Hurricane Milton caused catastrophic damage to parts of the State, which now necessitates timely precautions to protect the communities, critical infrastructure, and general welfare of this State.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: The procedure is fair in that it provides equal opportunity for additional administrative leave to state personnel system employees personally impacted by Hurricane Milton; provides at least the procedural protections given by other statutes, the State Constitution, or the United States Constitution; and takes only action that is necessary to protect the public interest under the emergency procedures in a manner that treats all similarly affected state employees fairly.

SUMMARY: This rule amends Rule 60L-34.0071(3), F.A.C., to provide an additional type of administrative leave related to Hurricane Milton.

 - (j) Storm Damage:

Agency heads may grant, on a case-by-case basis, up to 120 hours of administrative leave to employees for any time lost from scheduled work as a result of damage or destruction to their primary residences, or transportation issues or road

obstructions that prevent employees from safely and reasonably traveling to work, caused by Hurricane Milton.
