The inclusion of this language was challenged in DOAH Case No. 14-1329RP. The administrative law judge determined the language was invalid, stating that "[e]xisting legal uses are presumed not contrary to the public interest unless and until the District determines otherwise." Language similar to that found invalid in C-43 Reservoir reservation case exists in the water reservations for Picayune Strand, Fakahatchee Estuary, North Fork of the St.

Lucie River, and Nearshore Central Biscayne Bay, in subsections 40E-10.041(1) and (2), 40E-10.051, and 40E-10.061(2), F.A.C., respectively.

EDIAL ORDER

FINAL ORDER <u>APPROVING MONROE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 030-</u> 2016

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to sections 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by Monroe County, Florida, Ordinance No. 030-2016 (the "Ordinance").

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Florida Keys Area is designated by section 380.0552, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. Monroe County is a local government within the Florida Keys Area.
- 2. The Ordinance was adopted by Monroe County on November 22, 2016, and rendered to the Department on December 16, 2016.
- 3. The Ordinance amends the Monroe County Land Development Code ("Code") by returning the definition of aggregation at section 130-165 to the language adopted by Monroe County prior to Ordinance 006-2016 being adopted.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. Sections 380.05(6), and 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes.
- 5. "Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. Section 380.031(8), Florida Statutes. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.
- 6. The Ordinance is consistent with the Monroe County Comprehensive Plan generally, and specifically, General Policy 2, as required by section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes.
- 7. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. Sections 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in section 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes.
- 8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development as a whole, and specifically furthers section 380.0552(7)(a), Florida Statutes, which requires "strengthening local government capabilities for managing land use and development so that local government is able to achieve these objectives without continuing the area of critical state concern designation."

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that Monroe County Ordinance No. 030-2016 is consistent with the Monroe County Comprehensive Plan and Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby <u>APPROVED</u>.

This Order becomes effective 21 days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below. DONE AND ORDERED in Tallahassee, Florida.
