Project scope of work:

1. Supply and install a New Fire alarm system at NEFSH.

a. The project is comprised of two Construction Document Packages. Package A contains the new fire alarm system requirements for all patient care buildings under AHCA jurisdiction. Package B contains the new fire alarm system requirements for all non-patient care buildings on campus. The specification book applies to each package.

i. Package A shall require inspection by AHCA at the 80% and 100% completion levels

ii. Both Packages A and B shall require State Fire Marshall inspections.

b. A new fire alarm central management system shall be installed in Building 1. This system shall communicate with all fire alarm control panels on campus and shall report the status of the fire alarm system, including the operational status of fire alarm devices, to the Central Fire Management System head-end workstation located in the Building 1 Security Office. A secondary Central Fire Management System workstation shall be provided in Building 19 (maintenance section). This fire alarm system control panels shall communicate to regional global fire alarm control panels in Building 1 via existing single-mode fiber optic backbone infrastructure installed throughout the site. The Central Fire Management System shall be installed, operational, tested and inspected prior to removal of any building's existing fire alarm system.

c. The scope of the project includes the complete removal of the existing fire alarm system in each building identified in the Construction Documents. A new, addressable fire alarm system shall be provided for each building. The new fire alarm system shall be installed, operational, inspected and approved prior to the removal of the existing fire alarm system.

d. Fire alarm system will not be a sole proprietary system. Clarification: The fire alarm system must be able to be serviced by a minimum of three different factory authorized, trained, and certified distributors/contractors within a 150-mile radius of the project site. The factory authorized, trained, and certified service representatives shall be separate, independent, business entities. 2. After the award of the contract the Project manager will have a pre-construction meeting with the Contractor and hospital staff at the facility.

Contractor requirements: The contractor will provide a master schedule of the fire alarm work (and any other work) showing building, projected staff and sequence of operation for each building. This schedule will be updated at the first or every

month and provided to the project manager by the 5 of every month. The contractor will provide daily reports emailed to the project manager and facility manager by 10 am the following day (a Friday report will be sent on Monday of the following week). If the contractor cannot perform work in a building on a particular day or is stopped due to security, safety or client issues, the contractor will need the daily report signed by a DCF maintenance staff member (showing how much time was delayed) for verification to be granted a makeup day for this delay.

3. The fire alarm cannot be taken offline and left out of service in a manner that will violate the SFM or other requirements. A fire alarm change over must be started on a Monday to Thursday in the morning allowing for adequate time for the changeover and not leaving the building unprotected. If, upon removal of the existing fire alarm, if the new fire alarm system is not operational (fully with no issues), then the contractor shall provide a 24-hour fire watch at the contractor expense until the fire alarm system is operational. The project manager and the hospital must be notified.

4. Once the new fire alarm system in a building is up, operation and approved, the old fire alarm system components will be boxed up and give to the NEFSH maintenance staff.

5. NEFSH has already installed a new single mode fiber for the new fire alarm system.

6. Additional work requirements, documents (drawings and specifications) can be provided to contractors by email, only after the contractor emails the Contract Manager requesting the documents. Documents are considered secure and will only be sent to contractors for security reasons.
