SB 7022 amended section (s.) 1008.23(1)(a), Florida Statutes (F.S.), to, among other measures, add public schools, district school boards, boards of trustees, the State Board of Education, and the Board of Governors to the list of organizations for whom the examination and assessment instruments that they hold shall be considered confidential and exempt from the provisions of s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. Additionally, the bill amended s. 1008.23(1)(b), F.S., to require the State Board of Education and the Board of Governors to adopt rules and regulations, respectively, establishing retention schedules and a disposal process for the records described in section (1)(a). The effect of this rule development will be to implement the retention, destruction, and access requirements of SB 7022.

 6A-1.09953 Statewide Uniform Weighted Grading System in Honors and Articulated Accelerated Courses

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: During the 2026 Legislative Session, s. 1003.437, F.S., was amended with House Bill 1279, Education. The statute requires the Florida Department of Education to establish a statewide uniform weighted grading system for honors courses and articulated acceleration mechanisms identified in s. 1007.27, F.S. This rule will align with s. 1003.437, F.S., to establish a statewide uniform weighted grading system for honors and articulated accelerated courses.

SUMMARY: Statewide uniform weighted grading system in honors and articulated accelerated courses.

6A-1.09953 Statewide Uniform Weighted Grading System in Honors and Articulated Accelerated Courses.

(1) Purpose. The purpose of this rule is to establish a consistent statewide weighted grading system for honors courses and articulated acceleration mechanisms identified in section (s.) 1007.27, F.S., ensuring uniform calculation of grade point averages across school districts in alignment with s. 1003.437, F.S.

(2) Definitions.

(a) For the purpose of this rule, “honors course” means a course designated in the Florida Course Code Directory and Instructional Personnel Assignments database as an honors level course and is aligned to Florida’s state academic standards.

(b) “Articulated acceleration mechanisms” has the same meaning as provided in s. 1007.27, F.S.

(c) For the purposes of this rule, “completion” means earning a passing grade in an honors or accelerated course that awards high school credit.

(3) Implementation and Requirements. Effective beginning with students who enter grade 9 in the 2026-2027 school year and thereafter, in accordance with s. 1003.437, F.S., and high school coursework taken by middle grades students in the 2026-2027 school year and thereafter, the following applies:

(a) A school district grade point average policy must provide an additional weight for certain high school credit courses as follows:

1. An additional weight of 0.5 must be applied, upon student completion, to each honors course and to each secondary education course that leads to an industry certification as defined in s. 1003.4203, F.S.

2. An additional weight of 1.0 must be applied to each accelerated course as defined in s. 1007.27, F.S., including dual enrollment, which includes career dual enrollment and early admission, as provided for in s. 1007.271, F.S., the College Board Advanced Placement Program, the International Baccalaureate Program, the Advanced International Certificate of Education Program, upon completion by the student, and the Florida Advanced Courses and Tests (FACT);.

(b) Students who earned high school credit while in middle school prior to the 2026-2027 school year will have their weighted credit re-calculated to be in alignment with this rule upon entering high school in the 9th grade.

(c) School districts must calculate weighted grades and grade point averages using the following statewide 5.0 weighted grading scale:

<u>Unweighted Grade</u>	<u>Standard Course Value</u>	<u>Honors/Secondary Industry Certification Course Weight</u>	<u>Accelerated Course Weight</u>
<u>A</u>	<u>4.0</u>	<u>4.5</u>	<u>5.0</u>
<u>B</u>	<u>3.0</u>	<u>3.5</u>	<u>4.0</u>
<u>C</u>	<u>2.0</u>	<u>2.5</u>	<u>3.0</u>
<u>D</u>	<u>1.0</u>	<u>1.5</u>	<u>2.0</u>
<u>F</u>	<u>0.0</u>	<u>0.0</u>	<u>0.0</u>

(d) Students who entered grade 9 in the cohort year of 2025-2026 and prior will continue to be subject to the grade point average policy applicable to their cohort through graduation.

(e) School districts must establish procedures for applying the statewide weighted grading system to transfer students, including the evaluation and equivalency of out of country, out of state, private school, personalized education program, or home education program coursework.

(f) School districts may not apply additional weighting beyond that specified in this rule for the types of courses identified in this section.

