RULE NO.: 6A-1.09401 **RULE TITLE:** Student Performance Standards
PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To revise certain student performance standards for grades 9-12 in Mathematics and grades K-12 for English Language Arts.

SUMMARY: The department is reopening the Student Performance Standards rule in order to make revisions intended to promote alignment and clarity of the B.E.S.T. Standards for English Language Arts and Mathematics with courses, instruction, instructional materials and standardized, statewide assessments. Revisions to the K-12 B.E.S.T. Standards for English Language Arts are intended to provide additional clarity for certain K-12 benchmarks. Revisions to the 9-12 B.E.S.T. Standards for Mathematics are intended to provide instructional guidance for certain benchmarks so that a given benchmark may be appropriate for multiple courses. In order to develop grades 9-12 Algebra 1, Algebra 1 Honors, Algebra 2, Algebra 2 Honors, Pre-Calculus Honors, Geometry, Geometry Honors, and other 9-12 courses deemed necessary by the department, the B.E.S.T. Standards for Mathematics require revisions to include content, clarifications and examples.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: Any adverse impact or regulatory cost of this proposed rule is not expected to exceed any of the economic criteria set forth in Section 120.541(2)(a), F.S. and will not require legislative ratification. This determination is based upon the agency’s experience when it revised educational standards in the past.

6A-1.09401 Student Performance Standards.

(1) Student Performance Standards in Florida are defined as the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards and establish the core content of the curricula to be taught and specify the core content knowledge and skills that K-12 public school students are expected to acquire. The Next Generation Sunshine State Standards are rigorous and reflect the knowledge and skills students need for success in college and careers. The standards and benchmarks describe what students should know and be able to do at grade level progression for kindergarten to grade 8 and in grade bands for grade levels 9-12. The access points contained in the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards provide access to the general education curriculum for students with significant cognitive disabilities. These standards, benchmarks, and access points are contained in the following publications which are hereby incorporated by reference and made a part of this rule.

RULE NO.: 6A-1.09422
 RULE TITLE: Statewide, Standardized Assessment Program Requirements

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To provide the opportunity for students to earn a new comparative score for the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA) Algebra 1 End-of-Course (EOC) Assessment. Section 1008.22(10), Florida Statutes (F.S.), provides authority to the State Board of Education to adopt in rule passing scores that are comparable to the Algebra 1 EOC assessment. The effect of this change will be to allow the Department of Education to codify in rule a passing score on the FSA Geometry EOC assessment as a comparative score for the Algebra 1 assessment graduation requirement.

SUMMARY: The proposed rule amendment will establish a passing score on the FSA Geometry EOC as a comparative score to satisfy the graduation requirement associated with the FSA Algebra 1 EOC.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: The rule amendment relates only to the establishment of a passing score on the FSA Geometry EOC assessment as a comparative score for the Algebra 1 assessment graduation requirement; therefore, there is no direct or immediate impact on economic growth, private sector job creation, employment, or private sector investment. If there is any impact on such economic growth and private sector job creation, the impact would be positive because the establishment of rigorous yet attainable comparative scores for the Algebra 1 assessment graduation requirement positively impacts student outcomes, which, in turn, positively impacts economic growth, private sector job creation, and employment. For the same reasons, though no impact on business competitiveness is anticipated, any impact would be positive. Because the proposed rule amendment relates only to the establishment of an additional comparative score for the Algebra 1 EOC assessment, it is not likely to increase regulatory costs. Any adverse impact or regulatory cost of this proposed rule is not expected to exceed any of the economic criteria set forth in Section 120.541(2)(a), F.S. and is not expected to require legislative ratification.

