RULE NO.: **RULE TITLE:**
 6A-10.088 Florida McKinney-Vento Program Training and Identification

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To ensure compliance with the Florida Department of Education’s Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) State Plan specific to education for homeless children and youth. The effect will include provisions regarding identification of homeless children and youth, support and required training for school district liaisons, and other matters relating to students experiencing homelessness.

SUMMARY: The Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability (OPPAGA) conducted a study on the Florida McKinney-Vento Program (FMVP) and provided recommendations to the Florida Department of Education, including required training for school district McKinney-Vento liaisons and other relevant staff, and to require dissemination of a student housing questionnaire for identification. This rule incorporates these recommendations and is aligned to the ESSA State Plan.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: Based upon the nature of the changes, this proposed rule is not expected to have any adverse impact on economic growth, business competitiveness or any other factors listed in s. 120.541(2)(a), F.S., and will not require legislative ratification. No increase in regulatory costs are anticipated as a result of the rule changes.

6A-10.088 Florida McKinney-Vento Program Training and Identification

(1) Purpose. This rule sets forth requirements relating to the identification of students experiencing homelessness and required reporting to the Florida Department of Education relating to the Florida McKinney-Vento Program (FMVP), operated pursuant to the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (hereafter referred to as the McKinney-Vento Act or MVA) (42 U.S.C. Sections 11431-11434A) and pursuant to Florida's Every Student Succeeds Act State Plan.

(2) Definitions.

(a) "McKinney-Vento liaison" means the person designated by a school district that is responsible for carrying out the duties outlined in 42 U.S.C. Section 11432(g)(6)(A).

(b) "School district" or "district" means a Florida school district or district school board, the Florida Virtual School (Section 1002.37, Florida Statutes (F.S.)), the Florida School

for the Deaf and the Blind (Section 1002.36, F.S.), Developmental Research (Laboratory) Schools (Section 1002.32, F.S.); and charter school governing boards designated as local educational agencies (LEAs) (Section 1002.33(25), F.S.).

(c) "Student experiencing homelessness" means an individual who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, as defined in 42 U.S.C. Section 11434(a)(2) and includes:

1. Children and youths who are sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason; are living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative adequate accommodations; are living in emergency or transitional shelters; or are abandoned in hospitals;

2. Children and youths who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings;

3. Children and youths who are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings; and

4. Migratory children who are living in circumstances described in subparagraphs (2)(c)1.-3.

(d) "Unaccompanied Homeless Youth" or "UHY" means a child or youth whose living arrangement qualifies as homeless under paragraph (2)(c) and who is not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian.

(e) "Department" means the Florida Department of Education.

(3) School districts must adopt procedures to identify students experiencing homelessness, to refer such students and their families for services available through the McKinney-Vento Act and services provided by local community social service entities. These procedures must include, at a minimum, designating a McKinney-Vento liaison, providing training to selected school district personnel, developing and distributing a student housing questionnaire, and reporting to the Department, in accordance with the requirements of this rule.

(4) McKinney-Vento Liaisons.

(a) School districts must designate at least one McKinney-Vento liaison to serve as the district's lead homeless education contact. Duties of the liaison include:

1. Ensuring that procedures are in place to identify students experiencing homelessness and to provide them with applicable services under the McKinney-Vento Act;

2. Identifying and addressing barriers to enrollment, regular attendance, and academic achievement of students experiencing homelessness within the district; and

3. Providing training to other district- and school-level personnel in accordance with district policies to personnel identified under subparagraph (3)(c)2.

(b) Except for charter schools that are designated as a LEA under Section 1002.33(25), F.S., McKinney-Vento liaisons must support charter schools sponsored by their district in the same manner as traditional public schools.

(c) Training of and by McKinney-Vento Liaisons.

1. McKinney-Vento liaisons must participate in at least two training courses each school year provided or recommended by the Department. Training topics include the responsibilities of McKinney-Vento liaisons, identification of students experiencing homelessness, data collection and reporting requirements, and supports and services available under the McKinney-Vento Act.

2. School districts must identify district- and school-level personnel who must participate in training provided by the McKinney-Vento liaison. Such training includes the importance of identifying and supporting students experiencing homelessness, the identification of such students, and actions to take if staff suspect a student is experiencing homelessness. In identifying district- and school-level personnel who must be trained, school districts must consider principals and other school leaders, school-level homeless student contacts, attendance officers, enrollment personnel, bus drivers, cafeteria staff, school counselors, teachers, and others that have direct contact with students.

