PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To establish procedures for school districts to plan and document delivery of required instruction related to Substance Use and Abuse Health Education for grades K-12 students.

SUMMARY: To reinforce the current substance use and abuse health education requirement, school districts must annually submit an implementation plan and annual report documenting instruction for students in grades K-12 related to substance use and abuse prevention.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: This proposed rule is not expected to have any adverse impact on economic growth, business competitiveness or any other factors listed in s. 120.541(2)(a), F.S., and is not expected to require legislative ratification, as the instruction in substance use and abuse health education is already required by statute. Instruction is expected to align with health standards already in place and it is anticipated that this required instruction will be part of existing courses.

(1) School districts must annually provide instruction to students in grades K-12 related to youth substance use and abuse health education.

(2) Using the health education standards adopted in Rule 6A-1.09401, F.A.C., Student Performance Standards, the instruction for substance use and abuse education will advance each year through developmentally appropriate instruction and skill building.

(3) By December 1 of each year, each school district must submit an implementation plan to the commissioner at SubstanceAbusePrevention@fldoe.org and post the plan on the school district website. The implementation plan must include:

(a) The specific courses in which instruction will be delivered for each grade level;

(b) The professional qualifications of the person delivering instruction; and

(c) A description of the materials and resources utilized to deliver instruction.

(4) By July 1 of each year, each school district must submit an annual report to the commissioner at SubstanceAbusePrevention@fldoe.org. The report must verify completion of the instruction and include:

(a) The specific courses in which instruction will be delivered for each grade level;

(b) The professional qualifications of the person delivering instruction; and

(c) A description of the materials and resources utilized to deliver instruction.

(5) Failure to comply with the requirements of this rule may result in the imposition of sanctions described in Section 1008.32, F.S.

6A-4.0181 Specialization Requirements for Certification in ~~School Guidance and Counseling~~ (Grades PK-12) – Specialty Class ~~Beginning July 1, 1990~~.

(1) Plan One. A master’s or higher degree with a graduate major in guidance and counseling or school counseling that includes a minimum of six-hundred (600) clock hours of supervised practicum/internship serving school-aged students in a prekindergarten, an elementary or a secondary school setting; or

(2) Plan Two. A master’s or higher degree with a graduate major in counseling other than guidance and counseling or school counseling as specified in subsection (1) of this rule that includes a minimum of six-hundred (600) clock hours of supervised practicum/internship with school-aged children and their families in a setting other than a prekindergarten, an elementary or a secondary school with at least nine (9) semester hours of graduate credit to include the following specified areas:

(a) Student appraisal and evaluation methods in prekindergarten, elementary and secondary schools including interpretation and analysis of standardized tests and other assessment results that assist students in career exploration, academic skills and personal/social skill development;

(b) College and career planning for prekindergarten, elementary and secondary school students including college and career exploration and knowledge of financial aid and financing of postsecondary education options;

(c) Principles, philosophy, organization and administration of a comprehensive school counseling program in prekindergarten, elementary and secondary schools;

(d) Consultation skills and techniques for conferring with groups such as agencies, teachers and parents; and

(e) Verification submitted by employer to attest that a school counselor with a state-issued professional certificate as specified in Rule 6A-4.004, F.A.C., will be assigned as the applicant’s mentor during the first two (2) years of employment as a school counselor; or

(3) Plan Three. A master’s or higher degree with a major in an education field and verification of three (3) years of full-time teaching experience as specified in paragraph 6A-4.002(5)(a), F.A.C., with thirty (30) semester hours of graduate credit with associated field experience to include the following specified areas:

(a) Principles, philosophy, organization and administration of a comprehensive school counseling program in prekindergarten, elementary and secondary schools;

(b) Student appraisal and evaluation methods in prekindergarten, elementary and secondary schools including interpretation and analysis of standardized tests and other assessment results that assist students in career exploration, academic skills and personal/social skill development;

(c) College and career planning for prekindergarten, elementary and secondary school students including college and career exploration and knowledge of financial and financing postsecondary options;

