1A-39.001 Division of Historical Resources Grant Programs & Requirements.

- (1) The purpose of this chapter is to establish administrative procedures for all Division of Historical Resources Historic Preservation Grants-in-Aid programs. Each program is governed by guidelines that contain eligibility requirements, application review procedures, evaluation and funding criteria, grant administration procedures, and application forms. All grant awards are subject to the approval of the Secretary of State and subject to availability of funds appropriated by the Legislature.
- (2) At least 80% of each donation made pursuant to Section 550.0351(2), F.S., if any, shall be available for allocation to eligible projects within a 50-mile radius of the racetrack or fronton which held the Charity Day from which the donation is derived. The remaining 20% of each donation may be used for eligible projects in other areas of the state.
- (3) All grant applicants must meet the requirements set forth in the Historic Preservation Grants-in-Aid Guidelines for Small Matching Grants Guidelines and Special Category Grants Guidelines, which are available from the Division of Historical Resources (Division),

5L-1.003 Shellfish Harvesting Area Standards

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The proposed rule amendments will reclassify shellfish harvesting areas and update the associated maps to protect the health of shellfish consumers and to provide access to renewable shellfish resources. The effect of these amendments is to maximize the amount of shellfish harvesting waters available and to maximize the times those waters will be in the open status while continuing to protect the public health. SUMMARY: The following Shellfish harvesting areas and management plans will be amended: Pensacola Bay (#02), North Bay (#10), East Bay (#12), Horseshoe Beach (#25), Suwannee Sound (#28), Withlacoochee Bay(#34), Lower Tampa Bay (#48), Gasparilla Sound (#56) and Ten Thousand Island (#66) shellfish harvesting. Waccasassa (#32) to correct the legal description with a GPS point that was previously not included.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: The Department's economic analysis of the adverse impact or potential regulatory costs of the proposed rule did not exceed any of the criteria established in Section 120.541(2)(a), Florida Statutes. As part of this analysis, the Department relied upon adverse impacts to the proposed classification changes and predicted days closed for each shellfish area resurveyed and found no adverse financial impacts to the industry. In instances where the predicted number of days closed increased it was found that this will not impact the industry as those shellfish will be available for harvest on an open harvest day. Industry saw all proposed classification/management as positive changes. The proposed rule changes do not require additional fees. Additionally, no interested party submitted additional information regarding the economic impact.
