PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The proposed rulemaking will incorporate a recent change to Rule 69K-18.004, F.A.C., into

Form DFS-N1-1749, reducing the number of embalming cases required per year in order to become a training agency. The rulemaking reduces embalming cases required from (40) to twenty (20) to comport with the newest rule promulgated by the Board of Funeral, Cemetery, and Consumer Services through the Office of Attorney General. The rulemaking will also clarify the wording on and incorporate ten (10) forms applicable to these rules.

SUMMARY: These rules establish the criteria and procedure for: the embalmer intern training program, the funeral director intern training program, the embalmer and funeral director intern training program, and an intern training agency.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

(1) Persons desiring licensure to become an intern embalmer shall apply for a license by completing Form DFS-N1-1708, “Application for Embalmer Intern License,” effective MM/YY, which is incorporated by reference and available at <http://www.myfloridacfo.com/Division/funeralcemetery/> or <https://www.flrules.org/gateway/> ~~in Rule 69K-18.001,~~

~~F.A.C., and filing it with the Division.~~ A one-hundred dollar (\$100.00) nonrefundable application fee and an unlicensed activity fee of five dollars (\$5.00) shall accompany the form. Such application shall demonstrate that the applicant for registration meets the requirements of Sections 497.368(1)(b)-(e), F.S. The completed application shall be filed with the Division at the address stated on the form.

(2) Embalmer internship training shall be received at an approved training agency under the direct supervision of a Florida licensed embalmer in good standing who shall certify by quarterly reports the training activities engaged in by the intern during the preceding calendar quarter. ~~Direct supervision means responsible supervision and control, with the licensed embalmer providing both initial directions as well as periodic inspection of the embalming service. The supervising embalmer shall be physically present or on the premises at all times when the intern is performing the services. If during the course of his internship training the embalmer intern receives instructions from more than one licensed Florida embalmer, each instructor shall be required to certify the training, giving the dates during which instruction was given and the training activities engaged in by the intern under his supervision.~~

(a) Direct supervision means responsible supervision and control, with the licensed embalmer providing both initial directions as well as periodic inspection of the embalming service. The supervising embalmer shall be physically present or on the premises at all times when the intern is performing the services.

(b) If during the course of his internship training the embalmer intern receives instructions from more than one licensed Florida embalmer, each instructor shall be required to certify the training, giving the dates during which instruction was given and the training activities engaged in by the intern under his supervision.

5CER24-8 Temporary Restrictions on the Importation of Dairy Cattle

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR

WELFARE: On March 25, 2024, federal and state veterinary and public health agencies announced the detection of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza in dairy cattle herds in Texas and Kansas. Subsequently, dairy herds in Idaho, Michigan, New Mexico, North Carolina, Ohio, South Dakota, Colorado, Iowa, Oklahoma, Wyoming, and Minnesota have been confirmed to have the virus. These herds all exhibited a similar clinical syndrome, Bovine Associated Influenza A Syndrome (H5N1), an emerging and highly contagious disease affecting the health and milk production of dairy cattle. The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) has also declared Bovine Associated Influenza A Syndrome to be “an additional disease risk to domestic poultry farms—since this [H5N1 virus] genotype can infect both cattle and poultry.” Confirmed cases of H5N1 have also been found in humans since the initial detection of the virus in dairy cattle herds, and stringent biosecurity practices are necessary to limit its spread and impacts.

The situation surrounding Bovine Associated Influenza A Syndrome is rapidly evolving, and this emergency rule incorporates updated requirements based upon the most current information available.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: This rule is fair and justified because it takes only the actions necessary to protect public health, safety, and welfare by preventing the introduction and spread of this dangerous and transmissible disease and its vectors.

On April 29, 2024, the Federal Order Requiring Testing for and Reporting of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) in Livestock (Federal Order) issued by the USDA’s Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) went into effect. Since the issuance of the Federal Order, APHIS has updated testing requirements for specified dairy cattle moving interstate. Emergency rulemaking to implement protocols based upon the most up-to-date research is the only viable means of ensuring the protection of Florida animals susceptible to this potentially devastating disease.

SUMMARY: This rule adopts updated federal requirements and places restrictions upon the importation of cattle to ensure they have not been exposed to a known or suspected case of Bovine Associated Influenza A Syndrome and show no clinical signs of the disease. The requirements in this rule are in addition to the import requirements set forth in Rule Chapter 5C-3, Florida Administrative Code.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

5CER24-8 Temporary Restrictions on the Importation of Dairy Cattle

(1) Except where more stringent requirements are adopted herein, dairy cattle being imported into Florida must meet the testing and movement requirements of the *Federal Order Requiring Testing for and Reporting of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) in Livestock (4/24/24)* (“Federal Order”) and *APHIS Requirements and Recommendations for Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) H5N1 Virus in Livestock For State Animal Health Officials, Accredited Veterinarians and Producers (5/14/24)* (“APHIS Requirements”), both of which are hereby adopted and incorporated by reference. The *Case Definition for Avian Influenza (AI) (May 2024)* cited within the APHIS Requirements is also hereby adopted and incorporated by reference. These documents are available for review at <https://www.fdacs.gov/Divisions-Offices/Animal-Industry>.

