3. An unedited audio recording if said course is offered remotely or is otherwise recorded as part of the provider's normal course of business.

(b) Board staff shall initiate an audit of the underlying course(s) by submitting a request to the Provider to provide all documentation noted in paragraph (9) above pertaining to the course. Said records must be received by the Board no later than 30 days from the date of the request.

(c) Upon receipt of the required records, the Board Chair, or designee, with the assistance of Board staff, shall review the matter for a determination of whether a violation is likely to have occurred.

(d) Said review may include requesting additional information or statements from the provider of attendees as determined by the Board Chair, or designee.

(e) Should the Provider fail to submit the requested records as noted in paragraph (10)(a) above, or should the Board Chair, or designee, refer the complaint to the full board for review, the Board Chair, or designee, shall issue an Order to Show Cause to the provider and/or the Presenter to appear at the Board meeting to show cause why the Course presented was not in violation as described in paragraph (11) below.

(10) It shall be determined to be a violation if it is determined that the Provider or the Presenter, for credit:

(a) Failed to provide instruction consistent with the documentation submitted for initial course approval; or

(b) Presented or allowed as instructor to present a course which consists of instruction in the use, application, prescription, recommendation, or administration of a specific company’s brand of products or services in violation of s. 460.408(1)(b), F.S.

(11) Upon determination of violation, the Board may rescind or reject approval of the individual course(s), or any portion thereof.

(12) Any Chiropractor licensed in the State of Florida who knowingly presents a course for continuing education credit which consists of instruction in the use, application, prescription, recommendation, or administration of a specific company’s brand of products or services, including services offered by the Chiropractor her or himself, shall be deemed to be in violation of s. 456.072(1)(dd), F.S, and s. 460.413(1)(ff), F.S.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE PROPOSED RULE IS:

64B2-17.004 Dry Needling.

(1) For purposes of determining compliance with this rule and the applicable statutory provisions relating to the practice of dry needling by Chiropractic Physicians, the words and phrases listed below are defined in the following manner:

(a) "Adequate training to be eligible to perform dry needling" means that the continuing education pursuant to Section 460.4085(1)(a), F.S., includes forty (40) hours instruction in the following subject areas:

1. No less than three (3) hours on the theory of dry needling;

2. No less than two (2) hours on the selection and safe handling of needles and other apparatus or equipment used in dry needling, including instruction on the proper handling of biohazardous waste;

3. No less than four (4) hours on the general indications and contraindications for dry needling, as well as complex anatomical and safety considerations of the cranio-facial and peripheral nervous systems for dry needling of the head, neck, and torso;

4. No less than ten (10) hours on the psychomotor skills needed to perform dry needling, including tissue palpation, needle insertion, and needle extraction; and

5. No less than four (4) hours on the postintervention care, including adverse responses, adverse event recordkeeping, and any reporting obligations.

(b) "Adverse medical incident" means an event over which the Chiropractic Physician could exercise control and which is associated in whole or in part with the performance of dry needling, rather than the condition for which dry needling occurred, and which resulted in any prolonged and/or emergent neurological, pulmonary, vascular, or musculoskeletal condition that required the transfer of the patient to a hospital and/or referral to a physician for treatment of the resulting condition.

(c) "Supervision" means observation of the dry needling procedure by a licensed chiropractic physician, allopathic or osteopathic physician, or physical therapist holding a Doctor of Physical Therapy degree who has actively performed dry needling for at least 1 year, as required pursuant to Section 460.4085(1)(b), F.S. The observation may be in person or via synchronous telehealth as defined in Section 456.47, F.S.

(2) The Board shall certify any chiropractic physician who meets the minimum standards of practice and requirements as established in Section 460.4085, F.S.

(3) In addition to the requirements noted herein, the continuing education must include a determination by the instructor, that the Chiropractic Physician being trained in dry needling demonstrates the requisite competency and

psychomotor skills to safely perform dry needling; and has completed 10 patient sessions of dry needling under one of the following circumstances:

(a) While licensed as a Chiropractic Physician in another state or while serving as a Chiropractic Physician in the United States Armed Services; or

(b) Under supervision as defined herein, where the supervisor has documented that the supervised physician has met the supervision and competency requirements and needs no additional supervised sessions to perform dry needling. It is the responsibility of the supervised physician to maintain all documents.

(4) Pursuant to s. 460.4085, F.S., the Chiropractic Physician may provide proof of completion of coursework that substantially complies with the training requirements established herein which may be used to satisfy the hourly requirements of Section 460.4085(1)(a), F.S. on an hour per hour basis. However, in no case may the requirement to pass a written and practical examination be waived.

(5) A Chiropractic Physician shall not delegate performance of dry needling to a certified chiropractic physician assistant, or any other person who is not a Chiropractic Physician authorized to perform dry needling.

(6) A Chiropractic Physician shall not perform dry needling without the patient's consent documented in the patient's medical record.

