PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To conform to statutory changes in 2021-11 and 2019-71. Amends and creates oaths for candidates with party affiliation and without party affiliation, respectively. Allows candidate oaths to be notarized online and dispenses with requirement that qualifying papers be originals.

SUMMARY: Updates candidate oaths and dispenses with requirement that qualifying papers be originals.

1S-2.0001 Designation of Division of Elections as Filing Office for Department of State; Requirements for Candidate Qualifying Papers; Withdrawal of Candidacy.

(1) Designation of ~~Division of Elections as a Qualifying filing Office.~~

(a) The Department of State has designated the Division of Elections as the filing or qualifying office for candidates who must qualify with the Department of State seeking to qualify for nomination or election to any federal, state, legislative, multicounty or judicial office with the exception of county court judge. Candidates for the office of county court judge shall qualify with the supervisor of elections for that county. All qualifying items required to be filed with the Department of State shall be filed with the Division of Elections. The Division of Elections’ official address and official physical location is Room 316, R.A. Gray Building, 500 South Bronough Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0250.

~~(b) Each supervisor of elections and other qualifying officer shall designate one or more specific official physical locations that will serve as a qualifying office and publish the address of each office on the qualifying officer’s website. All qualifying items required to be filed with the Department of State as the office where the candidate is required to qualify shall be filed with the Division of Elections.~~

(2) Filing Timeline.

(a) Timely filing is of the essence in qualifying as a candidate. In order to be deemed timely filed with the qualifying office, qualifying items must actually be present at the qualifying office’s official physical location by the close of the qualifying period. Candidates who file with the Division of Elections are advised that the U.S. Postal Service does not deliver mail directly to the Division and the U.S. Postal Service’s designated hours for mail pick-up by the Division do not correspond to the qualifying deadline. While delivery of qualifying items to a qualifying office may occur by any means, to ensure that the items are timely submitted, it is advisable for candidates or someone on their behalf to hand-deliver directly to the qualifying office Division or use a delivery service that timely delivers directly to the qualifying office.

~~(b) Each supervisor of elections and other qualifying officer shall designate one or more specific official physical locations that will serve as a qualifying office and publish the address of each office on the qualifying officer’s website.~~

~~(b)(e)~~ Qualifying items shall be deemed filed with the qualifying office upon the date of actual receipt by the qualifying office, except for those qualifying items accepted and held during the 14-day period before the beginning of the qualifying period pursuant to sections 99.061(8) and

105.031(6), F.S. The qualifying items that are received and held during the 14-day period before the beginning of the qualifying period shall not be deemed filed until the beginning of the qualifying period.

(3) Qualifying Items.

(a) ~~Except as noted herein, any qualifying item filed with a qualifying office must be an original and signatures thereon must be made in ink. Qualifying items do not need to be originals.~~

~~(b) A facsimile, email, photocopy, scanned copy or any type of electronically transmitted document shall not be accepted as a qualifying item, except a candidate who has filed a current full and public disclosure or statement of financial interests with the Florida Commission on Ethics or the Supervisor of Elections prior to qualifying for office may file a copy of that disclosure at the time of qualifying. A current full and public disclosure or statement of financial interests is one that covers the immediately preceding calendar or tax year and is on the applicable Florida Commission on Ethics' form for that year. For example, for a qualifying period that occurs in 2018, the current full and public disclosure or statement of financial interests form would be one that covers the 2017 calendar or tax year.~~

THE FULL TEXT OF THE PROPOSED RULE IS:

59G-1.058 Eligibility.

(1) Purpose. This rule specifies recipient eligibility requirements for Florida Medicaid covered services and applies to all providers rendering Florida Medicaid covered services to recipients.

(2) Eligibility Determination. The Department of Children and Families (DCF) and the Social Security Administration (SSA) determine recipient eligibility for Florida Medicaid in accordance with Section 409.902, F.S., and Rule Chapter 65A-1, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.).

(a) Eligibility Determined by Qualified Designated Providers. Qualified designated providers determine presumptive eligibility for pregnant women (PEPW) in accordance with Rule Chapter 65A-1, F.A.C.

(b) Eligibility Determined by Qualified Hospitals.

1. Qualified hospitals enrolled in Florida Medicaid may make presumptive eligibility determinations for the following:

- Pregnant women.
- Infants and children under the age of 19 years.
- Parents and other caretakers or relatives.
- Former foster care children.

2. The presumptive period begins on the date the determination is made and ends on the earlier of the following:

- The last day of the month following the month in which the determination of presumptive eligibility is made.
- The date DCF makes a Florida Medicaid eligibility determination.

(3) Newborn Presumptive Eligibility. A newborn is deemed eligible for full Florida Medicaid covered services when the mother is eligible for Florida Medicaid on the date of the child's birth, unless the mother is eligible under the PEPW category.

(a) A pregnant recipient may obtain a Florida Medicaid identification (ID) number and Florida Medicaid ID card for her

unborn child. The cards are issued as “baby of” plus the mother’s name, and assigned a card control number that providers use to obtain the baby’s Medicaid ID number. The baby’s Florida Medicaid ID number will not be active until after the baby is born.

(b) Providers may request a Florida Medicaid ID number assignment for a newborn via a Medical Assistance Referral Form, CF-ES 2039, April 2003, incorporated by reference in Rule 65A-1.400, F.A.C., and available on the DCF Website at <https://eds.myflfamilies.com/DCFFormsInternet/Search/DCFFormSearch.aspx>.

(c) Providers may activate a newborn’s Florida Medicaid ID number by submitting a completed Unborn Activation Form, AHCA Form 5240-006, February 2017, incorporated by reference in Rule 59G-1.045, F.A.C., to the Florida Medicaid fiscal agent.

(4) Proof of Eligibility. Providers must verify recipient eligibility prior to rendering services.

(5) Recipient Does Not Have an ID Card. Providers may verify eligibility and render services if the recipient does not have an ID card.

(6) Card Not Proof of Eligibility. Possession of a Florida Medicaid ID card does not constitute proof of eligibility.

(7) Eligibility Program Codes (also known as Aid Categories). Florida Medicaid eligibility program codes indicate benefit coverage and limitations, as follows:
