## Section II Proposed Rules

### DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

#### State Board of Education

RULE NO.: 6A-1.09422  
 RULE TITLE: Statewide, Standardized Assessment Program Requirements

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To codify concordant and comparative score requirements in accordance with House Bill (HB) 1537, Section 37 (2023). The effect of this change is to provide additional measures by which students graduating during the 2022-23 school year can meet their assessment graduation requirements, to clarify the concordant and comparative scores that can be used for student who entered grade 9 during the 2020-21 school year and beyond, and to allow students who entered grade 9 in 2020-21 and beyond an additional option to meet assessment graduation requirements through the use of the Classic Learning Test (CLT).

SUMMARY: To set specific concordant and comparative scores available to students graduating during the 2022-23 school year, including students who entered grade 9 in 2019-20, as well as concordant and comparative scores that may be used for students who entered grade 9 in 2020-21 and beyond. Additionally, the proposed rule sets forth a concordant passing score for the Grade 10 English Language Arts (ELA) assessment on the CLT and a comparative score for the Algebra 1 End-of-Course (EOC) assessment on the CLT.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly

regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: The proposed amendment relates only to the assessment graduation requirements for students; therefore, there is no impact on economic growth, private sector job creation, employment, private sector investment, business competitiveness or any other factors listed in s. 120.541(2)(a), F.S., and will not require legislative ratification. No increase in regulatory costs are anticipated as a result of this rule. If there is any impact on such economic growth and private sector job creation, the impact would be positive because it would lead to a higher number of students receiving a standard diploma. For the same reasons, though no impact on business competitiveness is anticipated, any impact would be positive. Because the proposed rule amendment only relates to the clarifying assessment graduation requirements and allowing an additional pathway to graduation, it is not likely to increase regulatory costs.

#### **6A-1.09422 Statewide, Standardized Assessment Program Requirements.**

(1) through (7) No change.

(8) Concordant and comparative scores shall be applied to the statewide assessment program as follows:

(a) Concordant scores shall be applied for the grade 10 Reading or ELA assessment, as appropriate, according to this subsection:

1. No change.

2. Students and adults who are in the 2022-23 graduating class, including students who entered grade 9 in the 2019-20 school year, and who have not yet earned the required passing score on the the grade 10 statewide, standardized ELA assessment may meet this testing requirement to qualify for a high school diploma by earning a concordant passing score on the EBRW section of the SAT, the Reading subtest of the SAT or the ACT, or the average of the English and Reading subject test scores for the ACT. For eligible students, the concordant passing scale score for the SAT EBRW shall be a score equal to or greater than four hundred and thirty (430) on the 200 to 800 scale, and the concordant passing scale score for the SAT Reading subtest shall be equal to or greater than twenty four (24) on the 10 to 40 scale. The concordant passing scale score for the Reading section of the ACT shall be a score equal to or greater than nineteen (19) on the 1 to 36 scale, and the concordant passing score on the average of the English and Reading subtest scores of the ACT shall be a score equal to or greater than eighteen (18) on the 1 to 36 scale. For the average of the ACT English and Reading subtests, if the average of the two subject test scores results in a decimal of .5, the score shall be rounded up to the next whole number. The scores for the English and Reading subject tests on the ACT are not required to come from the same test administration. ~~Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2019-20 school year, students and adults who have not yet earned their required passing score on the Grade 10 FSA ELA Assessment, may meet this testing requirement to qualify for a high school diploma by earning a concordant passing score on the EBRW section of the SAT or the average of the English and Reading subject test scores for the ACT. For eligible students, the concordant passing scale score for the SAT EBRW shall be a score equal to or greater than four hundred and eighty (480) on the 200 to 800 scale, and the concordant passing scale score for the average of the English and Reading subject test scores on the ACT shall be a score equal to or greater than eighteen (18) on the 1 to 36 scale. For the ACT, if the average of the two subject test scores results in a decimal of .5, the score shall be rounded up to the next whole number. The scores for the English and Reading subject tests on the ACT are not required to come from the same test administration.~~

3. Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2020-21 school year, students and adults who have not yet earned their required passing score on the grade 10 statewide, standardized ELA assessment may meet this testing requirement to qualify for a high school diploma by earning a concordant passing score on the EBRW section of the SAT, or the average of the English and Reading subject test scores for the ACT, or the sum of the Verbal Reasoning and the Grammar/Writing sections of the Classic Learning Test (CLT).

For eligible students, the concordant passing scale score for the SAT EBRW shall be a score equal to or greater than four hundred and eighty (480) on the 200 to 800 scale, the concordant passing scale score for the average of the English and Reading subject test scores on the ACT shall be a score equal to or greater than eighteen (18) on the 1 to 36 scale, and the concordant passing scale score for the sum of the Grammar/Writing and the Verbal Reasoning subject tests of the CLT shall be a score equal to or greater than thirty-six (36) on the 0 to 80 scale. For the ACT, if the average of the two subject test scores results in a decimal of .5, the score shall be rounded up to the next whole number. The scores for the English and Reading subject tests on the ACT or the Grammar/Writing and Verbal Reasoning subjects tests on the CLT are not required to come from the same test administration.