(g) Weighted grades and grade point averages shall be clearly reflected on student transcripts and academic records.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: This rule amendment is to implement section (s.) 1008.34(3)(b)2., Florida Statutes (F.S.), as amended by House Bill 1537 (2023), and align with amendments to Rule 6A-10.024, Florida Administrative Code, (F.A.C.), that incorporate the new Florida Advanced Courses and Tests (FACT) assessments as approved assessments that offer students an opportunity to earn college credit.

SUMMARY: The amendments will update the College and Career Acceleration (CCA) component of the school and district grades models to include the new FACT assessments in alignment with Rule 6A-10.024, F.A.C.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

 RULE TITLE: Use of Epinephrine Auto-Injectors and Anaphylaxis Policy

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: During the 2026 Legislative Session, sections 1002.20 and 1002.42, Florida Statutes, were amended with House Bill 1279, Education. Section 1002.20, F.S., allows additional flexibility for students in public schools who have experienced, or are at risk for, life-threatening allergic reactions by authorizing them to carry and self-administer epinephrine through any United States Food and Drug Administration-approved epinephrine delivery device, instead of only auto-injectors. The proposed rule amendments will align the language to reflect the change in statute.

SUMMARY: The proposed rule amendments will align the regulation of epinephrine delivery devices for students.

6A-6.0251 Use of Epinephrine Delivery Device Auto-Injectors and Anaphylaxis Policy.

(1) Definitions.

(a) No change.

(b) Epinephrine Delivery Device Auto-injector.

Epinephrine delivery device means a mechanism that is approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration that contains auto-injector is a prescription medication (epinephrine) in a premeasured, weight-based dose specific dose for weight device that is used to administer epinephrine to prevent or treat packaged for self-delivery in the event of a life-threatening allergic reaction.

(c) through (d) No change.

(e) Self-Administration. Self-administration shall mean that the student is able to utilize the epinephrine delivery device auto-injector in the manner directed by the licensed healthcare provider without additional assistance or direction.

(2) Use of Epinephrine Delivery Device Auto-Injectors and Individualized Healthcare Plan (IHP)

(a) A written authorization is required from the physician and parent/guardians for a student to carry an epinephrine delivery device auto-injector and self-administer epinephrine by such delivery device auto-injector in accordance with Section 1002.20, F.S.

(b) No change.

(3) The IHP shall include provisions for child-specific training in accordance with Section 1006.062(4), F.S., to ensure personnel are prepared to support a student’s unique needs, respond appropriately, and protect the safety of all students from the misuse or abuse of such delivery devices auto-injectors. The EAP component shall specify that the emergency number (911) will be called immediately for an anaphylaxis event and describe a plan of action if the student is unable to

perform self-administration of the epinephrine delivery device auto-injector.

6A-6.0530 Summer Bridge Program

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: This amendment will expand eligibility for the Summer Bridge Program based on changes due to House Bill 1279. The expansion includes students who score below the 25th percentile on the final administration of the coordinated screening and progress monitoring (PM3). Parental notification of eligibility for a New Worlds Scholarship Account is also being removed because no new scholarships are being funded.

SUMMARY: The Summer Bridge Program provides eligible Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) students with literacy skill instructional support prior to entering kindergarten. The amendment aligns to new legislative changes and removes outdated requirements.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Regional Director's decision shall be made within 15 days of receiving the above-mentioned documentation from the warden and shall be final.~~

The Regional Director shall accept the recommendation only if he or she determines that the marriage would pose a threat to the inmate's security, the security and order of the institution, or public safety. The Regional Director's decision to accept or deny the recommendation shall be final.

The Department’s Final Order, issued June 10, 2026, declines to issue a declaratory statement because: 1) The Petition is not in substantial compliance with Section 120.565(2), F.S., because it fails to state with particularity the Petitioner’s set of circumstances sufficient for the Department to opine on the matter; 2) the Department is prohibited from making general statements of policy by entry of a Declaratory Statement; and 3) Petitioner does not seek guidance as to the applicability of statutory provisions but seeks to challenge certain provisions on purely constitutional grounds. Determination of the constitutionality of statutory provisions is not an appropriate, nor legally authorized, purpose of the Declaratory Statement process as set forth in Section 120.565, F.S.
