The subject building is required to have a fire alarm system install unless exempt pursuant to NFPA 101-31.3.4.1.2. The subject building is not entitled to the exemption because every unit therein does not have an independent exit or stairway discharging at grade. Photographs of the building along with the description in the petition indicate that on the second story, two units share the same independent stairway discharging at grade. The building contains several shared stairways from the second floor discharging at grade. For the same reason, the subject building is not entitled to the exemption provided by Section 633.0215(14), Note 1, Florida Statutes.
