PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The Suwannee River Water Management District (District) gives notice that it is initiating rulemaking to amend Rule 40B-8.021, F.A.C., to add definitions to aid in the implementation of minimum flows and minimum water levels for the Steinhatchee River and associated priority springs; and revise existing definitions to provide for rule clarity.

SUMMARY: Minimum Flows and Minimum Water Levels definitions

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

RULE TITLE: Minimum Flows and Minimum Water Levels for the Steinhatchee River and Steinhatchee River Priority Springs

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The Suwannee River Water Management District (District) gives notice that it is initiating rulemaking to develop rule 40B-8.101 for the purpose of implementing new minimum flows and minimum water levels for the Steinhatchee River and associated priority springs. The effect of the rule will be to provide protection for this area from significant harm resulting from consumptive uses of ground and surface water.

SUMMARY: Minimum flows and minimum water levels for the Steinhatchee River and associated priority springs, in accordance with Rule 62-40.473, F.A.C., and Sections 373.042 and 373.0421, F.S.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE PROPOSED RULE IS:

40B-8.101 Minimum Flows and Minimum Water Levels for the Steinhatchee River and Steinhatchee River Priority Springs.

The Governing Board hereby establishes the following minimum flows. The Governing Board finds that the following minimum flows are the limit at which further withdrawals would be significantly harmful to the water resources or ecology.

(1) The minimum surface water flow for the Steinhatchee River occurs when the cumulative change in flow at the Steinhatchee River Near Cross City, FL gage is greater than 2.07 cubic feet per second (cfs) from a flow that has been unchanged by groundwater withdrawals, surface water withdrawals, or a combination of both.

(2) The minimum surface water flows for the Steinhatchee River priority springs are established as the following cumulative percent reductions from the median flow of such springs measured at the spring vent or as close thereto as reasonably possible:

- (a) TAY76992: 11.5 percent;
- (b) Steinhatchee Rise: 11.5 percent.

(3) In addition to the criterion set forth in section 40B-8.101(1), F.A.C., a cumulative surface water flow reduction of 11.5 percent of the prior day's flow at the Steinhatchee River Near Cross City, FL gage when flow is greater than 8.70 cfs and less than or equal to 858 cfs, or a cumulative reduction in flow of 98.7 cfs when flow is greater than 858 cfs and less than or equal to 1,790 cfs, or a cumulative reduction in flow of 5.5 percent when flow is greater than 1,790 cfs does not result in significant harm. For the purposes of this section, the "prior day's average flow" will be the daily mean discharge in cfs for the previous calendar day measured at the Steinhatchee River Near Cross City, FL gage.

RULE NO.: 12AER19-03 RULE TITLE: Farming Materials Damaged by Hurricane Michael

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: Sections 20 and 21, Chapter 2019-42, L.O.F., provide a refund of sales tax paid on fencing materials and building materials that have been used or will be used to repair or replace fences or nonresidential farm buildings damaged by Hurricane Michael. This requires the creation of a form to be used by taxpayers seeking a refund.

Sections 20 and 21, Chapter 2019-42, L.O.F., authorize the Department of Revenue, and all conditions are deemed met, to adopt emergency rules pursuant to s. 120.54(4), Florida

Statutes, for the purpose of administering the refund provisions. Given the application period set out in the law, an emergency rule is the most appropriate and expedient means to provide taxpayers with the necessary refund application. This emergency rule incorporates, by reference, Form DR-26S-HAG, Application for Refund - Certain Farming Materials Damaged by Hurricane Michael, effective June 2019.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: The Legislature expressly authorized in Sections 20 and 22, Chapter 2019-42, L.O.F., the promulgation of an emergency rule by the Department to provide forms and instructions to seek a refund of tax paid on qualifying purchases. The promulgation of this emergency rule, incorporating by reference the form used to apply for the refund, ensures that the public is notified by the most appropriate and expedient means regarding the process to elect to use this reporting method.

SUMMARY: Emergency Rule 12AER19-03 incorporates, by reference, Form DR-26S-HAG, Application for Refund - Certain Farming Materials Damaged by Hurricane Michael, to allow taxpayers to seek a refund of tax on qualifying purchases, as provided by law.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

12AER19-03 Farming Materials Damaged by Hurricane Michael.

(1) Definitions. For purpose of this rule, the following terms mean:

(a) "Building materials" means tangible personal property that becomes a component part of a nonresidential farm building.

(b) "Exemption period" means the period from October 10, 2018, through June 30, 2019.

(b) "Nonresidential farm building" has the same meaning as provided in s. 604.50, F.S.

(2) The purchase of fencing materials used to replace or repair farm fences on land classified as agricultural under s. 193.461, F.S., is exempt from the tax imposed under chapter 212, F.S., during the exemption period if the fencing materials will be or were used to replace or repair fences that were damaged as a direct result of the impact of Hurricane Michael.

(3) Building materials used to replace or repair a nonresidential farm building damaged as a direct result of the impact of Hurricane Michael and purchased during the exemption period are exempt from the tax imposed under chapter 212, F.S.

(4) Application for Refund.

(a) To receive a refund, the owner of the fencing materials or the real property into which the fencing materials were incorporated or the owner of the building materials or the real property into which the building materials will be or were incorporated must submit Form DR-26S-HAG, Application for Refund – Certain Farming Materials Damaged by Hurricane Michael, effective June 2019 (hereby incorporated by reference).

(b) Owners must apply for a refund by December 31, 2019.

(c) Form DR-26S-HAG is available, without cost, by one or more of the following methods: 1) downloading the form from the Department's website at www.floridarevenue.com/forms; or, 2) calling the Department at 850-488-6800 Monday through Friday (excluding holidays); or, 3) visiting any local Department of Revenue Service Center or, 4) writing the Florida Department of Revenue, Taxpayer Services, Mail Stop 3-2000, 5050 West Tennessee Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0112. Persons with hearing or speech impairments may call the Florida Relay Service at 1-800-955-8770 (Voice) and 1-800-955-8771 (TTY).
