5C-27.001 Dogs or Cats <u>– Intrastate Transfer of Ownership</u> Substantial rewording of 5C-27.001 follows. See Florida Administrative Code for present text.

(1) Prior to the transfer of ownership by sale of a dog or cat within the state, the owner, broker or transferor of the dog or cat shall first obtain an official certificate of veterinary inspection in accordance with Section 828.29, F.S. 20ER17-5 Anhydrous Citric Acid Standards for fresh Oranges

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: Section 120.54(4)(b), Florida Statutes, states that those rules pertaining to perishable agricultural commodities shall be included in the definition of rules relating to the public health, safety, or welfare.

Due to adverse weather conditions, significant amounts of the Florida early/mid-season fresh orange crop in the 2017-2018 season will have a minimum acid requirement below the .40 established in rule. The 10 years the industry has been battling Huanglongbing ("HLB" or "Greening") disease has exacerbated this issue, causing the fruit to mature at a lower minimum anhydrous citric acid level than is normal at this time of year. The inability to utilize this fruit would cause economic waste by allowing good and safe food to be ruled immature.

After taking testimony and discussing the matter at a telephonic meeting and hearing in Bartow, Florida on December 20, 2017 the Florida Citrus Commission found that there exist unusual weather conditions which could cause a substantial portion of the fresh early/mid-season orange crop to fail maturity requirements. The Commission voted unanimously to adopt Emergency Rule 20ER17-5, lowering the minimum anhydrous citric acid requirement for fresh early/mid-season orange crop for the period of December 21, 2017 through March 31, 2018, both dates inclusive.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: Adequate notice procedures were used by the Department of Citrus to inform the public and the Florida citrus industry of the pending adoption of Emergency Rule 20ER17-5 adjusting the minimum anhydrous citric acid requirement for early/mid-season orange crop, in that notice was made via email of the emergency rulemaking to take place at the December 20, 2017 meeting to members of the Florida Citrus Commission, all industry organizations, the Florida Press Corps and other interested persons.

SUMMARY: Emergency rule 20ER17-5 lowering the minimum anhydrous citric acid for early/mid-season orange

crop for the period beginning December 21, 2017 through March 31, 2018, both dates inclusive.

FINAL ORDER

APPROVING CITY OF KEY WEST ORDINANCE NO. 17-09

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes, and rule 28-36.002, Florida Administrative Code, approving land development regulations adopted by the City of Key West, Florida ("the City"), Ordinance No. 17-09 (the "Ordinance").

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The City is designated as an area of critical state concern by rule 28-36.002, Florida Administrative Code.

2. The Ordinance was adopted by the City on August 16, 2017, and rendered to the Department on October 27, 2017.

3. The Ordinance amends the City's Land Development Regulations ("LDRs") to add a definition for "Annual Household Income" and revises certain eligibility criteria for affordable workforce housing units.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. *See* Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes; *See also* rule 28-36.002, Florida Administrative Code.

5. "Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. Section 380.031(8), Florida Statutes. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

6. The Ordinance is consistent with the City's Comprehensive Plan generally, as required by section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, and specifically, Policies 3-1.1.7 and 3-1.1.8.

7. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. *See* section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in rule 28-36.003(1), Florida Administrative Code.

8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development as a whole, and specifically furthers the following:

(a) Strengthen local government capabilities for managing land use and development;

(h) Protection of the public health, safety, welfare and economy of the City of Key West, and the maintenance of Key West as a unique Florida resource.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that City Ordinance No. 17-09 is consistent with the City's Comprehensive Plan and Principles for Guiding Development for the City of Key West Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby <u>APPROVED</u>.

This Order becomes effective 21 days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below. DONE AND ORDERED in Tallahassee, Florida.
