PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Amended to conform to new statutory language regarding transitions to adulthood in sections 39.6035, 409.14515, 39.701, and 414.56, F.S.

SUMMARY: The amendments include the following: (1) specifies that the CBC must provide a list of age appropriate activities to assist with life skills, (2) the CBC must make youth aware of available independent living services, community resources and how to apply for services, (3) indicates when the transition plan shall be filed, (4) sets forth when the CBC shall request the removal of the disability of nonage and assist the youth in opening a bank account, (5) there will be annual contact with the youth to inform them of the purpose of the Office of Continuing Care, the types of support the office provides and how to contact the office, and (6) addresses allowance's for the youth in out of home licensed care.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

65C-28.009 Transition to Adulthood.

- (1) Beginning at age 13, children and young adults in outof-home care require additional support and coordination necessary to develop the skills to successfully transition to adulthood. The additional supports and coordination are typically provided through independent living services programs; however, most life skills will be developed through normal day to day activities in the children and young adults natural living environments.
 - (a) through (b) No change.
- (c) Community-based care lead agencies (CBCs) must ensure children and young adults are assessed and provided with age or developmentally appropriate training opportunities to develop independent living skills. The CBCs shall provide a list of age-appropriate activities and responsibilities to the child

and caregiver to assist with specific life skills. For older youth, the CBCs must make the youth aware of available independent living services, community resources, and how to apply for the services.

- (d) Both independent living informal and formal needs assessments of life skill competency must be completed to determine the child's or young adult's strengths and needs.
- 1. Informal assessments shall be conducted monthly during routine home visits to evaluate progress of the skills developed based on the child's or young adult's participation in age-appropriate life activities as defined in sections 39.4091 and 409.145, F.S. Informal assessments shall be documented on the "Life Skills Progress Documentation Log," CF-FSP 5444, Apr 2019, incorporated by reference and available at http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10803, and shall be shared with caregivers for independent living skills development.
 - 2. through 4. No change.
- 5. Formal and informal assessments shall be uploaded into the <u>child welfare information system</u>. Florida Safe Families Network (FSFN.)
- (2) Beginning at age 14, children and young adults in outof-home care require an evaluation of their consumer credit history annually to check for accuracy.
 - (a) through (c) No change.
- (d) Credit reports shall be uploaded into <u>the child welfare</u> information system FSFN.

- (5) Beginning at age 16, children shall be assisted with developing a transition plan which is to be filed with the court at the <u>16 and</u> 17-year-old's judicial review hearing required by section 39.701(3), F.S. <u>and finalized prior to the youth's 18th birthday</u>.
 - (a) through (b) No change.
- (6) Beginning at age 17, children are to be provided with the records and resources listed in subparagraphs 39.701(3)(b)1.-15. 39.701(3)(a)1.-15., F.S. A social study report that supports the exchange of the required records and resources must be filed with the court.
- (7) At age 17, the CBC shall request the removal of the disability of nonage during the Judicial Review hearing pursuant to section 39.701(3), F.S., for youth who are eligible to open a bank account. Upon receipt of the judicial review order, the CBC and the caregiver shall assist the youth in opening a bank account and provide financial literacy, such as budgeting and managing the bank account.
- (8) The young adults who have aged out of care shall be informed annually until the age of 23 of the Office of Continuing Care, the purpose of the office, the type of support the office provides, and how to contact the office, pursuant to section 414.56, F.S., and the aftercare services. During the