(7) An adverse medical incident that is a direct result of chiropractic treatment involving dry needling shall be reported to the Board within 15 days of the incident.

(8) In order to become certified to practice dry needling, the licensed and qualified Chiropractic Physician shall submit to the Board Form DH-MQA-5099, Chiropractic Physician Dry Needling Application, effective 08/24, which is hereby incorporated by reference and is available through <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-> _____, or at <https://floridaschiropracticmedicine.gov/>.

(9) The requirement that dry needling may not be delegated to any other person other than a chiropractic physician, does not limit the chiropractic physician from referring a patient to or otherwise allowing another individual to perform dry needling who is otherwise authorized to perform dry needling pursuant to their license and authorized scope of practice.

 5KER24-16 Cleaning and Sanitizing of Containers and
 Equipment for Milk Producers

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: As a result of the effects on the supply and processing of Grade “A” milk that will be caused by Hurricane Milton, extreme and unusual circumstances will exist that hinder the marketability and availability of Grade “A” milk post Hurricane Milton to consumers throughout the State.

Additionally, circumstances have arisen regarding the availability of trucks and trailers and have created an issue removing milk from dairy farms across the State and with the storage of raw milk in anticipation of normal demand post Hurricane Milton. Following the adoption of this emergency rule, waiving certain cleaning frequency requirements for bulk milk tankers and equipment statewide will allow for adequate and rapid distribution and processing of Grade “A” milk, helping increase production of Grade “A” milk to consumers and assisting the dairy industry through the hardship created by this storm. Stores will have a very limited supply of Grade “A” products post Hurricane Milton, and dairy farms will be forced to dump milk if the processing of these products cannot be expedited by this emergency rule. The exclusion shall be for Section 12p as specified in the Pasteurized Milk Ordinance adopted in Rule 5K-10.001. Permitted dairy farms throughout the state may face delays in processing and no dairy farm will be able to stop milking lactating cows due to the storm. Lactating dairy cows must be milked or will suffer serious health implications, such as mastitis, that will cause them to be removed from the milking herd. This will create issues with herd health and milk supply in the future, well beyond the affects from Hurricane Milton. Extending the wash times on bulk raw storage milk tanks will allow for the needed storage time at dairy farms to account for processing or other delays caused Hurricane Milton.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: This emergency rule was initiated at the request of dairy farms and cooperatives to more adequately meet the anticipated needs of Florida consumers as a result of anticipated milk demand created by Hurricane Milton and the loss of production caused by the shutdown of plants in the State. The storm has disrupted the production and processing of milk in this state. This emergency rule will help alleviate distribution difficulties and shortages of milk anticipated from this event to provide relief to Florida.

SUMMARY: This emergency rule allows for the increased storage time of raw milk at Grade “A” dairy farms by extending the time required between cleanings of bulk raw milk storage tanks so long as specific requirements are met. Under Section 12p in the Pasteurized Milk Ordinance, it states that storage tanks shall be cleaned once a day or not to exceed seventy-two (72) hours. This emergency rule increases that time to ninety-six (96) hours to allow processing of Grade “A” milk. Additionally, Appendix B, VI. Milk Tank Truck Permitting and Inspection states that under continuous use, milk tank trucks can pick up multiple loads within a 24-hour period, provided the milk tank truck is washed after each day’s use. The provisions of this emergency rule would allow an additional 6 hours to account for logistical issues with transport; shortage of water for washes; and fuel availability issues. This should

reduce or eliminate the need to dump milk for tankers that struggle to meet that these requirements. These changes to the adopted requirements of the Pasteurized Milk Ordinance (PMO), 2017 Revision adopted in Rule 5K-10.001, F.A.C. will be in effect for the period beginning October 9, 2024, through October 27, 2024. The specific standards affected are below.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

5KER24-16 Cleaning and Sanitizing of Containers and Equipment for Milk Producers.

(1) Notwithstanding the Pasteurized Milk Ordinance (PMO), as adopted by Department Rule 5K-10.001, F.A.C., raw milk for pasteurization as a Grade “A” product may be stored by a milk producer for not more than 96 hours if the storage vessel:

(a) is a bulk raw milk storage tank of a permitted FDACS Grade “A” milk producer; and

(b) maintains constant temperature not to exceed 45 °F.

The milk received must comply with all other parts of the PMO and the product must be used for pasteurization. The requirements set forth in this emergency rule shall apply for the time period of October 9, 2024, through October 27, 2024.

(2) Notwithstanding the PMO, bulk milk tankers used for the transportation of Grade “A” raw milk may continuously pick up multiple loads within a thirty (30) hour period without a wash between loads unless the previous load was deemed violative for inhibitor. If the previous load was deemed violative for inhibitor, the tanker must receive a full dairy wash at a permitted wash station before picking up additional milk.

(3) This emergency rule shall expire on October 27, 2024. Rulemaking Authority 502.014 FS. Law Implemented 502.012, 502.014, 502.053, 502.091 FS. History – New 10/9/2024.
