(3) Reinstatement of Void Licenses. Persons previously licensed as professional engineers in Florida may not re-apply for licensure by examination or by endorsement pursuant to Section 471.013 or 471.015, F.S. Rather, pursuant to Sections 455.271(6) and 471.019, F.S., any person previously licensed as a professional engineer in Florida whose Florida license has become void must apply for reinstatement of the previous license. Application for reinstatement shall be made on form FBPE/023, Change of Status Application, referenced in subsection (1). In addition to a completed application form, all applications for reinstatement shall be accompanied by the following.

(b) Documentation of satisfaction of any disciplinary obligations imposed against the void license; ~~and~~

All such plans shall include a disclaimer stating the Electrical systems are exempt from professional engineering services and shall provide a clear understanding of the minimum system requirements expected to be installed by the contractor and permitted by the authority having jurisdiction (AHJ). In the event the Engineer of Record provides more information and direction than its minimally required, he or she shall be held responsible for the technical accuracy of the work in accordance with applicable codes, standards, and sound engineering principles. Electrical Engineering Documents for power systems must include the following information, if applicable to the particular project:

(3) Electrical Engineering Documents for power systems that exceed the threshold requirements for mandatory use of professional engineering services must include the following information, if applicable to the particular project:

Florida Workers' Compensation Health Care Provider Reimbursement Manual.

NOTICE OF CHANGE

Notice is hereby given that the following changes have been made to the proposed rule in accordance with Section 120.54(3)(d)1., F.S., published in Vol. 47, No. 24, February 5, 2021, issue of the Florida Administrative Register.

The proposed rule was previously amended through Notices of Change in the Vol. 47/82, April 28, 2021, and Vol. 47/118, June 18, 2021, issues of the Florida Administrative Register.

69L-7.020 Florida Workers' Compensation Health Care Provider Reimbursement Manual.

(1) The Florida Workers' Compensation Health Care Provider Reimbursement Manual (HCP RM), 2020 Edition, effective July 1, ~~2022~~ 2021, is incorporated by reference as part of this rule. The HCP RM contains the Maximum Reimbursement Allowances (MRAs) determined by the Three-Member Panel, pursuant to section 440.13(12), F.S., and establishes reimbursement policies, guidelines, codes, and MRAs for services provided by health care providers. Also, the HCP RM includes reimbursement policies and payment methodologies for pharmacists and medical suppliers. The policies and procedures in the HCP RM are in addition to the requirements and responsibilities established throughout Rule Chapter 69L-7, F.A.C., Workers' Compensation Medical Reimbursement and Utilization Review.

(2) through (3) No change.

The Florida Workers' Compensation Health Care Provider Reimbursement Manual (HCP RM), incorporated by reference in subsection 69L-7.020(1), is modified as follows:

Page 1 and footers of pages 2-377: The effective date is changed from July 1, 2021 to July 1, 2022.

Page 6:

The following paragraph in the "Health Care Provider Responsibilities" section is deleted in its entirety:

Reimbursement for services or procedures not listed in the Fee Schedule must be made according to an agreed upon contract price. Therefore, at the time of request for authorization, a health care provider should inform the carrier of any services or procedures that are not listed in the Fee Schedule.

The following paragraph is added below the current text in the "Prior Authorization of Services" section:

Medical authorization is an integral component of an efficient and self-executing workers' compensation system. The request for authorization and the timely decision to authorize or not authorize has a direct impact on the injured

worker's medical care and treatment, the length of time the injured worker is out of work, whether the injured worker hires an attorney, health care provider participation in the workers' compensation system, the cost of the claim, and the number of medical reimbursement disputes. Therefore, it is imperative the health care provider clearly and comprehensively communicates the requested treatment to the carrier and for the insurance carrier to ask clarifying questions or request additional documentation to facilitate authorization.

Page 7:

The following changes are made to the "Billing New Procedure Codes Not Listed in the Fee Schedule" section:

- The following sentence is deleted from the section: "Reimbursement for services or procedures not listed in the fee schedule must be made according to an agreed upon contract price."
- The sentence "**Note:** See **Codes with No MRAs** in this Manual." is changed to "**Note:** For reimbursement see **Codes with No MRAs** in this Manual."

Page 12:

The text within the "Codes with No MRAs" section is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following text:

When the health care provider bills a valid procedure code found in the CPT® or the HCPCS Level II® manual that corresponds to the date of service, and the procedure code is not listed in the fee schedule in this Manual, reimbursement is determined by:

- Comparing the billed procedure code with a clinically similar procedure code found in this Manual;
- The health care provider's documentation and medical bills; or
- The National Physician Fee Schedule Relative Value File copyrighted by the American Medical Association.