(d) Learning and human development theories;

(e) Counseling theories appropriate for students in prekindergarten, elementary and secondary schools;

(f) Individual counseling techniques appropriate for students in prekindergarten, elementary and secondary schools;

(g) Group counseling techniques appropriate in prekindergarten, elementary and secondary schools including psycho-educational and counseling for large and small groups;

(h) Consultation skills and techniques for conferring with groups such as agencies, teachers and parents;

(i) Legal, ethical, advocacy, equity and current policy issues affecting prekindergarten, elementary and secondary school counselors and school counseling programs, including confidentiality practices appropriate to school counseling;

(j) Counseling interventions provided through a multi-tiered system of supports framework for use with prekindergarten-, elementary- or secondary-level special populations, such as students with exceptional needs; students who are ethnically, racially, culturally or linguistically diverse; students of varying socioeconomic status; students exposed to trauma; and students at risk of dropping out, to include knowledge of the unique needs of these populations;

(k) Social and cultural diversity including coverage of multicultural counseling competencies and strategies for eliminating barriers to prekindergarten, elementary and secondary student achievement;

(l) Program evaluation and accountability including evidence-based practices, qualitative and quantitative research methods, needs assessment, data analysis and interpretation, and use of data in prekindergarten, elementary and secondary school counseling; and

(m) Verification submitted by employer to attest that a school counselor with a state-issued professional certificate as specified in Rule 6A-4.004, F.A.C., will be assigned as the applicant’s mentor during the first two (2) years of employment as a school counselor.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To adopt a rule that will require quick reporting to the Department of Education by school districts when there are allegations of misconduct by school district staff that affect the health, safety or welfare of a student. Additionally, the purpose is to clarify the alleged misconduct that requires expeditious reporting and the information that should be reported. The effect of the rule will be to promote expeditious investigation of complaints by the Department of Education, as well as allowing a timely mechanism for the Commissioner of Education to exercise his authority to recommend removal of school district personnel from direct student contact.

SUMMARY: Reporting to Florida Department of Education of misconduct by school district staff.

**SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:**

6A-10.082 Mandatory Reporting of Offenses Affecting the Health, Safety and Welfare of Florida Students.

(1) Definitions. For the purposes of this rule, the following definitions apply:

(a) "Administrative personnel" means any K-12 personnel, as defined by s. 1012.01(3), Florida Statutes.

(b) "Instructional personnel" means any K-12 staff member as defined by s. 1012.01(2), Florida Statutes.

(c) "Substantiated allegation" means evidence of guilt that goes beyond reasonable suspicion and which supports a finding of probable cause to believe the conduct has occurred. It does not require the completion of an investigation and can be a preliminary determination.

(2) Beginning with the 2019-20 school year, within twenty-four (24) hours of the matter coming to the attention of a school district, a school district superintendent must report to the Department of Education an arrest or conviction of any administrative or instructional personnel for any of the offenses

listed below. The same reporting requirements apply where there are substantiated allegations of misconduct by any administrative or instructional personnel that would constitute any of the offenses listed below, regardless of whether there has been an arrest or conviction.

(a) Felony offenses:

1. Section 782.04, F.S., relating to murder.

2. Section 782.07, F.S., relating to manslaughter, aggravated manslaughter of an elderly person or disabled adult, aggravated manslaughter of a child, or aggravated manslaughter of an officer, a firefighter, an emergency medical technician, or a paramedic.

3. Section 787.01, F.S., relating to kidnapping.

4. Section 787.025, F.S., relating to luring or enticing a child.

5. Section 787.04(2), F.S., relating to leading, taking, enticing, or removing a minor beyond the state limits, or concealing the location of a minor, with criminal intent pending custody proceedings.

6. Section 787.04(3), F.S., relating to leading, taking, enticing, or removing a minor beyond the state limits, or concealing the location of a minor, with criminal intent pending dependency proceedings or proceedings concerning alleged abuse or neglect of a minor.