- annual contact, the CBC staff shall determine if the young adult is potentially eligible for Extended Foster Care or Postsecondary Educational Services and Support and inform the young adult of the options for entering the programs.
- (9) Youth in out of home licensed care shall be provided the knowledge to learn the value and use of money through an allowance and opportunities for spending and saving. The concept of earning money and income should also be discussed with the youth.
- (a) To determine if a youth is of sufficient age and understanding to manage their own allowances, CBCs shall use information gathered from any informal or formal life skills assessments and any multidisciplinary team (MDT) or transition staffing that was held for the youth.
- (b) Youth who have been determined to be of sufficient age and intellectual ability to manage their allowance shall have the following factors addressed in their "Placement Transition Plan", CF-FSP 5466, (insert date), incorporated by reference and available at http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-XXX and under the financial plan section in the independent living "My Pathways to Success Plan", CF-FSP 5425, (insert date), incorporated by reference and available at http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-XXX:
 - 1. The youth's current placement.
 - 2 The caregiver responsible for providing the allowance.
- 3. The frequency and the amount of the allowance provided to the youth
- 4. Expiration of allowances if youth transition to a relative or non-relative placement or is reunified.
- 5. Collaboration between the caregiver and the youth in developing independent living skills to address finance and budgeting to include, but not limited to:
 - a. Reviewing the monthly balance with the youth.
 - b. Discussion on spending and saving the allowance.
- c. Determining who is responsible for maintaining the youth's allowance.
- (c) The caregiver and the CBC shall ensure there is a designated individual responsible for maintaining the allowance for youth who are unable to manage their allowance.
 - (d) Allowance.
 - 1. Allowance shall be provided at least monthly.
- <u>2. Allowance shall not be tied to behavior or completion of chores.</u>
- 3. Children shall not be expected to use their allowance to purchase personal hygiene items, school supplies, clothing, or other necessities.
 - 4. Allowance shall not be withheld as punishment.
- (10)(7) Compliance with subsections (1)(2) through (8)(6) shall be documented in the child welfare information system FSFN.

In addition to any other discipline imposed, the Department, pursuant to Section 456.072(4), F.S., shall assess the costs related to the investigation and prosecution of a case. If the violation is for fraud or making false or fraudulent representation, the Department shall impose a fine of \$10,000 per count or offense.
 - (a) through (j) no change.
- (k) Section 490.009(1)(k) or 456.072(1)(v)(u), F.S.: committing any act upon a patient or client which would constitute sexual battery or which would constitute sexual misconduct as provided in Section 490.0111 or 456.063, F.S. a fine of \$7,000, a PRN evaluation and probation up to suspension followed by probation with a PRN evaluation. After the first offense, a fine of \$7,000 up to \$10,000 and PRN evaluation and suspension followed by probation, or in the alternative, revocation. "Sexual misconduct" means, to the extent applicable, the sexual misconduct defined by Florida

Administrative Code Rule 64B19-16.003 (amended 05-14-2001), which is incorporated by reference and available at http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-XXXX.

SUMMARY OF THE RULE: This emergency rule sets forth the provisions for the HOLIDAY CASH BONUS PLAY PROMOTION.

THE FULL TEXT OF THIS EMERGENCY RULE IS:

53ER22-62 HOLIDAY CASH BONUS PLAY PROMOTION.

(1) Beginning October 31, 2022 and ending December 31, 2022 ("Promotion Period"), the Florida Lottery will conduct the Holiday Cash Bonus Play Promotion ("Promotion"). Players who purchase Game Number 5044, Florida 10X The Cash; Game Number 5045, Florida 20X The Cash; Game Number 5046, Florida 50X The Cash; Game Number 5047, Florida 100X The Cash; and Game Number 5048, Florida 300X The Cash Scratch-Off tickets and CASH POPTM Draw game tickets during the Promotion Period can earn entries into a Promotion Drawing for a chance to win a prize of \$1,000; \$5,000; or \$20,000. All CASH POP tickets and non-winning tickets of the afore-listed Florida X The Cash Scratch-Off games [collectively "Eligible" ticket(s)] purchased during the Promotion Period may be entered into a promotional drawing; winning Florida X The Cash Scratch-Off tickets cannot be entered.

(2) How to Enter.

(a) To enter an Eligible ticket into a Promotion Drawing, a player may use the Florida Lottery's website at flalottery.com or use the Florida Lottery's Mobile Convenience App ("App").

1. Website. On the home page of the Florida Lottery's website, players are to click on the PROMOTIONS tab, select

the Holiday Cash Bonus Play Promotion and follow the directions. Players will be prompted to log-in or register. Players will manually enter the 24-digit ticket number shown on Eligible Florida X The Cash tickets or the 19-digit ticket number on CASH POP tickets on the ticket entry page to collect entries as described in subsection (3), below.