At a minimum, reimbursement must be the Florida Workers' Compensation MRA for a clinically similar procedure code that is listed in this Manual or an agreed upon contract price.

Carriers must have an established methodology for determining reimbursement for procedure codes that are not listed in this Manual and the methodology must be available upon request by the Division.

Page 370:

The following text in the "Health Care Providers Who Bill on the DWC-9" section is deleted in its entirety:

Reimbursement for services or procedures not listed in the fee schedule must be made according to an agreed upon contract price.

Examples include:

- Services or procedures not described in the incorporated CPT® manual requiring the use of an unlisted procedure code for billing; and
- CPT® codes with a substantial description change or newly adopted codes in the CPT® manual published subsequent to this Manual.

Project Description:

CasaCuba is a new initiative of Florida International University (FIU) to build a premier global venue for the study of Cuba and the preservation and celebration of Cuban culture. The facility that will provide a home to CasaCuba will be an iconic, multi-story building estimated to be 57,876 gross square feet in its first phase, located at a primary entrance to FIU's main campus. This state-of-the-art venue will be a gathering place for researchers, students, the South Florida community, and visitors from around the world. It will offer a welcoming home away from home to learn about Cuba and the Cuban diaspora, and a think tank that provides a forum for exploration and discussion of Cuban affairs, producing impactful analysis for the use of policymakers and business leaders. As a cultural institution, and with the aid of advanced, interactive digital media, CasaCuba will celebrate artistic expression in all its forms, recognizing talent and achievement and inspiring creativity in the Cuban community and beyond. The first phase of the building is estimated to have a total construction cost of \$25,578,299 as described in the Program Budget Summary.

In 2015, FIU announced plans to build CasaCuba to leverage its significant academic and non-academic resources and expand FIU's depth and breadth of teaching, scholarship, and cultural engagement on Cuba and the Cuban diaspora. Under the leadership of FIU President Mark B. Rosenberg and Agustín R. Arellano, Sr., a group of prominent community members came together to form a Board of Advisors. More recently, CasaCuba has received prestigious grants from the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation and the National Endowment for the Humanities ("NEH"), empowering the University to launch CasaCuba's architectural design phase.

CasaCuba is envisioned as the most ambitious public building paying homage to the Cuban heritage. The venue will house the leading think tank dedicated to conducting and sharing research on a wide range of topics related to Cuba. At the same time, CasaCuba aspires to be a preeminent institution for the

celebration of Cuban culture. Importantly as well, CasaCuba will be a community center – but one that is grounded in a leading university with high academic standards – that welcomes individuals, families, and social and professional groups that will find an inviting environment to learn about Cuban history and culture.

CasaCuba plans to include a state-of-the-art event venue; exhibition galleries; classrooms and seminar rooms; a flexible working area; vibrant gathering spaces such as a garden, courtyard, porch and gift shop; as well as administrative suites for the leadership of CasaCuba and the Cuban Research Institute. All areas should be focused on service to the FIU and local communities, as well as visitors from other parts of the country and the world at large. The building should accommodate a variety of uses and people of all ages, abilities, and backgrounds; nurture reflection, artistic expression, creative thinking, social interaction, experimentation, intellectual rigor and curiosity, scholarly research, and multimodal learning; and showcase purpose-driven design, as well as the ability to adapt with changes in technology. It must represent the Cuban legacy, telling a compelling story about Cuba's past, present, and future, and resonating emotionally with visitors and the surrounding community. Throughout its design, the building will articulate CasaCuba's vision and transmit hope and innovation, fueling the aspiration to make a positive difference. The building will serve as a gateway to other cultural and academic resources at FIU and will create a new international destination that enables the exchange of ideas and collaboration among like-minded institutions around the world.

FIU is committed to producing buildings that comply with sustainable energy conservation strategies and standards (minimum LEED Silver Certification).

The project scope may be modified by the University, in its sole discretion, to reduce scope or to include additional spaces or square feet should a funding source for such scope increases be identified prior to project completion. For instance, the project may be split into two phases. The first phase would include the project described in the approved Program dated March 27, 2019, as Phase 1. The second phase would include additional gallery space, teaching laboratory space, food service facilities and support areas as generally contemplated in the description of Phase 2 in the approved Program. With proper approvals, components of Phase 1 and Phase 2 may be revised due to funding changes and/or changing program needs. The selected Architecture/Engineering firm may be instructed to proceed with the second phase of the project if funding becomes available prior to completion of the first phase.