3. School districts must maintain documentation of liaison training, as set forth in paragraph (4)(c) of this rule and provide it to the Department upon request.

(5) Student Housing Questionnaire.

(a) School districts must create student housing questionnaire(s) to be used in all public schools, including public charter schools, to identify students who are experiencing homelessness and who may be eligible for services under the McKinney-Vento Act.

1. A student housing questionnaire must be provided to parents, guardians, and unaccompanied homeless youths at least once annually and whenever there is evidence that a student may be experiencing homelessness throughout the school year.

2. A student housing questionnaire must be included in the annual school enrollment packet.

3. A student housing questionnaire may be distributed or returned electronically, but it must be available in hard copy, if requested.

4. A template that can be modified by school districts is available on the Department's website at <https://www.fldoe.org/policy/federal-edu-programs/title-ix-mvp/>.

(b) Beginning July 1, 2024, any student housing questionnaire must prominently explain that the purpose of the form is to identify students and families who may be eligible for services in the school or local community. In addition, a questionnaire must, at a minimum, request the following information:

1. Student's name (first name, middle initial, last name);

2. Student's birth date;

3. Student's school and grade;

4. Names, birthdates, school and grade for each additional child or youth in the household;

5. Parent's or guardian's name;

6. Street address;

7. Length of time at current address;

8. Former address;

9. Parent's, guardian's or UHY's phone number;

10. Parent's, guardian's, or UHY's signature and date of signature;

11. Selection of nighttime residence type, using the residences defined in the "Homeless Student, PK-12" data element in Rule 6A-1.0014, F.A.C., Comprehensive Management Information System;

12. Selection if the student is an UHY, as defined in 42 U.S.C. Section 11434(a)(6); and

13. Selection of homelessness cause, using the causes defined in the "Homelessness Cause" data element in Rule 6A-1.0014, F.A.C., Comprehensive Management Information System.

(6) Required Reporting.

(a) By August 1 of each year, school districts must submit the Florida McKinney-Vento Program District Contact Directory and Listserve Update, Form FMP-1 (insert link), effective August 2023, to the Department at FLMVP@fldoe.org. School districts must notify the FMVP within ten (10) school days of a change in assignment of or contact information for a McKinney-Vento liaison.

(b) School districts must report information on students experiencing homelessness to the Department during the survey periods and use the elements set forth in Rule 6A-1.0014, F.A.C., Comprehensive Management Information System. PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The proposed rule amendments modify the boating restricted areas on the St. Johns River in Lake. Seminole, and Volusia counties and/or clarify the coordinates used in the description of zone boundaries and site location of the United States Geological Survey gauge for purposes of measuring water levels.

SUMMARY: The proposed rule amendments reference the GPS coordinates for boundaries and identify the site location for measuring water levels at the United States Geological Survey gauge. This information provides a more specific description of the boating restricted areas on the St. Johns River.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

68D-24.018 St. Johns River Boating Restricted Areas.

(1) For the purpose of regulating the speed and operation of vessel traffic on the St. Johns River in Lake, Seminole and Volusia Counties, Florida the following boating restricted areas are established. Coordinates used in the description of zone boundaries are referenced to the North American Datum of 1983 (NAD83). The boating restricted areas exclude all associated tributaries, creeks, canals, backwaters, channels, boat basins and other waterways unless otherwise designated or specifically described for inclusion:

- (a) No Change.
- (b) Flood Zones.

1. Astor: During flooding, an Idle Speed No Wake zone from shoreline to shoreline in the St. Johns River, bounded on the northwest by a line drawn perpendicular to the centerline of the St. Johns River 50 feet north of the confluence of South Moon Canal and the St. Johns River and bounded on the south by a line drawn perpendicular to the centerline of the St. Johns River approximately 4,160 ~~2,125~~ feet south of the south end of the fender of the SR 40 (Astor) Bridge to GPS position 29° 9.37267' North 81°31.38050' West, as depicted in Drawing J, when the St. Johns River water level is 2.3 feet or higher when measured at the United States Geological Survey gauge at Astor (USGS site # 02236125), as determined by the flood stage established by the National Weather Service as indicated by the St. Johns River Water Management District gauge at the SR 40 (Astor) Bridge.

