61J1-6.003 Experience Requirement – Practical Applications of Real Estate Appraisal Pathway.

(1) Practical Applications of Real Estate Appraisal (PAREA) programs approved by the Appraiser Qualifications Board of the Appraisal Foundation (AQB), or any successor body recognized by federal law, utilize simulated experience training and serve as an alternative to the traditional ~~Supervisor/Trainee/Supervisor Appraiser~~ experience pathway model to qualify as Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (USPAP) compliant experience. Only PAREA programs approved by the AQB will satisfy the requirements of this rule.

(2) Graduates successfully completing an approved certified residential PAREA program will be eligible to receive the following experience credit:

(a) Certified residential classification: up to one hundred percent (100%) of the required experience hours;

(b) Certified general classification: up to fifty percent (50%) of the total required experience, none of which is eligible toward the required non-residential hours.

(3) Graduates successfully completing an approved Licensed PAREA program will be eligible to receive the following experience credit:

(a) Certified residential classification: up to sixty-seven percent (67%) of the total required experience hours.

(b) Certified general classification: up to thirty-three percent (33%) of the total required experience, none of which is eligible toward the required non-residential hours.

(4) All remaining experience hours necessary to meet licensure requirements must be earned through the Trainee/Supervisor Appraiser pathway, as defined in Rule 61J1-6.001, F.A.C.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE PROPOSED RULE IS:

64B11-4.008 Minimum Standards of Practice for the Performance of Dry Needling.

(1) For purposes of this rule only, the words and phrases listed below are defined in the following manner:

(a) "Adverse medical incident" means an event over which the occupational therapist could exercise control and which is associated in whole or in part with the performance of dry needling, rather than the condition for which dry needling occurred, and which resulted in any prolonged and/or emergent neurological, pulmonary, vascular, or musculoskeletal condition that required the transfer of the patient to a hospital and/or referral to a physician for treatment of the resulting condition.

(b) "Supervision" means observation of the dry needling procedure by an occupational therapist licensed in any state or the District of Columbia who meets the qualifications for practicing dry needling in the state of Florida and who has a minimum of one year and 25 sessions of experience treating patients using dry needling. The observation may be in person or via synchronous telehealth as defined in Section 456.47, F.S.

(c) "Competency requirements" means proficiency in the subject areas listed in sub-subparagraphs (2)(b)1.a.-e.

(2) The minimum standards of practice for the performance of dry needling by an occupational therapist include the following:

(a) Completion of two years of practice as an occupational therapist;

(b) Completion of 50 hours of face-to-face continuing education on the topic of dry needling from an entity approved by the board.

1. The continuing education must include instruction in the following subject areas:

a. Theory of dry needling;

b. Selection and safe handling of needles and other apparatus or equipment used in dry needling, including instruction on the proper handling of biohazardous waste;

c. General indications and contraindications for dry needling, as well as complex anatomical and safety considerations of the cranio-facial and peripheral nervous systems for dry needling of the head, neck, and torso;

d. Psychomotor skills needed to perform dry needling, including tissue palpation, needle insertion, and needle extraction; and

e. Postintervention care, including adverse responses, adverse event recordkeeping, and any reporting obligations.

2. The continuing education must include a determination by the instructor, who is a licensed occupational therapist meeting the qualifications set forth in paragraph (1)(b) "Supervision," that the occupational therapist being trained in dry needling demonstrates the requisite competency and psychomotor skills to safely perform dry needling; and

(c) After completing paragraphs (2)(a) and (b), completion of 25 patient sessions of dry needling under one of the following circumstances:

1. While licensed as a occupational therapist in another state or while serving as an occupational therapist in the United States Armed Services; or

2. Under the supervision of an occupational therapist, physical therapist, or chiropractic physician who holds an active license to practice in any state or the District of Columbia. Such supervisor must have actively performed dry needling for at least 1 year and must document that the supervised therapist has met the supervision and competency requirements and needs no additional supervised sessions to perform dry needling. It is the responsibility of the supervised therapist to maintain all documents.

