#### 64B7-28.0035 Designated Establishment Managers.

- (1) The Designated Establishment Manager (DEM) must practice at the establishment and responsible for ensuring that they are in compliance with the law, Chapters 456 and 480, F.S., and Rules 64B7, F.A.C.
- (2) If a therapist whishes to serve as the DEM at more than two establishments, they must seek approval from the Board and provide written explanation of how they will practice at the different locations and how they will ensure that all of the establishments are in compline with laws and rules.
- (3) A therapist serving as DEM of an establishment shall ensure that establishment is operating in compliance with the laws and rules governing the practice of massage therapy, including;
- (a) Ensuring that massage therapist, employed by the establishment are duly licensed, current and active, and that the establishment's license is current and active;
- (b) Ensuring that the establishment remains in compliance with Section 480.0535(2)(a)2, F.S., concerning documentation required while working in an establishment;

- (c) Reporting policies or practices of the establishment which limit the ability of a massge therapist to comply with Section 480.0535(1), F.S., by restricting access to valid government identification;
- (d) Reporting possible violations of Section 480.0485, F.S., and/or Rule 64B7-26.010, F.A.C., related to sexual misconduct to the Board within three days;
- (e) Complying with the provisions of Sections 480.043, and 456.034, F.S., regarding human trafficking, including ensurring that all employees are aware of the establishment's procedure for reporting suspected human trafficking; and
- (f) Practicing and ensuring the establishment practices in a manner consistent with law and rules, preventing discipline under the provisions of Section 480.041(1), F.S., and ensuring the Board is notified within ten days that the DEM is no longer serving as the establishment's desinated establishment manager.

Proposed amendment to Rule 68A-12.007, F.A.C. has been changed to include the following amended subparagraph:

68A-12.007 Hunting Dogs; Molesting Game in Closed Season; Training; Field Trials; Prohibited for Certain Hunting.

(1) All dogs used for taking or attempting to take, trailing, pursuing, or molesting wildlife shall wear a collar or tag which shall legibly display the name and address of the owner of the dog. No person shall use any dog to take or attempt to take, trail, pursue or molest wildlife unless such dog is wearing a collar or tag displaying the information required above. Removing, tampering, or otherwise interfering with any collar or tag

(including remote tracking and behavior correction devices) of a dog used for hunting without the owner's permission is prohibited.

(a) All dogs not under physical restraint that are used for pursuing deer, wild hog, fox, or coyote must be equipped and monitored with devices that allow remote tracking and behavior correction, except dogs used to pursue wild hog, fox or coyote during sanctioned mounted field trial events. The device(s) must be attached by a collar or similar means and must be used to deter dog egress from authorized areas or ingress into unauthorized areas. The remote tracking device(s) must include Global Positioning System (GPS) or telemetry tracking and the behavior correction device(s) must be designed to remotely correct dog behavior through auditory or physical stimulation. Effective Dates: The remote tracking device requirement in this paragraph shall not take effect until July 1, 2021 and the behavior correction device requirement in this paragraph shall not take effect until July 1, 2022.

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: A public health emergency and state of emergency have been ordered or declared by the Governor in Executive Orders No. 20-51 and 20-52 for the entire state in response to the COVID-19 virus. These and other orders and guidance limit person-to-person contact in various ways to prevent the spread of the virus, which makes it more difficult for candidates to collect and submit the necessary items to qualify for ballot placement pursuant to section 99.061, Fla. Stat., and Rule 1S-2.0001, F.A.C.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: The Division has received comments and concerns from candidates currently seeking to qualify for ballot placement. The state of emergency, orders, and guidance are quickly evolving over time. Permitting circulation and submission of qualifying items by means other than personal contact prevents spread of the virus, while otherwise maintaining the qualifying process for candidates and supporting the state's important interests in the process as well. The Division of Elections is aware of the rulemaking procedures prescribed by Section 120.54, Florida Statutes, but due to the immediate and evolving nature of the state of

emergency, regular rulemaking is too lengthy in both adoption and effect. Candidate qualifying is April 20-24 and June 8-12, with respective and additional 14-day pre-submission periods. SUMMARY: Removes the requirement that the qualifying items be "original[s] and signatures thereon…be made in ink" so that these items can be collected, notarized, and submitted with limited person-to-person contact. Notary statements on required forms will be revised accordingly.

1S-2.0001 Designation of Division of Elections as Filing Office for Department of State; Requirements for Candidate Qualifying Papers; Withdrawal of Candidacy.

