NOTICE OF INTENT TO SOLICIT
PROFESSIONAL SERVICES FOR A STUDY
OF WILDLIFE HABITAT AND WILDLIFE
UTILIZATION OF PHOSPHATE MINED LANDS

The Florida Institute of Phosphate Research is seeking the professional services of a university, research organization, environmental consulting firm or a group of such institutions to conduct a study of "WILDLIFE HABITAT AND WILDLIFE UTILIZATION OF PHOSPHATE MINED LANDS" in Florida.

The general goal of the project is to identify reclamation practices that could better provide habitat for wildlife on phosphate mined lands in Florida. The study will include identification of vertebrate species that inhabit the phosphate regions, the habitat requirements of species selected jointly by the contractor and a FIPR advisory committee, classification and mapping of existing and proposed habitats on phosphate lands, identification of practices to improve habitat and identification of information gaps that could be filled through research.

PRE-QUALIFICATION

Firms interested in providing professional services to the Florida Institute of Phosphate Research to perform the subject research must first demonstrate their qualifications before being asked to submit a proposal to perform the work. The factors that will be used by the Selection Committee to evaluate qualifications are: (1) experience of the organization's personnel with Florida wildlife and wildlife habitat; (2) experience with habitat restoration; (3) familiarity with phosphate mine reclamation practices, issues and regulations; (4) experience of the organization's personnel with habitat