(b) Comparative scores shall be applied for the Algebra 1 EOC assessment, as appropriate, according to this subsection:

1. No change.

2. Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2018-19 school year, students and adults who have not yet earned their required passing score on the Algebra 1 EOC assessment, may meet this testing requirement to qualify for a high school diploma by earning a comparative passing score on the Math section of the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT), the SAT or the ACT or on the Geometry EOC assessment. For eligible students, the comparative passing scale score shall be a score equal to or greater than four hundred and thirty (430) on the 160 to 760 scale for the PSAT/NMSQT Math section, equal to or greater than four hundred and twenty (420) on the 200 to 800 scale for the SAT Math section, ~~or~~ equal to or greater than sixteen (16) on the 1 to 36 scale for the ACT Math section, or equal to or greater than 499 on the 425 to 575 scale for the Geometry EOC assessment. Students who are eligible for the Algebra 1 EOC alternate passing score of 489 under subsection (6) or the Geometry EOC alternate passing score of 492 under subsection (7) may use the Geometry EOC alternate passing score of 492 as a comparative score to satisfy this requirement.

RULE NO.: RULE TITLE:

40D-8.624 Guidance and Minimum Levels for Lakes

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this rulemaking is to adopt revised minimum and guidance levels for Lake Marion, located in Levy County. The effect of the rule is to support the District’s water supply planning, water use permitting, and environmental resource permitting programs.

SUMMARY: Section 373.042, F.S., requires the District to establish minimum flows and levels for lakes, wetlands, rivers and aquifers within the District’s boundaries. Section 373.0421(3), F.S., further requires the District to periodically reevaluate and revise adopted minimum flows and levels. This rulemaking is necessary to adopt new guidance and minimum levels for Lake Marion, located in Levy County. The establishment and periodic evaluation of minimum levels is required by statute to ensure that the minimum hydrologic requirements of the water resources and ecology of these lakes are maintained. The revised minimum and guidance levels for Lake Marion are being developed using previously peer-reviewed, Governing Board adopted methods.

61G20-2.002 Statewide Amendments to the Florida Building Code

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To amend the procedures used for updating and amending the Florida Building Code in order to bring them into conformance with changes made by section 6, ch. 2019-75, Laws of Florida.

SUMMARY: It will no longer be necessary for a model code provision to be necessary to accommodate a specific need of this state in order for it to be included as part of the triennial update process for the Florida Building Code. The review process utilized by the Commission and its Technical Advisory Committees has also been changed in order to more efficiently evaluate model code provisions.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: The rule addresses Commission procedures and will not have a fiscal impact.

Any person who wishes to provide information regarding a statement of estimated regulatory costs, or provide a proposal for a lower cost regulatory alternative must do so in writing within 21 days of this notice.

61G20-2.002 Updates and Statewide Amendments to the Florida Building Code

(1) The Florida Building Commission shall update the Florida Building Code triennially in accordance with subsection 553.73(7), F.S. When updating the code, the Commission shall review the most current updates to the model codes including, but not limited to, the International Building Code, the International Fuel Gas Code, the International Existing Building Code, the International Mechanical Code, the International Plumbing Code, the International Residential Code, the International Energy Conservation Code, and the National Electrical Code. The Commission shall also consider its own interpretations and declaratory statements, any relevant appellate decisions, and local technical amendments. For the purpose of conducting the review of the model codes, the following steps will be undertaken:

(a) The Commission shall select the model codes that will be used to conduct its review.

(b) Commission staff shall review the model codes and identify any provisions which overlap with the provisions of the Florida Building Code, correlate directly with the provisions of the Florida Building Code, provide for energy efficiency standards that meet or exceed the national energy standards mandated by Title III of the Energy Conservation and Protection Act, or are necessary to maintain eligibility for federal funding and discounts from the National Flood Insurance Program, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, or the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, in accordance with subsection 553.73(7), F.S.

(c) After the latest updates of the model codes are published and the staff review is completed, a complete listing of the changes to the model codes will be posted and made available for public review and comment on the Building Code Information System (BCIS) for a minimum of 45 days prior to review by the Commission's Technical Advisory Committees (TACs).

