Rule 25-4.034 would require local exchange telecommunications companies to maintain tariffs on file with the Commission setting forth all intrastate rates, terms and conditions for network access services pursuant to section 364.163, FS, and would otherwise simplify requirements when schedules or tariffs are published with the Commission. Rule 25-4.0341 would offer limited guidance to telecommunications companies choosing to file service schedules with the Commission.

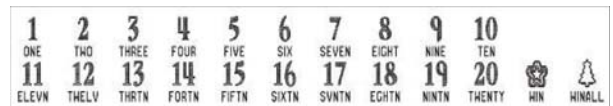



The Department of Environmental Protection gives notice of its intent to grant a variance under Section 403.201, F.S., from the provisions of Rule 62-4.244(5)(c), F.A.C. to allow the turbidity mixing zone to exceed 150 meters to the City of Marco Island. The variance allows the City of Marco Island to

have an expanded mixing zone of 150 meters offshore and 1000 meters downcurrent for the nourishment site. The Department also intends to grant a variance under Section 403.201, F.S., from Rule 62-4.242(2)(a)2.b., F.A.C., to the City of Marco Island. The variance establishes a maximum allowable turbidity level above background for work within the Rookery Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve Aquatic Preserve, Outstanding Florida Waters (OFW). The FDEP # is 0309260-002-BV. The associated Hideaway Beach Erosion Control Project, FDEP # 0309260-001-JC, includes the restoration and periodic nourishment of the North Beach segment of Hideaway Beach, the addition of three t-head groins on the North Beach segment of Hideaway Beach, and the modification of the existing terminal jetty at the entrance channel to Collier Bay. Three historical borrow areas, including the Collier Bay Entrance Channel, the Hideaway Beach nearshore borrow area, and the Big Marco/ Capri Pass Borrow area will be utilized as sand sources. Additionally, the previously permitted beach templates extending from South Point to Royal Marco Way are authorized to be periodically nourished. Minor erosion control structure maintenance and repairs are authorized as needed, including vegetation removal and filling scour holes.
