PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To update the Human Trafficking Screening Tool.

SUMMARY: Updates the Human Trafficking Screening Tool, CF-FSP 5406 to: (1) emphasizes the conversational approach to the interview, (2) emphasizes the tool is a guide to open dialogue; (3) changes all questions to third person to remind screeners to utilize interviewing skills, (4) adds new questions, (5) demographic section of the tool was updated to better assess risk, and (6) updates questions.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

NOTICE OF CHANGE

Notice is hereby given that the following changes have been made to the proposed rule in accordance with subparagraph 120.54(3)(d)1., F.S., published in Vol. 49 No. 85, May 2, 2023 issue of the Florida Administrative Register.

The following sections of the proposed rule will be changed to read:

59B-12.001 Bone Marrow Transplantation.

As used in this rule, the term “appropriate oncological specialty” means that where a particular kind of tumor or disease is usually treated by a subspecialty group within the general discipline of oncology, those who practice within that subspecialty have had specific input into the decision making process. Cellular therapies include cellular immunotherapies, chimeric antigen receptor (CAR) T cells, cancer vaccines, and other types of both autologous and allogeneic cells for certain therapeutic indications. Human gene therapy refers to products that introduce genetic material into a person’s DNA to replace faulty or missing genetic material, thus treating a disease or abnormal medical condition.

(1) Upon the recommendation of the Bone Marrow Transplant Panel, each of the following procedures meets a minimum level of evidence based on high quality systematic reviews of case control or cohort studies, high quality case-control or cohort studies with a very low risk of confounding bias, or chance, and a high probability that the relationship is causal, and is considered accepted within the appropriate oncological specialty and not experimental for the purposes of Section 627.4236, F.S.

(a) Allogeneic bone marrow transplant for the following:

1. Acute myelogenous leukemia and myeloid sarcoma;
2. Acute lymphoblastic leukemia;
3. Chronic myelogenous leukemia;
4. Myelodysplastic syndromes;
5. Chronic myelomonocytic leukemia;
6. Myelofibrosis;
7. Non-Hodgkin lymphoma;
8. Hodgkin lymphoma after autologous stem cell collection failure or relapsed after autologous transplant but not progressing on salvage chemotherapy;
9. Chronic lymphocytic leukemia;
10. Severe or very severe aplastic anemia from HLA compatible siblings and any type of bone marrow transplant ~~transplant~~ for acquired severe aplastic anemia unresponsive to immunosuppression or bone marrow failure syndromes;
11. Severe aplastic anemia and other bone marrow failure syndromes ~~syndromes~~;
12. Thalassemia;
13. Inborn errors of immune system including severe combined immune deficiencies, primary immune deficiencies, and primary immune regulatory disorders;
14. Sickle cell disease.

(b) Autologous bone marrow transplant for the following:

1. Multiple myeloma (including double bone marrow transplant), Waldenstrom macroglobulinemia and primary amyloidosis;

2. Non-Hodgkin lymphoma;
3. Hodgkin lymphoma;
4. Acute myelogenous leukemia (stem cells collected in remission);
5. Neuroblastoma;
6. Germ cell tumor, after failure of first therapy but not progressing on salvage therapy;
7. Primitive neuroectodermal tumor (PNET), (including medulloblastoma and pinealoblastoma), chemotherapy sensitive after first relapse;
8. Medulloblastoma and other PNET tumors, metastatic, at diagnosis;
9. Ewing sarcoma, chemotherapy sensitive after first relapse.

Notice is hereby given that the following changes have been made to the proposed rule in accordance with subparagraph 120.54(3)(d)1., F.S., published in Vol. 49 No. 82, April 27, 2023 issue of the Florida Administrative Register.

64B23-6.001 Penalty- Guidelines.

(1) Unless mitigating or aggravating factors are present, when the Department finds an applicant or licensee whom it regulates under Chapter 483, Part IV, F.S., has committed any of the acts set forth in Section 483.901(6), F.S., it shall issue a final order imposing appropriate penalties based on the severity and repetition of the violation within the ranges recommended in the following disciplinary guidelines. The identification of

violations is descriptive only; the full language of each statutory provision cited must be considered in order to determine the conduct included. Any of the listed violations provide sufficient grounds for denying a licensure application. A finding of financial benefit or self-gain related to the violation is grounds for requiring the person charged with a violation to refund fees billed and collected from a patient or third party in addition to any other appropriate penalties imposed by this rule. In addition to any other discipline imposed, the Department shall assess the actual costs related to the investigation and prosecution of a case. In addition to or in lieu of the penalties provided herein, if the violation is for fraud or making a false or fraudulent representation, the Department shall impose a fine of \$10,000.00 per count or offense.

The Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Hotels and Restaurants hereby gives notice:

On July 17, 2023 the Division of Hotels and Restaurants received a Petition for an Emergency Variance for paragraph 61C-1.004(2)(a), Florida Administrative Code, subsection 61C-

4.010(7) Florida Administrative Code and subsection 61C-4.010(6), Florida Administrative Code, and Section 6-40.11. 2017 FDA Food Code from Chabad Lubavitch of Venetian CSWY & Surrounding Islands Inc. located in Miami. The above referenced F.A.C. addresses the requirement that at least one accessible bathroom be provided for use by customers and employees. They are requesting to utilize bathrooms located on a different level.

The Petition for this variance was published in Vol. 49/138 on July 18, 2023. The Order for this Petition was signed and approved on July 25, 2023 after a complete review of the variance request, the Division finds that the application of this Rule will create a financial hardship to the food service establishment. Furthermore, the Division finds that the Petitioner meets the burden of demonstrating that the underlying statute has been achieved by the Petitioner ensuring the public bathrooms located on the second floor are maintained in a clean and sanitary manner and are provided with hot and cold running water under pressure, soap, approved hand drying devices, handwash sign and are available during all hours of operation. The Petitioner shall also ensure that directional signage is installed in the main restaurant area clearly stating the location of the bathrooms.

FINAL ORDER

APPROVING LAKE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 2023-29

The Florida Department of Commerce (“Commerce”), formerly known as the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity i[1], hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by Lake County, Florida, Ordinance No. 2023-29 (the “Ordinance”).

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1.The Green Swamp Area is designated by section 380.0551, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. Lake County is a local government within the Green Swamp Area.
- 2.The Ordinance was adopted by Lake County on May 9, 2023, and rendered to Commerce on May 30, 2023.
- 3.The Ordinance amends Section 4.03.04, Lake County Code, Appendix E, Land Development Regulations entitled Residential Development Standards. The Ordinance requires a Planned Unit Development for any developer seeking to apply to plat a residential subdivision consisting of 50 or more dwelling units unless the applicant proposes to use a Rural Conservation Subdivision design.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 4.Commerce is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern. See section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes.
5. “Land development regulations” include “local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land.” Section 380.031(8), Florida Statutes. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

6. The Ordinance is consistent with the Lake County Comprehensive Plan generally, as required by section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, and specifically is consistent with Objective I-7.14, Policy I-8.4.8, Policy V-1.1.4, and Policy I-4.1.5.

7.All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. See section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in subsection 28-26.003(1), Florida Administrative Code.

8.The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern as a whole, and specifically furthers the following principles:

- (1)(a) Minimize the adverse impacts of development on resources of the Floridan Aquifer, wetlands, and flood-detention areas; and
- (1)(g) Protect or improve existing ground and surface-water quality.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Commerce finds that Lake County Ordinance No. 2023-29 is consistent with the Lake County Comprehensive Plan and the Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby APPROVED.

This Final Order becomes final 21 days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below.
