PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this rulemaking is to amend the rule to accommodate use of the Fresh From Florida brand identifiers on hemp grown in Florida and to create a new identifier indicating when the commodity is grown, processed and manufactured in Florida.

SUBJECT AREA TO BE ADDRESSED: Rules continue to be promulgated in this department to allow for hemp to be grown in Florida, a program authorized by Section 581.217, F.S. The Florida Agriculture Promotional Campaign (FAPC) creates provisions for the agricultural industry to use Fresh From Florida brand identifiers on packaging and advertising to promote Florida-grown commodities.

15A-10.014 Cost Standards and Allocations

The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles hereby gives notice: On April 22, 2020, the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles issued a final order in response to a petition for rule variance or waiver filed by West Central Florida Driver Improvement, Inc. The petition, which was received by the Department on March 23, 2020, and noticed in Volume 46, Number 68, of the Florida Administrative Register on April 7, 2020, requested variance from or waiver of paragraph 15A-10.014(2)(d), Florida Administrative Code. Paragraph 15A-10.014(2)(d) prohibits contributions to retirement by a DUI program in excess of the percentage of gross compensation contributed by the employer of members of the Regular Class of the Florida Retirement System pursuant to section 121.071, Florida Statutes. The Department found that the petition demonstrated that the purpose of the underlying statute will be or has been achieved by other means and that strict application of paragraph 15A-10.014(2)(d) would create a substantial hardship for the petitioner or would otherwise violate principles of fairness.

The Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Hotels and Restaurants hereby gives notice: On April 22, 2020 the Division of Hotels and Restaurants received a Petition for an Emergency Variance for paragraph 61C-1.004(1)(a), Florida Administrative Code and Paragraph 5-202.11(A), 2017 FDA Food Code; Paragraph 4-301.11(A) and Paragraph 4-301.12(A), 2017 FDA Food Code and subsection 61C-4.010(5), Florida Administrative Code from ACA & FRUITS LLC, located in Miami. The above referenced F.A.C. addresses the requirement that each establishment have an approved plumbing system installed to

transport potable water and wastewater; the requirement that dishwashing facilities for manually washing, rinsing and sanitizing equipment and utensils are provided and the requirement that adequate cold food storage is provided. They are requesting to utilize holding tanks to provide potable water and to collect wastewater at the handwash sink; and to use the ware washing facilities and cold food storage located on the premises of a nearby business under a different ownership.

The Petition for this variance was published in Vol. 46/80 on April 23, 2020. The Order for this Petition was signed and approved on May 12, 2020. After a complete review of the variance request, the Division finds that the application of this Rule will create a financial hardship to the food service establishment. Furthermore, the Division finds that the Petitioner meets the burden of demonstrating that the underlying statute has been achieved by the Petitioner ensuring the wastewater holding tank for the handwash sink is emptied at a frequency as to not create a sanitary nuisance; and potable water provided must come from an approved source and be protected from contamination during handling. The Petitioner shall also ensure that the handwash sinks are provided with hot and cold running water under pressure, soap, an approved hand drying device and a handwashing sign. As well as, ensuring the warewashing facilities and the walk in cooler/freezer located on the premises of CENTRAL FARE LLC (file: 300515), is maintained in a clean and sanitary manner and is provided with hot and cold running water under pressure and available to employees of ACA & FRUITS LLC (file: 325354) during the hours of operation: Monday-Friday 8am-6pm. If the ownership of ACA & FRUITS LLC (file: 325354) and/or CENTRAL FARE LLC (file: 300515) changes, a signed agreement for use of the warewashing is required immediately

The Department of Economic Opportunity (“Department”) hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to subsections 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by Monroe County, Florida, Ordinance No. 006-2020 (the “Ordinance”).

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. The Florida Keys Area is designated by Section 380.0552, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. Monroe county is a local government within the Florida Keys Area.
2. The Ordinance was adopted by Monroe County on January 22, 2020, and rendered to the Department on March 13, 2020.
3. The Ordinance amends Section 138-24(a), Residential ROGO Allocations, of Monroe County’s Land Development Code to ensure consistency with the Comprehensive Plan by extending the ROGO allocation timeframe until July 12, 2026.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. *See* §§ 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Fla Stat.
5. “Land development regulations” include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. § 380.031(8), Fla. Stat. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.
6. The Ordinance is consistent with the Monroe County Comprehensive Plan generally, as required by subsection

163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, and specifically, with Policy 101.3.2

7. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for that area. § 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Fla Stat. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in subsection 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes.

8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development as a whole, and specifically complies with the following:

- (a) Strengthening local government capabilities for managing land use and development so that local government is able to achieve these objectives without continuing the area of critical state concern designation.
- (d) Ensuring the maximum well-being of the Florida Keys and its citizens through sound economic development.
- (n) Protecting the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Florida Keys and maintain the Florida Keys as a unique Florida resource.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that Monroe county Ordinance No. 006-2020 is consistent with the Monroe County Comprehensive Plan and Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby **APPROVED**.

The Department of Economic Opportunity (“Department”) hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to subsections 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by Monroe County, Florida, Ordinance No. 010-2020 (the “Ordinance”).

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. The Florida Keys Area is designated by Section 380.0552, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. Monroe county is a local government within the Florida Keys Area.
2. The Ordinance was adopted by Monroe County on February 19, 2020, and rendered to the Department on March 13, 2020.
3. The Ordinance amends Section 101-1 of Monroe County’s Land Development Code to create a definition for public infrastructure and utilities and amends Chapter 130, Land Use Districts, to amend the list of permitted and conditional uses within sections 130-74 through 130-103 to include public infrastructure and utilities as an authorized use.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. *See* §§ 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Fla Stat.

5. “Land development regulations” include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. § 380.031(8), Fla. Stat. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

6. The Ordinance is consistent with the Monroe County Comprehensive Plan generally, as required by subsection 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, and specifically, with Objective 101.1, Objective 101.5, and Objective 101.12.

7. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for that area. § 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Fla Stat. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in Section 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes.

8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development as a whole, and specifically complies with the following:

- (a) Strengthening local government capabilities for managing land use and development so that local government is able to achieve these objectives without continuing the area of critical state concern designation.
- (d) Ensuring the maximum well-being of the Florida Keys and its citizens through sound economic development.
- (n) Protecting the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Florida Keys and maintain the Florida Keys as a unique Florida resource.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that Monroe county Ordinance No. 010-2020 is consistent with the Monroe County Comprehensive Plan and Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby **APPROVED**.