- (1) Designation of Division of Elections as a filing office.
- (a) The Department of State has designated the Division of Elections as the filing or qualifying office for candidates seeking to qualify for nomination or election to any federal, state, legislative, multicounty or judicial office with the exception of county court judge. Candidates for the office of county court judge shall qualify with the supervisor of elections for that county. The Division of Elections' official address is: ElecRecords@dos.myflorida.com; or, and official physical location is—Room 316, R.A. Gray Building, 500 South Bronough Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0250.
- (b) All qualifying items required to be filed with the Department of State as the office where the candidate is required to qualify shall be filed with the Division of Elections.
  - (2) Filing Timeline.
- (a) Timely filing is of the essence in qualifying as a candidate. In order to be deemed timely filed with the qualifying office, qualifying items must actually be present at the qualifying office's official address physical location by the close of the qualifying period. Candidates who file with the Division of Elections are advised that the U.S. Postal Service does not deliver mail directly to the Division and the U.S. Postal Service's designated hours for mail pick up by the Division do not correspond to the qualifying deadline. While delivery of qualifying items to a qualifying office may occur by any means, to ensure that the items are timely submitted, it is advisable for candidates or someone on their behalf to email hand deliver directly to the Division or use a delivery service that timely delivers directly to the qualifying office.
- (b) Each supervisor of elections and other qualifying officer shall designate one or more specific official physical locations and email address that will serve as a qualifying office and publish the address of each office on the qualifying officer's website.

- (c) Qualifying items shall be deemed filed with the qualifying office upon the date of actual receipt by the qualifying office, except for those qualifying items accepted and held during the 14-day period before the beginning of the qualifying period pursuant to sections 99.061(8) and 105.031(6), F.S. The qualifying items that are received and held during the 14-day period before the beginning of the qualifying period shall not be deemed filed until the beginning of the qualifying period.
  - (3) Qualifying items.
- (a) <u>If submitted by email, qualifying items must be attached in .pdf format.</u> <u>Except as noted herein, any qualifying item filed with a qualifying office must be an original and signatures thereon must be made in ink.</u>
- (b) Any qualifying check cannot be submitted by email and must be submitted by U.S. Mail or delivery service.—A facsimile, email, photocopy, scanned copy or any type of electronically transmitted document shall not be accepted as a qualifying item, except a candidate who has filed a current full and public disclosure or statement of financial interests with the Florida Commission on Ethics or the Supervisor of Elections prior to qualifying for office may file a copy of that disclosure at the time of qualifying. A current full and public disclosure or statement of financial interests is one that covers the immediately preceding calendar or tax year and is on the applicable Florida Commission on Ethics' form for that year. For example, for a qualifying period that occurs in 2018, the current full and public disclosure or statement of financial interests form would be one that covers the 2017 calendar or tax <del>year.</del>

Stat., and Rule 1S-2.045, F.A.C.

The state of emergency, orders, and guidance are quickly evolving over time. 53ER20-24 Game Number 1453, "BREAK THE BANK BINGO."

- (1) Name of Game. Game Number 1453, "BREAK THE BANK BINGO."
- (2) Game Number 1453, "BREAK THE BANK BINGO" is a Scratch-Off lottery game (also known as an instant lottery game).
- (3) Price. BREAK THE BANK BINGO lottery tickets sell for \$5.00 per play.
- (4) Game Description. BREAK THE BANK BINGO lottery tickets shall have a series of numbers in machine readable code (or bar code) on the back of the ticket, along with a validation number under the latex area on the ticket. To be a valid winning BREAK THE BANK BINGO lottery ticket, the ticket must meet the applicable requirements of Rule 53ER17-54, Payment of Prizes, Florida Administrative Code.
  - (5) The CALLER'S CARD play symbols are as follows:
  - (6) The player's cards play symbols are as follows:

FREE

(7) The legend is as follows:

CALLER'S CARD

- (8) How to Play and Determination of Prizewinners.
- (a) There are eight player's cards labeled CARD 1, CARD 2, CARD 3, CARD 4, CARD 5, CARD 6, CARD 7 and CARD 8, and one CALLER'S CARD on each BREAK THE BANK BINGO lottery ticket. Each player's card is played separately.

A FREE space will appear in the center of each player's card.

A FREE space can substitute as a number in a pattern of which it is a part.

(b) Players scratch the CALLER'S CARD and all numbers on CARDS 1 through 8 that match the numbers on the CALLER'S CARD. A ticket whose numbers on one of the player's cards match the CALLER'S CARD numbers in one of the following patterns shall entitle the prizewinner to the prize shown for that pattern on that card:

- 1. Horizontal line of five numbers (or four numbers and one space);
- 2. Vertical line of five numbers (or four numbers and one space);
  - 3. Diagonal line of four numbers and one FREE space;
- 4. Four corners (consisting of four numbers, one in each corner); or
- 5. An "X" pattern, (two crossing diagonal lines consisting of eight numbers and the FREE space).
- (c) A symbol on a ticket is a "free" spot and can substitute as a number. If a symbol completes a winning line pattern that is described in subparagraphs (8)(b) 1. through 3. above, the prizewinner shall be entitled to five times the "Line" prize for that game card.
- (9) Players may win on one or more player's cards per ticket; however, players may not win more than one prize on each player's card.
- (10) The prizes are: \$5, \$10, \$15, \$20, \$25, \$30, \$40, \$50, \$75, \$100, \$200, \$500, \$1,000, \$10,000, \$50,000, and \$500,000.