(2) “Exposed cattle” or cattle originating from an H5N1 Influenza virus “affected herd,” as those terms are defined in the APHIS Requirements, may not be imported into Florida.

(3) In addition to the requirements set forth in the Federal Order and APHIS Requirements, the following documentation is required when importing dairy cattle into Florida:

(a) Dairy cattle originating from a state that does not have any suspected or confirmed cases of Bovine Associated Influenza A (H5N1), must meet the Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) requirements set forth in rule 5C-3.002, F.A.C. The OCVI must include the following information:

1. The lactation status of the animal (lactating or non-lactating).

2. For lactating dairy cattle required to test negative for Bovine Associated Influenza A (H5N1) pursuant to subsection (1), the negative test results, laboratory name, accession number, and test date. Notwithstanding rule 5C-3.002(1)(c), F.A.C., the OCVI and test date must be no more than 7 days prior to importation into Florida.

(b) Dairy cattle originating from a state with an “affected herd,” as that term is defined in the APHIS Requirements, must be accompanied by a lawful OCVI which includes:

1. The lactation status of the animal (lactating or non-lactating).

2. For lactating dairy cattle required to test negative for Bovine Associated Influenza A (H5N1) pursuant to subsection (1), the negative test results, laboratory name, accession number, and test date. Notwithstanding rule 5C-3.002(1)(c), F.A.C., the OCVI issue date and test date must be no more than 7 days prior to importation into Florida.

3. Notwithstanding rule 5C-3.002(1)(c), F.A.C., the OCVI issue date for non-lactating dairy cattle must be no more than 10 days prior to importation into Florida.

(4) Exception for Movement to Slaughter. Notwithstanding the requirements set forth within this rule, lactating dairy cattle being imported into Florida and moving directly to slaughter are not required to be tested for the H5N1 Influenza virus if they are accompanied by a lawful OCVI or an Owner-Shipper Statement that complies with the requirements set forth in rule chapter 5C-3, F.A.C., and was issued within 10 days of entry into Florida.

The Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Hotels and Restaurants hereby gives notice: On July 16, 2024 the Division of Hotels and Restaurants received a Petition for a Routine Variance for paragraph 61C-1.004(1)(a), Florida Administrative Code and Paragraph 5-202.11(A), 2017 FDA Food Code from Mardini Foods LLC located in Plantation. The above referenced F.A.C. addresses the requirement that each establishment have an approved plumbing system installed to transport potable water and wastewater. They are requesting to utilize holding tanks to provide potable water and to collect wastewater at the handwash sink.

The Petition for this variance was published in Vol. 50/139 on July 17, 2024. The Order for this Petition was signed and approved on August 01, 2024. After a complete review of the variance request, the Division finds that the application of this Rule will create a financial hardship to the food service establishment. Furthermore, the Division finds that the Petitioner meets the burden of demonstrating that the underlying statute has been achieved by the Petitioner ensuring the wastewater holding tank for the handwash sink is emptied at a frequency as to not create a sanitary nuisance; and potable

water provided must come from an approved source and be protected from contamination during handling. The Petitioner shall also ensure that the handwash sinks are provided with hot and cold running water under pressure, soap, an approved hand drying device and a handwashing sign.

The Petition for this variance was published in Vol. 50/139 on July 17, 2024. The Order for this Petition was signed and approved on August 01, 2024. After a complete review of the variance request, the Division finds that the application of this Rule will create a financial hardship to the food service establishment. FDACS will utilize its administrative procedures for emergency meals as provided in Rule SP-2.005, F.A.C. and Rule SP-3 F.A.C., which outline the eligibility requirements, application process, requirements for the identification of meal service times and locations, meal pattern requirements, claims for reimbursement process, and record retention requirements. In the event a School District is unable to provide meals during an unanticipated school closure, FDACS will assist the remaining sponsors of the SFSP for the county in which the non-participating School District resides, and responses will be considered on a first come, first served basis, in accordance with Rule SP-3 F.A.C. FDACS also has template meal count forms that are available for download, or can be printed and shipped to program sponsors, for use during the implementation of the requested waiver if for any reason the Point of Service (POS) becomes inaccessible during an unanticipated school closure. The Florida Automated Nutrition System (FANS) is also accessible using any standard internet browser - desktop or mobile - so that meal counts can be entered from any location and submitted to FDACS without the need of any alternative procedure. FDACS will continue to conduct program monitoring in accordance with 7 CFR 225.7(f) throughout the implementation period of the waiver.
