d) Persons meeting the criteria outlined in paragraphs 379.353(2)(a), (i), (j), and (o), F.S., are exempt from the reporting requirement established by this subsection.

~~(5)(4)~~ TRAP PULLING. Except for persons harvesting pursuant to a saltwater products license with a stone crab endorsement and a restricted species endorsement, no person shall use any means other than manual means to pull stone crab traps in or from the waters of the State of Florida.

68B-24.005 Seasons

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this rule amendment is to modify the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's (Commission) spiny lobster regulations, Chapter 68B-24, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), that establish the pre-season spiny lobster trap soak period and the post-season spiny lobster trap removal period.

The effect of this rule amendment will be to modify the pre-season spiny lobster trap soak period to begin the Saturday following the recreational spiny lobster sport season (mini-season), and to increase the amount of time allowed for commercial harvesters to remove spiny lobster traps from Florida waters from 5 days to 10 days after the end of the harvest season. These regulatory changes are intended to allow commercial spiny lobster trap fishers to take full advantage of the open harvest season and are in response to requests from the commercial spiny lobster fishery.

SUMMARY: This rule amendment will modify the pre-season spiny lobster trap soak period to begin the Saturday following the recreational spiny lobster sport season (mini-season) each year, and will increase the amount of time allowed for commercial harvesters to remove spiny lobster traps from Florida waters from 5 days to 10 days after the end of the harvest season.

(3) Harvesters of spiny lobster using traps may bait and place their traps in the water beginning on the Saturday immediately following the recreational sport season established in subsection (2) August 1 of each year. Harvest or sale of spiny lobster from such traps during the “soak” period prior to the beginning of the season is prohibited.

(4) All traps used for harvest of spiny lobster shall be removed from state waters by April 10 of each year. All spiny lobster taken from traps after the close of a season on March 31 shall be returned to the water free, alive, and unharmed. harvesters to permanently mark each trap used to target blue crabs in Florida waters with unique recreational blue crab trap identification numbers assigned by the Commission.

SUMMARY: This rulemaking would create a Recreational Blue Crab Trap Registration system, which would require certain recreational harvesters to report their intention to harvest or attempt to harvest blue crabs using traps in Florida waters each year. This rulemaking would also require recreational harvesters to permanently mark each trap used to target blue crabs in Florida waters with unique recreational blue crab trap identification numbers assigned by the Commission.

Waters, unless that person has reported their intention to do so by completing the Recreational Blue Crab Trap Registration within the previous 12 months. Upon completion of the Recreational Blue Crab Trap Registration, a recreational harvester will be assigned a series of five recreational blue crab trap identification numbers.

(b) Under Section 379.401(1), F.S., failure to file reports required of persons who hold recreational licenses is a non-criminal infraction.

(2) Proof of registration required in subsection (1) must be in the personal possession of the recreational harvester while the recreational harvester is harvesting or attempting to harvest blue crabs with a trap authorized by paragraph 68B-45.004(1)(a) or subsections 68B-45.004(2)-(3) in or on Florida Waters, or in possession of a blue crab trap authorized by paragraph 68B-45.004(1)(a) or subsections 68B-45.004(2)-(3) or blue crab harvested from such traps in or on Florida Waters.