- 2. App. On the App, players navigate to the Promotions section of the app, select the Holiday Cash Bonus Play Promotion, and follow the directions. A Promotions button is located on the main menu and on the bottom navigation bar. Players will be prompted to log-in or register if the app does not recognize them as already logged into the Promotions section. Players may scan the barcode on the bottom of a ticket or may manually enter the 24-digit ticket number (Eligible Florida X The Cash tickets) or 19-digit ticket number (CASH POP tickets) on the ticket entry page to collect entries as described in subsection (3), below.
- 3. Deleted Accounts. If a player deletes his/her account, whether through the App or on the Florida Lottery's website, all account data, including ticket entries, associated with the email address used to register his/her account will also be deleted. Any entries earned, as described in subsection (3), below, will not be entered into a drawing. A player's account cannot be reactivated using the email associated with the deactivated account. Should a player establish a new account utilizing a different email address, account data, including ticket entries, cannot be transferred to the newly established account. Tickets entered under the prior account cannot be reentered utilizing the newly created account.
- 4. Regardless of whether a player chooses to participate in the Promotion by using the web browser or the App, the following provisions shall apply:
- a. the player must use the same account login information to enter tickets;
- b. the player will only be required to register one time; and c. the player's entry history will be cumulative among the entry platforms.
- (b) Any attempt by a player to use more than one account by using multiple or different email addresses, identities, registrations, logins, or any other methods will subject the player and any associated entries to disqualification. In the event a player wins a prize, the name a player uses to register must match the name shown on his/her identification used to make a claim, except for a person who has made a legal name change. A person who has made a legal name change must provide a copy of a marriage certificate/judgment/court order, as applicable, as proof of a differing name. Fictitious names and business names will not be accepted and shall subject the player and any associated entries to disqualification.
- (c) The odds of winning depend on the number of entries in a drawing. All entries are subject to validation by the Florida

Lottery and will be disqualified if eligibility requirements are not met.

- (d) Lottery tickets should not be mailed to the Lottery for entry into a drawing. Tickets received in the mail by the Florida Lottery for entry into the Promotion will not be entered into a drawing and will not be returned.
 - (3) How to Earn Entries into the Promotion.
- (a) To earn entries into a Promotion Drawing, a player may enter ticket numbers by scanning the barcode on the bottom of an Eligible ticket using his or her mobile device or by manually entering the 24-digit ticket number (Eligible Florida X The Cash tickets) or the 19-digit number (CASH POP tickets) on the website or the Mobile App. A player may earn multiple entries during an entry period; however, a player can only win one Promotion Drawing prize per entry. A player may enter a maximum of 200 tickets per day. Each ticket number can only be entered one time and cannot be entered again for another drawing. Training tickets will not be accepted, and tickets with invalid ticket numbers will be disqualified. The hours for ticket entry are between 6:00 a.m. ET and 12:00 midnight ET seven days a week during the Promotion Period.

(b) Number of Entries Received. For each Eligible ticket, a player will receive the number of entries as set forth in the table below:

(c) Bonus Drawing Entries/Coupons for Cash Prizes.

1. FLORIDA X THE CASH Scratch-Off games. In addition to the entries earned, as set forth in the table in paragraph (3)(b), above, a player who enters a complete family of non-winning FLORIDA X THE CASH tickets (Game Number 5044, Florida 10X The Cash; Game Number 5045, Florida 20X The Cash; Game Number 5046, Florida 50X The Cash; Game Number 5047, Florida 100X The Cash; and Game Number 5048, Florida 300X The Cash) will have a chance to receive a coupon for a \$200 cash prize.

Once an Eligible ticket is either scanned or manually entered, four (4) game cards will appear on the screen. Each card has six (6) spaces; one free space and one space for each of Game Number 5044, Florida 10X The Cash; Game Number 5045, Florida 20X The Cash; Game Number 5046, Florida 50X The Cash; Game Number 5047, Florida 100X The Cash; and Game Number 5048, Florida 300X The Cash. Once a card has all six (6) symbols (free space and one for each of the Florida X The Cash games), a coupon for a \$200 cash prize may be awarded. Once a card has all six spots filled, the card will clear and be available for additional ticket entry symbols.

If a ticket is entered in excess of the number of spaces available on all four cards for a given game, the ticket will be discarded, will not be saved, and will not be entered onto a card once a card has been cleared. Once a card has been completed with all symbols, and if a coupon is not awarded, the player will receive five (5) additional entries into the next available Promotion drawing.