(3) An occupational therapist shall not perform dry needling without patient consent documented in the patient's medical record.

(4) An occupational therapist shall not delegate performance of dry needling to an occupational therapy assistant, unlicensed personnel, or any other person who is not a licensed occupational therapist who is qualified under this rule.

(5) An adverse medical incident that is a direct result of occupational therapy treatment involving dry needling shall be reported to the Board within 15 days of the incident using Form DH5121-MQA, Occupational Therapy Dry Needling Adverse Incident Report, effective 5/2026, which is hereby incorporated by reference and is available through <https://flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-19718>.

(6) Within 60 days of the effective date of this rule, or within 60 days of the intent to perform dry needling in the state of Florida, the licensed and qualified occupational therapist shall submit to the Board Form DH5122-MQA, Application for Performance of Dry Needling, effective 5/2026, which is

If the designated substitute changes during the licensure year, prior to taking care of children, the new designated substitute for the operator must comply with background screening requirements and the licensing authority must receive proof of background screening clearances.

(6) No change.

(7) During the hours of operation, the family child day care home or large family child care home must not be used for any business or purpose unrelated to providing child care that can interfere with compliance with child care standards or permit the presence of individuals who do not meet screening and training requirements when children are present.

(8) Family Child Day Care Home and Large Family Child Care Home Standards. Family Child Day Care Homes and Large Family Child Care Homes must follow the standards found in the "Family Child Day Care Home and Large Family Child Care Home Handbook," (December 2025), incorporated herein by reference. This rule establishes the grounds under which the Department may issue an administrative fine, deny, suspend, revoke a license or registration or place a licensee or registrant on probation status as well as uniform system of procedures to impose disciplinary sanctions.

(1) Definitions.

(a) through (g) No change.

(h) "Violation" is a noncompliance with a licensing standard as described in an inspection report resulting from an inspection under Section 402.311, F.S., as follows regarding Class I, Class II, and Class III Violations ~~and any other non-compliant standards~~.

1. "Class I Violation" is an incident of noncompliance with a Class I standard as described on CF-FSP Form 5318, (December 2025), Family Child Day Care Home Standards Classifications Summary and CF-FSP Form 5317, (December 2025), Large Family Child Care Home Standards Classification Summary, which is incorporated by reference. A copy of CF-FSP Forms 5318 and 5317 may be obtained from the Department's website www.myflfamilies.com/services/child-family/child-care or from the following links: <https://flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-19082> and <https://flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-19083>. However, any violation of a Class II standard that results in death or serious harm to a child shall escalate to a Class I violation. Class I violations are the most serious in nature.

(2) No change.

(3) Disciplinary Sanctions.

(a) Enforcement of disciplinary sanctions for all Class I violations and for repeated Class II ~~and~~ Class III, ~~and other non-compliant standard~~ violations shall be applied progressively for each. The documents entitled, Reconciliation of 2009 and 2017 Family Child Day Care Home Standards Classification Summaries and Reconciliation of 2009 and 2017 Large Family Child Care Home Standards Classification Summaries, CF-FSP Form 5422 and CF-FSP 5421, October 2017, which are incorporated into this rule, provide an alignment of the 2009 and 2017 Classification Summaries for

purposes of progressive enforcement. In addition, providers will be offered technical assistance in conjunction with all violations. (d) Failure to submit a completed CF-FSP Form 5133, Application for a License to Operate a Family Child Day Care Home, which is incorporated by reference in subsection 65C-20.008(1), F.A.C., or CF-FSP Form 5238, Application for a License to Operate a Large Family Child Care Home, which is incorporated by reference in paragraph 65C-20.008(2), F.A.C., for renewal of an annual license at least 45 days prior to the expiration date of the current license constitutes a licensing violation. A \$100.00 late fine will be imposed and must be paid before the license is renewed.
