RULE NO.: RULE TITLE:
61G10-14.003 Disciplinary Guidelines; Range of Penalties; Aggravating and Mitigating Circumstances
PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The Board proposes the amendment of the rule to update language regarding disciplinary guidelines, range of penalties, and aggravating and mitigating circumstances.

SUMMARY: Language regarding disciplinary guidelines, range of penalties, and aggravating and mitigating circumstances will be updated.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: During discussion of the economic impact of this rule at its Board meeting, the Board, based upon the expertise and experience of its members, determined that a Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs (SERC) was not necessary and that the rule will not require ratification by the Legislature. No person or interested party submitted additional information regarding the economic impact at that time.

Any person who wishes to provide information regarding a statement of estimated regulatory costs, or provide a proposal for a lower cost regulatory alternative must do so in writing within 21 days of this notice.

Substantial rewording of Rule 61G10-14.003, F.A.C. follows: See Florida Administrative Code for present text:

61G10-14.003 Disciplinary Guidelines; Range of Penalties; Aggravating and Mitigating Circumstances.

(1) This rule lists the range of penalties to be imposed on licensees who violate the provisions of Chapters 455 and 481, Part II, Florida Statutes, and associated rules. The violation is identified by the statutory or rule citation and, in most cases, a summary of the statute or rule. The actual statute or rule shall be consulted for the full text and range of prohibited conduct. The Board shall impose one or more penalties from among the

penalty range provided for each first violation or subsequent violation, whichever applies.

(2) When warranted by the nature of the violation, any number of the following conditions are available to be imposed as part of probation:

- (a) Continuing education;
- (b) Submission of design plans for review by a landscape architect;
- (c) Review of design plans predating the violation;
- (d) Working under the supervision of a landscape architect;
- (e) Limitation on the types of projects that can be undertaken;
- (f) One or more appearances before the Board;
- (g) Limitations on advertising;

(3) The licensee is responsible for all costs associated with compliance with the terms of probation. Unless stated otherwise in the disciplinary order, any costs of compliance with disciplinary penalties imposed shall be paid within thirty (30) days of the effective date of the Order or of invoice, whichever is later.

Specifically, the nutrient TMDL rules being proposed for adoption are for Louise Lake (WBID 2902), Lake Wales (WBID 1619A), Lake Pierce (WBID 1532A), and Lake Marion (WBID 1480). These waterbodies were verified for nutrients impairment using the methodology established in Chapter 62-303, F.A.C. This rulemaking has been given OGC

case numbers 20-1055 for Lake Wales, Lake Pierce, and Lake Marion; and 21-0419 for Louise Lake.