Example: This example assumes all game cards are empty. If one or more cards contain symbols, the number of available card entry spots will be reduced accordingly. A player enters five (5) 10X THE CASH ticket numbers. The player will earn one (1) (reference the table in paragraph (3)(b)) entry into a Promotion drawing for each of the five (5) tickets entered, for a total of five (5) drawing entries. For the purposes of a chance to obtain either a \$200 cash prize coupon or five (5) additional entries into the next available drawing, four of the tickets will cause one symbol to be entered onto each of the four (4) game cards, thereby filling all available 10X THE CASH spaces. (No additional 10X THE CASH tickets will be accepted until a card has been completely filled and cleared; though additional 10X THE CASH ticket entries will earn entries into a Promotion drawing, as set forth in the table in Paragraph (3)(b).) The fifth 10X THE CASH ticket entry will be discarded, not saved, and not entered onto another game card once a card is cleared. The same applies to each of the other Florida X THE CASH games.

- 2. CASH POP. A player who purchases a single CASH POP Draw game ticket during the Promotion Period for a purchase price of \$5 or greater will have a chance to receive a coupon for a \$50 cash prize.
- 3. Coupons will be randomly generated and issued to ticket purchasers who meet the criteria in subparagraphs (3)(c)1. and 2., above.
- 4. Coupons may be redeemed at any Lottery retailer or Lottery office, subject to hours of operation. The redemption deadline for all coupons is 11:59:59 p.m. (ET) on March 3, 2023. For any coupons not redeemed by the deadline set forth herein, a prize will not be awarded.
 - 5. Coupon totals are set forth in the table, below:

(4) Entry Periods and Drawings. The Florida Lottery will conduct three (3) drawings in the Promotion to select prizewinners. Prizewinners for each drawing will be randomly selected from entries submitted and received before midnight (ET) of a Drawing Entry Period end date, as identified in the table, below. Entries for one Drawing Entry Period are not carried over into a subsequent Drawing Entry Period. Prizewinners will be randomly selected using a certified random number generation process. The drawing shall be public, held in Tallahassee, Florida, and witnessed by an accountant employed by an independent certified public accounting firm. (a) The prizewinners in a Promotion Drawing will be announced and posted on flalottery.com on the "WINNERS ANNOUNCED" dates, set forth in the table above, or as soon thereafter as possible.

(b) In each Promotion Drawing, a total of 150 valid entries will be drawn by the Florida Lottery. Prizes will be awarded in the quantities set forth in the table in subsection (5), below, and awarded to players in the order in which they were drawn during each drawing. Remaining entries will be alternates and used in the order in which they were drawn and in the order of need to select alternate top, second, and third prizewinners in the event a top, second, or third prizewinner cannot be notified or fails to timely provide required claim documentation as set forth in subsection (7), below, or in the event an entry is disqualified. A player can only win one prize in a Promotion drawing per entry.

(6) Prizewinner Notification. The Florida Lottery will attempt to notify each prizewinner by telephone or email using the contact information provided in the prizewinner's registration data within one business day after the prizewinners are posted on the Florida Lottery's website. The Florida Lottery deems the prizewinner's registration data as the prizewinner's official contact information. Issuing an email or leaving a telephone message on voicemail, if available, shall constitute notification. The Florida Lottery will not attempt to further locate a prizewinner if attempts to reach the prizewinner by telephone or email are unsuccessful. If the Florida Lottery is unable to have contact by telephone or email with a prizewinner within ten calendar days of the date the prizewinners are posted on the Lottery's website, the prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will select an alternate prizewinner in accordance with subsection (4), above. If the Florida Lottery is unable to have contact by email or telephone with the alternate prizewinner within ten calendar days of the date of notification, the alternate prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will select the next alternate prizewinner. This process will continue until an alternate is contacted or the Florida Lottery has exhausted the list of alternates due to unsuccessful notification attempts or due to failure by a prizewinner or an alternate prizewinner to timely provide required claim documentation as set forth in subsection (7), below. The Florida Lottery is not responsible or liable for system failures of any sort or type, including, but not exclusively, computer failures, email service failures, telephone failures. If a prize cannot be awarded for any reason, the prize will not be awarded.

(7) How to Claim a Prize.