7. Section 794.011, F.S., relating to sexual battery.

8. Section 794.05, F.S., relating to unlawful sexual activity with certain minors.

9. Section 825.1025, F.S., relating to lewd or lascivious offenses committed upon or in the presence of an elderly person or disabled person.

10. Section 827.071, F.S., relating to sexual performance by a child.

(b) Misdemeanor offenses: Section 787.025, F.S., relating to luring or enticing a child.

(c) Any criminal act committed in another state, or under federal law, which if committed in Florida constitutes an offense prohibited under any statute listed in subsections (2)(a) or (2)(b) of this rule.

(3) The superintendent's report to the Department of Education must include, at a minimum:

(a) the name of the instructional or administrative staff person arrested, convicted, or implicated by a substantiated allegation of misconduct;

(b) the name of the institution where the person is or was employed;

(c) the date on which the school district became aware of the arrest, conviction, or substantiated allegation of misconduct; and

(d) a description of any action taken by the district in response.

 PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To add interim standard scores and effective dates for the Next-generation ACCUPLACER exam in the subject areas of 1) reading, 2) writing and 3) quantitative reasoning, algebra and statistics. College Board anticipates the Classic ACCUPLACER will no longer be an available assessment option after January 2020 as it has been replaced by the Next-generation ACCUPLACER. Including Next-generation ACCUPLACER standard scores provides more opportunities for students to demonstrate readiness for college-level work.

SUMMARY: Standard scores for the Next-generation ACCUPLACER are not in rule. Additionally, the FCAT score for reading that expired March 2017 and the SAT scores for critical reading and mathematics expired March 2016, respectively, need to be removed.

A student admitted to a Florida College System institution whose score on a common placement test indicates a need for developmental education must be advised of all the developmental education options offered at the institution and, after advisement, shall be allowed to enroll in the developmental education option of his or her choice. Colleges must allow students to enroll in developmental education courses.

6M-8.601 Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) Provider Kindergarten Readiness Rate.

(1) Purpose. The purpose of this rule is to implement the requirements of Section 1002.69, F.S.

(2) Accuracy of Data.

(a) Prior to the calculation of the final VPK Provider Kindergarten Readiness Rate, as described in subsection (3) of this rule, private and public school VPK providers shall have the opportunity to review a cumulative list of all of the children served in their program and the total number of hours they attended.

(b) Verification. The private or public provider may verify the accuracy or submit suggested corrections to the cumulative list of VPK participants or the total number of hours the VPK participants attended when such change would result in their inclusion or exclusion in the calculation of the VPK Provider Kindergarten Readiness Rate, as measured by the threshold of seventy (70%) percent, as described in subparagraph (3)(a)1. of this rule. The provider may submit corrective information to the Office of Early Learning (OEL) within the review period described below after publication of the cumulative list on the VPK Provider Kindergarten Readiness Rate website ([vpk.fl DOE.org](http://vpk.fl DOE.org)). OEL and the respective early learning coalition, shall review the corrective information and accept or reject the requested corrective information within the review period.

(c) Dispute. If a private or public school provider disputes the accuracy of the data as published on the website or if a private provider disputes ownership as defined in subsection (4), the provider may file a dispute on the website and submit documentation to the Office of Early Learning for review and consideration. OEL will review all disputes filed by providers and provide a response to each dispute.

(d) Timelines. The provider review period for verification and dispute shall be twenty-one (21) calendar days from the time of publication of the cumulative list of children served. The early learning coalition shall review and accept or reject any changes for hours attended to the verification data within a period of ten (10) calendar days after the close of the provider review period. OEL shall process all approved changes made in verification and resolve all disputes prior to publication of the final VPK Kindergarten Readiness Rate.

(3) Criteria for Inclusion in and Calculation of the VPK Provider Kindergarten Readiness Rate.

