The common elements include an "Equivalent Program" definition, enrollment requirements, Equivalent Program enrollment terms, enrollment effectiveness terms, and implementation verification site visit requirements. An addition to the rule provides conditions under which agricultural Producers and Landowners enrolled in the FDACS Best Management Practices Program may apply additional fertilizer if impacted by an emergency event identified in a Governor-issued Executive Order under chapter 252, F.S., to re-establish or recondition a crop that is unmarketable, destroyed, or flooded. Application of additional fertilizer as authorized by this rule shall not constitute improper implementation of any Applicable Best Management Practice for implementation verification purposes. The rule also adopts two additional forms used to modify the enrollment without impacting the effectiveness status, and revisions to the Generic NOI form and the Nutrient Application Record Form.