- (a) To claim a prize won in a Promotion drawing, a prizewinner must submit to the Florida Lottery a completed Winner Claim Form DOL-173-2, Revised 7/22, or Spanish Winner Claim Form DOL-173-2S, Revised 7/22, and a copy of acceptable identification as set forth in the Florida Lottery's rule governing payment of prizes. Forms DOL 173-2 and DOL 173-2S are hereby incorporated by reference and may be obtained at any Florida Lottery office or retailer, from the Florida Lottery's website at flalottery.com, or by writing to: Florida Lottery, Claims Processing, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4016.
- (b) A copy of the current prize payment rule can be obtained from the Florida Lottery, Office of the General Counsel, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32301.
- (c) The required documents must be received by the Florida Lottery no later than ten calendar days after the Florida Lottery has first notified the prizewinner by telephone (notification by telephone is deemed complete by leaving a voicemail message, if available) or email (issuing an email

- constitutes notification). If the Florida Lottery does not receive the required documents from a prizewinner by the tenth calendar day after notification, the prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will award the prize to an alternate prizewinner as described in subsection (4), above. The same timeframe for a prizewinner to return required documentation to the Florida Lottery shall apply to an alternate prizewinner.
- (8) Award of Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery's timely receipt of a prizewinner's required documentation, the Florida Lottery will award the prize for that prizewinner, subject to applicable Federal tax withholding and analysis for State-Owed Debt and Child Support Debt.
- (9) Analysis for State-Owed Debt and Child Support Debt. Prior to the award of all Promotion drawing cash prizes, a prizewinner will be analyzed for Florida state-owed debt and child support debt. If more than one prize is awarded to the prizewinner, a separate analysis shall occur prior to payment of each prize. If the prizewinner is identified as owing outstanding debt to any state agency or owes child support, the debt will be offset in accordance with section 24.115, Fla. Stat. If the debt is an amount less than the amount of the cash prize, the balance of the prize, less applicable income tax withholding on the full prize amount, and after the debt is offset shall be awarded. If the debt is an amount greater than any cash prize, the entire prize amount, after applicable income tax withholding on the full prize amount, will be applied to the outstanding debt.

(10) Taxes.

- (a) Except as specifically defined herein, all Federal, state, and/or local taxes and/or other costs and fees on all prizes will be the responsibility of the prizewinner.
- (b) For \$20,000 cash prizes won in the Promotion drawings, and pursuant to applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Service code, Federal income taxes will be withheld at a rate of twenty-four percent (24%) for a U. S. citizen or legal U. S. resident and at a rate of thirty percent (30%) for nonresident prizewinners. Regardless of prize amount, for all prizes won in a Promotion drawing, Federal income taxes will be withheld at a rate of thirty percent (30%) for nonresident prizewinners. The reporting and subsequent payment of any additional Federal, state, and/or local taxes and any other fees and costs shall be the responsibility of the prizewinner.

SUMMARY OF THE RULE: This emergency rule describes Game Number 5044, "FLORIDA 10X THE CASH," for which the Department of the Lottery will start selling tickets on a date to be determined by the Secretary of the Department. The rule sets forth the specifics of the game; determination of prizewinners; estimated odds of winning; value and number of prizes in the game.

THIS EMERGENCY RULE TAKES EFFECT IMMEDIATELY UPON BEING FILED WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE.

THE FULL TEXT OF THIS EMERGENCY RULE IS:

53ER22-63 Game Number 5044, FLORIDA 10X THE CASH.

- (1) Name of Game. Game Number 5044, FLORIDA 10X THE CASH.
- (2) Game Number 5044, FLORIDA 10X THE CASH is a Scratch-Off lottery game (also known as an instant lottery game).
- (3) Price. FLORIDA 10X THE CASH lottery tickets sell for \$1.00 per ticket.

(4) FLORIDA 10X THE CASH lottery tickets shall have a series of numbers in machine readable code (or bar code) on the back of the ticket, along with a validation number under the latex area on the ticket. To be a valid winning FLORIDA 10X THE CASH lottery ticket, the ticket must meet the applicable requirements of Rule 53ER22-54, *Payment of Prizes*, F.A.C.

(c) A player may win up to twenty-three (23) times on a ticket.

(11) \$2,000,000 Prize; Payment Options.