(a) After the conclusion of the review of the data described in subsection (2) of this rule, OEL shall calculate the VPK Provider Kindergarten Readiness Rate for each private or public school VPK provider of either the school year (five hundred forty (540) hour) or summer (three hundred (300) hour) program that served at least four (4) children who:

1. Attended the VPK program for seventy (70%) percent or more of the total number of instructional hours; and,
2. Are matched to a valid score on the Florida Kindergarten Readiness Screener.

(b) Calculation of the VPK readiness rate:

1. Kindergarten student scores on the Florida Kindergarten Readiness Screener administered during the first thirty (30) days of the school year must demonstrate a score of at least 500 on the Star Early Literacy assessment to be considered “ready for kindergarten.” ~~In order for a provider to be considered to have successfully administered the VPK program, the provider must have sixty (60%) percent of children ready using the calculation in this section. A provider failing to meet this standard will be placed on probation in accordance with subsection (5), below.~~

2. The “Percent of Children Ready for Kindergarten” shall be calculated as the number of “Children Ready for Kindergarten” on the screening measure divided by the total number of “Children Screened” meeting the requirements in subparagraphs (3)(a)1. and (3)(a)2. of this rule.

3. Learning Gains shall be calculated based on the results of the Florida VPK Assessment, pursuant to Rule 6M-8.620, F.A.C., administered during the VPK program year. At the individual child level learning gains are demonstrated by having attained a higher scoring category (below expectations, meeting expectations, and exceeding expectations) from the pre-assessment to the post-assessment in all of the four domains contained in the assessment (Print Knowledge, Phonological Awareness, Mathematics and Oral Language/Vocabulary). A child that scores “exceeding expectations” for the pre-assessment and maintains that score for the post-assessment will be considered to have made “learning gains” in that domain.

4. The percent of children making learning gains shall be calculated as the number of children demonstrating learning gains divided by the number of children meeting the requirements in subparagraphs (3)(a)1. and (3)(a)2. of this rule.

5. The VPK Provider Kindergarten readiness rate shall be expressed as the percentage of children ready for kindergarten combined with the percentage of children making learning gains multiplied by .1.

Percent Ready + (Percent making gains x .1) = Provider readiness rate

In order for a provider to have successfully administered the VPK program, the provider must achieve a final readiness rate of 60 (sixty) with the maximum rate possible of 100. A provider failing to meet this standard will be placed on probation in accordance with subsection (5) below.

(c) If a private or public school provider does not meet the criteria described in paragraph (3)(a), information as to why the provider was not included in the VPK Provider Readiness Rate calculation shall be displayed on the VPK Provider Profile required by section 1002.53(5), F.S.

(d) The Office of Early Learning shall publish each VPK program provider’s readiness rate.



(4) VPK Provider Kindergarten Readiness Rates. VPK Provider Kindergarten Readiness Rates shall be binding on new private VPK owners if the change of ownership occurred at a point in time in which seventy (70%) percent or more of the VPK school-year or summer program remained. For the purpose of this rule, a change of ownership does not include the sale or transfer to family members, persons with a pre-existing ownership interest in the business or an “individual associated with a provider.” For the purpose of this subsection, “individual associated with a provider” means an individual or family member of an individual who, regardless of compensation, holds a management position, oversees the operations of a provider, or is an officer, shareholder, beneficial owner or member of the board of directors of a provider.

(5) Providers Placed on Probation.

(a) For the 2016-17 and 2017-18 VPK Provider Kindergarten Readiness Rates:

1. No provider will receive a new probationary status.
2. An existing provider on probation whose rate meets the criteria in paragraph (3)(b), is removed from probation.
3. An existing provider on probation whose rate did not meet the criteria in paragraph (3)(b), will remain on probation in their existing status.

(b) Beginning with the 2018-19 VPK Provider Kindergarten Readiness Rates, if the readiness rate of a private or public VPK provider falls below the minimum rate adopted by the State Board, the provider shall be placed on probation, notified of each designation by the Office of Early Learning, and acknowledge such designation on the website within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the publication of the final Provider Kindergarten Readiness Rates.