(b) Comparative scores shall be applied for the Algebra 1 EOC assessment, as appropriate, according to this subsection:

1. No change.

2. Students and adults who are in the 2022-23 graduating class, including students who entered grade 9 in the 2019-20 school year, and who have not yet earned the required passing score on the Algebra 1 EOC assessment may meet this testing requirement to qualify for a high school diploma by earning a comparative passing score on the Math section of the PERT, the PSAT/NMSQT, the SAT or the ACT, or on the statewide, standardized Geometry EOC assessment. For eligible students, the comparative passing scale score shall be a score equal to or greater than one hundred and fourteen (114) on the 50 to 150 scale for the PERT Mathematics section, equal to or greater than four hundred and thirty (430) on the 160 to 760 scale for the PSAT/NMSQT Math section, equal to or greater than four hundred and twenty (420) on the 200 to 800 scale for the SAT Math section, equal to or greater than sixteen (16) on the 1 to 36 scale for the ACT Math section, or equal to or greater than an achievement level 3 on the level 1 to level 5 achievement level scale for the statewide, standardized Geometry EOC assessment. ~~Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2019-20 school year, students and adults who have not yet earned their required passing score on the Algebra 1 EOC assessment, may meet this testing requirement to qualify for a high school diploma by earning a comparative passing score on the Math section of the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT), the SAT or the ACT or on the Geometry EOC assessment. For eligible students, the comparative passing scale score shall be a score equal to or greater than four hundred and thirty (430) on the 160 to 760 scale for the PSAT/NMSQT Math section, equal to or greater than four hundred and twenty (420) on the 200 to 800 scale for the SAT Math section, equal to or greater than sixteen (16) on the 1 to 36 scale for the ACT Math section, or equal to or greater than 499 on the 425 to 575 scale for the Geometry~~

~~EOC assessment. Students who are eligible for the Algebra 1 EOC alternate passing score of 489 under subsection (6) or the Geometry EOC alternate passing score of 492 under subsection (7) may use the Geometry EOC alternate passing score of 492 as a comparative score to satisfy this requirement.~~

3. Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2020-21 school year, students and adults who have not yet earned their required passing score on the Algebra 1 EOC assessment may meet this testing requirement to qualify for a high school diploma by earning a comparative passing score on the Math section of the PSAT/NMSQT, the SAT or the ACT, on the statewide, standardized Geometry EOC assessment, or on the Quantitative Reasoning section of the CLT. For eligible students, the comparative passing scale score shall be a score equal to or greater than four hundred and thirty (430) on the 160 to 760 scale for the PSAT/NMSQT Math section, equal to or greater than four hundred and twenty (420) on the 200 to 800 scale for the SAT Math section, equal to or greater than sixteen (16) on the 1 to 36 scale for the ACT Math section, equal to or greater than an achievement level 3 on the 1 to level 5 achievement level scale for the statewide, standardized Geometry EOC assessment, or equal to or greater than eleven (11) on the 0 to 40 scale for the CLT Quantitative Reasoning section.

RULE TITLE: Demonstration of Readiness for College-Level Communication and Computation

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To add the Classic Learning Test and its standard scores as a common placement test option to be consistent with changes to Rule 6A-1.09422, F.A.C. Section 1008.30, F.S., provides authority to the State Board of

Education to adopt common placement tests and standard scores in rule. This will result in a new assessment and standard scores that may be used to assess readiness for college-level work. Additionally, other non-substantive technical changes will be made to the rule language.

SUMMARY: House Bill 1537 (2023) was signed into law May 2023 and added the Classic Learning Test to the list of assessments Florida school districts shall select from for administration to each public school student in grade 11. Therefore, rule language must be amended to reflect the additional assessment.

**SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:**

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

**6A-10.0315 Demonstration of Readiness for College-Level Communication and Computation.**

(1) No change.

(2) Common placement tests. Exempt and non-exempt students meeting or exceeding standard scores on any of the following tests, using the highest score in the case of multiple scores, may be enrolled in college level courses. Institutions shall accept scores on the public high school transcript as an official record of scores in addition to official score reports from the issuing entity listed in this subsection. A student who demonstrates readiness by achieving or exceeding standard test scores established herein and enrolls in a Florida College System institution within two (2) years after achieving such scores shall not be required to retest or complete developmental education at a Florida College System institution.

(3) Alternative methods to common placement tests. Pursuant to Section 1008.30, F.S., Florida College System institutions may use alternative methods in lieu of the common

placement tests under subsection (2) to assess student readiness for college-level work in communication and computation. Institutions shall recognize scores and grades on alternative methods specified in paragraphs (3)(a) through (3)(c) as valid for placement purposes for a minimum of two years.

(a) Tests and assessments. A score that meets or exceeds the standard score on any one of the assessments shall be accepted as demonstration of readiness for college-level work. Institutions shall accept scores on the public high school transcript in addition to official score reports from the issuing entity listed in this subsection as an official record.

Currently, the Assistant Deputy Secretary of Institutions (or designee) is the final reviewing authority for the restoration of forfeited gain

time, unless the forfeiture was for a particularly serious violation designated in the rule. For the enumerated serious infractions, restoration requires approval of the Secretary. The proposed amendment allows the Secretary to delegate approval to restore gain time forfeited for these serious infractions to the Assistant Deputy Secretary of Institutions, thereby creating a more streamlined, efficient process with a single reviewer for all infractions.

**SUMMARY:** The proposed rule allows the Secretary to delegate to the Assistant Deputy Secretary of Institutions the authority to restore gain time forfeited for certain serious infractions enumerated in the rule.