(a) A prizewinner of a \$2,000,000 prize may choose one of two payment options for receiving his or her prize. Payment options are One-Time Cash Payment or Annual Payments. At the time the \$2,000,000 prize is claimed, the terminal will produce a player claim instructions ticket. (b) A winner of a \$2,000,000 prize who elects the One-Time Cash Payment shall receive a single cash payment of \$1,390,000.00, less applicable federal income tax withholding.

(c) Annual Payments will be paid in twenty-five (25) equal annual installments. A prizewinner of a \$2,000,000 prize who elects the Annual Payment option, or has it applied, shall receive annual installments of \$80,000.00 per year, less applicable federal tax withholding.

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: The Florida Real Estate Commission ("FREC") is statutorily mandated to require specified Pre-licensure, Post-Licensure, School Instructor and Continuing Education ("CE") courses as prerequisites to initial licensure, licensure renewal and licensure reactivation of Real Estate Sales Agents, Real Estate Brokers, and Real Estate School Instructors. Pursuant to this authority, the FREC has promulgated rules setting forth the requirements for approval of Pre-licensure, Post-Licensure, Reactivation and CE courses. The rules establish different minimum criteria for in-person vs. online or distance learning courses which are submitted by providers approved/authorized the FREC to be offered as either in-person, live stream, hybrid or online/distance. If a course is approved as in-person, it cannot be offered via any other method of delivery (e.g. online, live stream, hybrid or distance learning methods), unless it is also separately approved for additional methods of delivery.

On September 23, 2022, Florida Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order Number 22-218 declaring a state of emergency in the following counties due to Tropical Depression Nine: Brevard, Broward, Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Glades, Hardee, Hendry, Highlands, Hillsborough, Indian River, Lee, Manatee, Martin, Miami-Dade, Monroe, Okeechobee, Osceola, Palm Beach, Pasco, Pinellas, Polk, Sarasota, and St. Lucie Counties. On September 23, 2022, Florida Governor Ron DeSantis issued an Executive Order Number 22-219 amending Executive Order 22-218 to include the entire State of Florida due to the tropical depression upgrade to Tropical Storm Ian and authorizing state agencies to suspend the provisions of any regulatory statutes, orders, or rules of that agency if strict compliance with that statute would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with this emergency. Since the issuance of the Executive Order the tropical storm was upgraded to Hurricane Ian which caused extreme damage to the State of Florida, including Federal and State recognized Disaster Areas.

FINAL ORDER APPROVING MARATHON ORDINANCE NO. 2022-09

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by the City of Marathon ("City"), Ordinance No. 2022-09 (the "Ordinance").

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Florida Keys Area is designated by Section 380.0552, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. The City is a local government within the Florida Keys Area.
- 2. The Ordinance was adopted by the City on June 14, 2022 and rendered to the Department on June 22, 2022.
- 3. The Ordinance amends table 103.15.1 in Chapter 103 and Article 3 of the City's Land Development Code (the "Code") by permitting beekeeping in all zoning districts, permitting Bars and Taverns in zoning districts I-G and I-M, and permitting vacation rentals in the C-NA zoning district. The Ordinance also amends table 103.15.2 in Chapter 103 and Article 3 of the Code to increase the maximum height of structures from 37 feet to 42 feet in all zoning districts.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. See Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes.
- 5. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. *See* Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes.
- 6. "Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. Section 380.031(8), Florida Statutes.

The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

- 7. The Ordinance is consistent with the City's Comprehensive Plan as required by Section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, generally, and is specifically consistent with Goal 1-3 *Manage Growth*, Objective 1-1.1 *Protect Community Character*, Policy 1-1.1.3 *Protect Residential Neighborhood Character*, and Policy 1-1.1.4 *Transition Between Land Uses*.
- 8. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. *See* Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in Section 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes.
- 9. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development in Section 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes, as a whole, and is specifically consistent with the following Principles:
 - (a) Strengthening local government capabilities for managing land use and development so that local government is able to achieve these objectives without continuing the area of critical state concern designation.
 - (n) Protecting the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Florida Keys and maintaining the Florida Keys as a unique Florida resource.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that the City of Marathon Ordinance No. 2022-09 is consistent with the City of Marathon's Comprehensive Plan and the Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby APPROVED.

This Final Order becomes final 21 days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below.
