(a)1. “Artificial Intelligence system” or “AI system” means a machine-based system that can, for a given set of human-defined objectives, make predictions, recommendations, or decisions influencing real or virtual environments.

3. “Autonomous artificial intelligence” or “agentic artificial intelligence” means a machine-based system that operates through a continuous cognitive loop, such as would allow it to be proactive, set goals, make multi-step decisions, execute actions and gather, log or generate data sets with minimal or no human oversight.

(b) “Artificial intelligence instructional tool” means a software application or service that uses generative or autonomous/agentic artificial intelligence, including machine learning, which is made available to a student by an educational entity for educational purposes, including instruction, tutoring, practice, feedback, or completing educator-directed assignments. This does not include AI systems that do not interact with students or are used for the purpose of analyzing, classifying, predicting, detecting, or optimizing decision making based on existing data.

(c) through (f) No change.

(3) Internet Safety Policy.

(a) through (d) No change.

(e) Each district school board and charter school governing board must, by July 1, 2027, adopt and implement an amendment to their internet safety policy that specifically addresses safety policy regarding the use of artificial intelligence instructional tools. At a minimum, these policies must:

Ensure an AI instructional tool deploying autonomous/agentic AI shall only be permitted to be used in grades Voluntary Prekindergarten through grade 12 if under the direct supervision of an adult, maintains a complete log of activities, and include a mechanism that allows school personnel to immediately suspend or disable the tool’s autonomous functionality without vendor assistance.

3. through 8. renumbered 4. through 9. No change.

10. Ensure that AI is never used as a decision maker absent human review for any use case, such as but not limited to: grading, evaluations, promotions, discipline, threat assessment,

counseling referrals or Exceptional Student Education (ESE) referrals, or communications.

18. Require that districts disclose to the Department if a district-approved AI tool exhibits any unexpected autonomous behavior or any IT safety or security incident caused by the approved tool, including unauthorized data access.