2. Highbanks Boat Ramp: During flooding, an Idle Speed No Wake zone from shoreline to shoreline in the St. Johns River, bounded on the north by a line drawn perpendicular to the centerline of the St. Johns River 1,700 feet north of the centerline of Highbanks Road Boat Ramp and bounded on the southwest by a line perpendicular to the centerline of the St. Johns River 1,800 feet south of the centerline of the Highbanks Boat Ramp, as depicted in Drawing K, when the St. Johns River water level is 5.5 feet or higher when measured at the United States Geological Survey gauge at Sanford (USGS site #02234500), as determined by the flood stage established by the National Weather Service 5.6 feet or higher as indicated by the St. Johns River Water Management District gauge at the Sanford Station.

3. Mullet Lake Park: During flooding, an Idle Speed No Wake zone from shoreline to shoreline in the St. Johns River, bounded on the east by a line drawn perpendicular to the centerline of the St. Johns River at Mullet Lake Park Boat Ramp and bounded on the west by a line drawn perpendicular to the centerline of the St. Johns River 3,000 feet west of Mullet Lake Park Boat Ramp, as depicted in Drawing L, when the St. Johns

River water level is 8 feet or higher when measured at the United States Geological Survey gauge at Lake Harney (USGS site #02234000), as determined by the flood stage established by the National Weather Service as indicated by the National Weather Service gauge at the Lake Harney Station.

4. Lemon Bluff: During flooding, an Idle Speed No Wake zone from shoreline to shoreline in the St. Johns River, bounded on the northeast by a line drawn perpendicular to the centerline of the St. Johns River at the northeast tip of the unnamed island (located at approximate latitude 28° 48.394' North, approximate longitude 81° 7.799' West) southeast of Lemon Bluff Boat Ramp and bounded on the southwest by a line drawn perpendicular to the centerline of the St. Johns River 3,675 feet southwest of the southern tip of said unnamed island (located at approximate latitude 28° 48.282' North, approximate longitude 81° 7.806' West), as depicted in Drawing M, when the St. Johns River water level is 8 feet or higher when measured at the United States Geological Survey gauge at Lake Harney (USGS site #02234000), as determined by the flood stage established by the National Weather Service as indicated by the National Weather Service gauge at the Lake Harney Station.

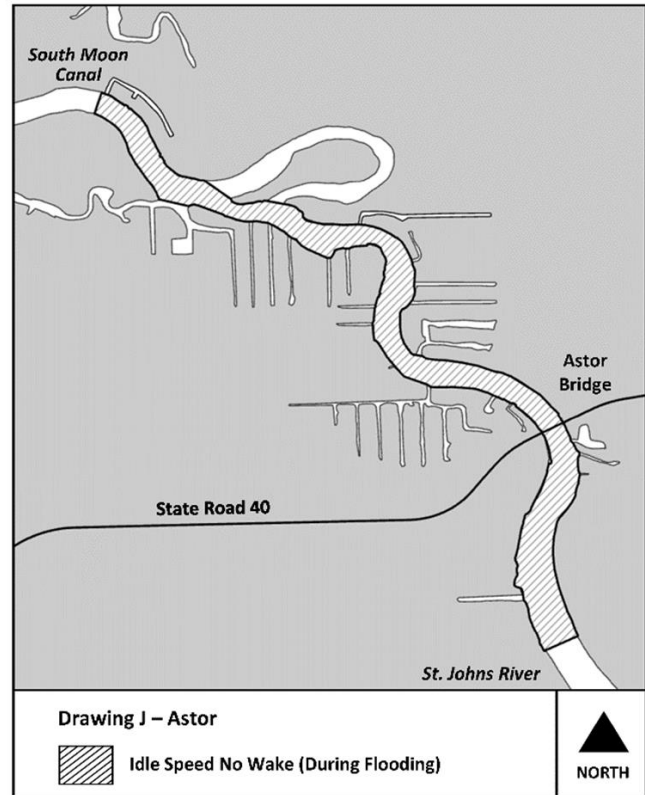

Lake Monroe: During flooding, an Idle Speed No Wake zone from shoreline to shoreline in the St. Johns River, bounded on the southeast by the northwesterly side of the I-4 bridge in Sanford, Florida, and bounded on the northwest by a line drawn perpendicular to the centerline of the St. Johns River at approximate latitude 28° 50.61660' North, and approximate longitude 81° 20.23200' West, including all canals associated with St. Johns River Estates, Boat Tree Marina, the intake and discharge canals at the Sanford Power Plant, and the water basin on the north side of the River between US Highway 17/92 and I-4, as depicted in Drawing N, when the St. Johns River water level is 5.5 feet or higher when measured at the United States Geological Survey gauge at Sanford (USGS site #02234500), as determined by the flood stage established by the National Weather Service as indicated by the National Weather Service gauge at the Lake Monroe Station.
