62-41.302 Central Florida Water Initiative Area, Supplemental Applicant’s Handbook

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The Department intends to enter rule development to amend rule 62-41.302(1), F.A.C., to update the Central Florida Water Initiative (CFWI) Area Supplemental Applicant’s Handbook to implement s. 3, ch. 2021-153, Laws of Florida, which amends section 373.0465(2)(d), F.S., to require the Department to adopt a drought allocation for supplemental irrigation for agricultural uses and a process for the applicable water management district implementing the rules to annually examine an agricultural user’s 5-year moving average supplemental irrigation water use. The rule will address agricultural users in the “Central Florida Water Initiative Area”, which includes all of Orange, Osceola, Polk, and Seminole Counties, and southern Lake County.

SUBJECT AREA TO BE ADDRESSED: These rule amendments will apply only to consumptive use permits issued to agricultural users in the CFWI Area, and will address an agricultural user’s annual supplemental irrigation allocation based on a 2-in-10-year rainfall condition, including consumptive use permit conditioning and annual examinations of an agricultural user’s 5-year moving average water use against permitted allocation.

The continuation of funding is dependent upon maintaining eligibility requirements during the fiscal year.

The Department of Education will provide school districts and virtual charter schools annually with a list of providers approved to offer full and part-time virtual instruction programs under this section of law.

(2)(a) Application Form. Form VSP-02, Virtual Instruction Program Application for Provider Approval (<https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-09624>), for becoming an approved provider for the Virtual Instruction Program, will be used for those virtual education providers applying for approved status from the Department of Education. Form VSP-02 is hereby incorporated by reference and made a part of this rule to become effective September 2021 ~~August 2018~~.

(b) Application Form. Form VSP-02R, Virtual Instruction Program Application for Provider Renewal (<http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-09625>), for renewing an approved provider for the Virtual Instruction Program, will be used for those virtual education providers applying for renewal status from the Department of Education. board rule for purpose of calculating school grades, in accordance with Section 1008.34, F.S. ~~Upon an applicant's request~~ The Department of Education shall conditionally approve a provider who is otherwise qualified but without sufficient prior, successful experience offering online courses, to offer courses measured by statewide assessments under Section 1008.22, F.S., with a learning gains component, end-of-course assessments, or Advanced Placement (AP) examinations. Conditional approval shall be valid for one (1) school year only and, based on the provider's subsequent experience in offering the courses under this paragraph, the Department shall determine whether to grant final approval to offer a virtual instruction program under the criteria for successful experience as outlined in this paragraph.

2. Renewal. Renewal applicants with a school grade in the most recent grades release by the Department of Education meet the prior successful experience criteria unless they are disqualified pursuant to Section 1002.45(8), F.S. Pursuant to Section 1002.45(8), F. S., a provider who was disqualified under this section shall be ineligible for approval for one (1) year. Thereafter, the provider must submit an application for initial approval. Renewal applicants without a school grade must meet the criteria for prior successful experience required for initial approval.

(b) In accordance with Section 1002.45(2)(a)6., F.S., the applicant must be accredited by at least one of the following K-12 regional accrediting agencies, their successors or assigns: Cognia (AdvancED), Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Elementary School and Secondary Schools, New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Northwest Accreditation Commission, or Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

(c) Pursuant to Section 1002.45(2)(a)7., F.S., the curriculum plan must include evidence:

1. That the applicant's online program and courses meet the standards of the National Standards for Quality Online Programs and Courses, formerly provided by the International Standards of Quality for Online Courses; ~~International Association of K12 Online Learning~~
