RULE NO.: RULE TITLE:

65C-28.008 Relative Caregiver Program

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The Department intends to amend Rule 65C-28.008, F.A.C, to clarify 1) When a nonrelative may receive nonrelative caregiver financial assistance for a minor parent and the minor parent’s child; and 2) What assistance is available for children placed with half-siblings.

SUMMARY: The amendments clarify 1) A minor parent may not receive a TCA payment for him- or herself and his or her child while the nonrelative receives the NCFCA payment for either or both of them and 2) A child who is eligible for a Relative Caregiver payment based on his or her placement with a half-sibling who is related to the caregiver is not eligible for NCFCA. Further, form CF-FSP 5398, Application for Nonrelative Caregiver Financial Assistance, is updated.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION: The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: The Department used a checklist to conduct an economic analysis and determine if there is an adverse impact or regulatory costs associated with this rule that exceeds the criteria in section 120.541(2)(a), F.S. Based upon this analysis, the Department has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification.

Any person who wishes to provide information regarding a statement of estimated regulatory costs, or provide a proposal for a lower cost regulatory alternative must do so in writing within 21 days of this notice.

65C-28.008 Relative Caregiver Program Requirements.

(1) through (2) No change.

(3) Nonrelative Caregiver Financial Assistance (NCFCA).

(a) Eligibility Requirements.

1. NCFCA is available to nonrelative caregivers who would be unable to serve as a caregiver without financial assistance.

a. Persons outside the fifth degree by blood or marriage to the parent or stepparent of a child are eligible to receive NCFCA provided all other eligibility requirements are met. This does not include the stepparent or a former stepparent of the child.

b. through c. No change.

2. No change

3. A nonrelative may receive the NCFCA payment for a minor parent who is in his or her care, and for that minor parent’s child, if both children have been adjudicated dependent and meet all other eligibility requirements. The minor parent may not receive a TCA payment for him- or herself and his or her child while the nonrelative receives the NCFCA payment for either or both of them. If the minor parent applies for TCA for him- or herself and his or her minor child, the NCFCA payment must be terminated.

4. A child who is eligible for a Relative Caregiver payment based on his or her placement with a half-sibling who is related to the caregiver is not eligible for NCFCA.

53. Eligibility for NCFCA shall be reassessed annually by reviewing the eligibility criteria in subsections (3)(a)1.-2. and subsections (3)(c)1.-2. of this rule.

The University of South Florida (USF), announces that continuing professional services are required for the following discipline:

Civil Engineering (Up to 2) University of South Florida, Tampa Campus, Tampa, Florida (with ability to include other campuses as required).

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Projects included in the scope of this Agreement will be specific projects for renovations, alterations, new construction and additions for USF facilities that have a basic construction budget that does not exceed \$2,000,000 or survey or studies for which the fee for professional services that does not exceed \$200,000. Projects for USF facilities may include Teaching, Research, Health, Academic, Administrative, Recreation and Residence Life Facilities, as well as Infrastructure and Utility projects. Continuing Service contracts for these projects provide that the consultant will be available on an as-needed basis for an initial contract period of one (1) year with an Owner’s option to renew for one (1) additional year at a time up to a total of two (2) additional years. This selection is based upon Civil Engineering services only. The Consultant(s) receiving the award will not have an exclusive contract to perform services for these projects; the USF may have additional continuing service Consultant(s) under contract during the same time period. Services required to be provided under the Continuing Service Contracts include the development of record drawings by the Continuing Service Consultant for projects designed by that consultant to reflect as-built conditions to facilitate the University’s space management program. Any new construction projects should have the ability to be USGBC LEED certified, to a minimum certification level of Silver, if required by the Owner and shall be included as part of basic services and will not be considered as an additional service.

The Civil Engineer Continuing Services contract shall be in compliance with the selection provisions in Section 287.055, Florida Statutes, and Board of Governors Regulation 14.005.

It is the University’s responsibility to negotiate a fair, competitive and reasonable compensation per Section 287.055, Florida Statutes.
