FINAL ORDER

APPROVING CITY OF KEY WEST ORDINANCE NO. 22-

<u>25</u>

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by the City of Key West, Florida ("City"), by Ordinance No. 22-25 ("Ordinance").

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Section 380.0552, Florida Statutes, and Rule 28-36.002, Florida Administrative Code, designate the City as an area of critical state concern.

2. The City adopted the Ordinance on August 25, 2022 and rendered it to the Department on September 20, 2022.

3. The Ordinance amends the definitions of *Building coverage*, *Open space* (*green area*), and *Variance* within Chapter 86 of the City's Land Development Regulations. The definition of *Building coverage* is amended to allow overhangs and/or eaves, gutters, and downspouts to be removed from consideration in determining building coverage and allow gutters and downspouts to protrude into setbacks so long as they remain within the parcel's property lines. The definition of *Open space* (*green area*) is amended to allow the unobstructed land area below overhangs and/or eaves to be considered open

space. Finally, the definition of Variance is amended to clarify that variances are not needed when proposed structures or site improvements are being made to decrease an existing nonconformity; however, construction or alteration of structures that obstructs free passage of emergency responders or otherwise conflicts with the fire safety code is not permitted. 4. The Ordinance also amends Chapter 122 of the City's Land Development Regulations by revising the provisions related to the amended definitions of Chapter 86 for consistency. Additionally, the Ordinance amends the definition of "impervious surface" within Section 122-1143 to clarify that areas beneath elevated structures will not be considered impervious so long as they are kept fully permeable and to require that skirting or enclosing crawlspaces be a fully permeable material approved by the City Engineer.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

5. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. *See* Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes.

6. "Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. Section 380.031(8), Florida Statutes. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

7. The Ordinance is consistent with the City's Comprehensive Plan generally, as required by Section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, and is specifically consistent with Objective 1-1.2.1 and Policy 1-1.2.1.

8. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. *See* Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes. The Principles for Guiding Development for the City are set forth in Rule 28-36.003, Florida Administrative Code.

9. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the City as a whole, and specifically furthers the following principles:

(1)(a) Strengthen local government capabilities for managing land use and development; and

(h) Protection of the public health, safety, welfare and economy of the City of Key West, and the maintenance of Key West as a unique Florida resource.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that Ordinance No. 22-25 is consistent with the City's Comprehensive Plan and the Principles for Guiding Development for the City and is hereby <u>APPROVED</u>.