(d) Before review by the Commission's TACs, changes affecting residential construction shall be reviewed by the Residential Construction Cost Impact Workgroup (RCCIWG), and the report of the RCCIWG shall be made available to the TACs.

(e) The Commission's TACs shall review the model code provisions in their area of expertise for potential inclusion in the updated Florida Building Code. Should a model code provision overlap in the expertise of multiple TACs, all relevant TACs shall review the provision. The TACs shall also review any public comments. The TACs may make the following recommendations to the Commission:

1. That the Commission reject certain model code provisions by consent agenda. Model code provisions may be recommended for rejection due to such issues as being

unnecessary, negatively impacting the level of public health, safety, or general welfare provided by an existing Florida Building Code provision, diminishing the requirements of provisions related to wind resistance or water intrusion, unnecessarily imposing additional costs, or potentially requiring modification or further investigation before being adopted for use in this state.

2. That the Commission approve certain model code provisions by consent agenda. When considering whether to recommend inclusion on a consent agenda for approval, the TACs shall consider such criteria as whether the model code provisions are editorial or organizational in nature, correct an error, provide clarification, provide for alternative design methods, improve the effectiveness of the code, are uncontroversial to affected stakeholders, or are required by law.

3. That the Commission approve or reject certain model code provisions after considering them individually. When recommending individual consideration of model code updates, the TACs shall consider such criteria as whether the update has the potential to impose significant costs, cause confusion or regulatory difficulty, may be unnecessary, is highly controversial to affected stakeholders, or requires further evaluation. The TACs' recommendations shall be accompanied by a brief explanatory remark, and will be posted on the Commission's website.

(f) After the TACs have reviewed the model code provisions and made their recommendations pursuant to paragraph (e), the Commission shall meet to determine which model code provisions to include in the updated edition of the Florida Building Code. Notwithstanding the TACs' recommendations, Commissioners may specify that particular provisions on consent agendas be considered individually. After Commission approval, all of the approved changes to the Florida Building Code will be made available on the Commission's website. The public will then have the opportunity to submit amendments to the Florida Building Code and the approved changes to the Florida Building Code pursuant to subsection (2) of this rule.

(2) The Commission may amend the Code at any time pursuant to the requirements of paragraph 553.73(7)(c), F.S., or subsection 553.73(8), F.S., and once each year pursuant to subsection 553.73(9), F.S. Amendments to the Florida Building Code submitted pursuant to paragraph 553.73(7)(c), F.S., subsection 553.73(8), F.S., or 553.73(9), F.S., shall be submitted on the Code Amendment Proposal Form, No. 61G20-1.001, effective January 2018, adopted and incorporated herein, which may be found on the BCIS at http://www.floridabuilding.org/cm/cm_code_srch.aspx, or at <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-08931> or by contacting the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Office of Codes & Standards, 2601 Blair Stone

Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0772. If a proposed code amendment is submitted more than two weeks prior to the deadline established and staff finds the proposal to be insufficient, staff shall notify the proponent via email of the nature of its insufficiency and that if the proponent of the amendment elects to resubmit the proposal curing the insufficiency, it must be resubmitted prior to the deadline. Once a Code Amendment Proposal has been found sufficient, Commission staff shall verify such status online, enabling the BCIS to show the proposal to the general public for comment. Code Amendment Proposals found insufficient shall not be verified or considered as building code amendments in the code amendment process.

(a) Each proposed amendment will be heard first by the appropriate TAC, which will consider the proposal and all documentation submitted therewith, and consider whether to recommend approval, which shall require a two-thirds vote of TAC members or alternates in attendance. (c) The Commission shall consider and vote upon each proposed amendment after consideration by at least one TAC. The decision of the Commission to approve a proposed amendment shall be by at least the required three-fourths vote of Commissioners in attendance. The Commission may modify a proposed amendment upon a three-fourths vote of Commissioners in attendance, provided that the form required by subsection (2) of this rule is amended to reflect the modification and supporting documentation is submitted.
