The Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Hotels and Restaurants hereby gives notice:

On April 19, 2023 the Division of Hotels and Restaurants received a Petition for an Emergency Variance for subsection 61C-4.010(7) Florida Administrative Code and subsection 61C-4.010(6), Florida Administrative Code from PCB Break Room LLC located in Panama City Beach. The above referenced F.A.C. addresses the requirement that at least one accessible bathroom be provided for use by customers and employees. They are requesting to share the bathrooms located within a nearby establishment under the same ownership for use by customers and employees.

The Petition for this variance was published in Vol. 49/77 on April 20, 2023. The Order for this Petition was signed and approved on May 1, 2023. After a complete review of the variance request, the Division finds that the application of this Rule will create a financial hardship to the food service establishment. The Petitioner shall also ensure that directional signage is installed within or outside the establishment clearly stating the location of the bathrooms. If the ownership of The Break Room (PCB Break Room LLC Lic. SEA1305661) and/or The Break Room (PCB Break Room LLC, License SEA1305811) changes, an updated signed agreement for use of the bathroom facilities will be required immediately.
