- (d) The firm engages in work for other parties, including, but not limited to, entering into consulting or other contractual arrangements with other persons or entities, the result of which could give rise to a conflict of interest with respect to the work being performed under the contract with the Office; or
- (e) any other circumstance where the private interests of the firm create an actual or potential conflict, or the appearance of a conflict, between that interest and the faithful performance of the firm's responsibilities for the examination.
- (3) The firm selected shall ensure that all its employees, management, subcontractors, and consultants abide by the provisions regarding conflicts of interest.
- (4) The rates charged to the pharmacy benefit manager being examined pursuant to section 626.8828, F.S., are to be

consistent with rates charged by other firms in a similar profession and are comparable with the rates charged for comparable examinations. No action of the firm shall create any contractual relationship between the Office and the professionals or subcontractors employed by the firm. SUMMARY: The proposed rule amendment is necessary to facilitate the operation of various community release programs with provisions for eligibility requirements, procedures and protocols, housing, restitution, and retrieving earned income from work release programs. The rule sets forth guidelines that promote successful integration into society.

SUMMARY: This emergency rule sets forth the provisions for the LIMITED-TIME \$500 RAFFLE (September 22 – October 26, 2025).

### <u>53ER25-46 LIMITED-TIME \$500 RAFFLE</u> (September 22 – October 26, 2025).

(1) From September 22 – October 26, 2025 (dates inclusive) ("Promotion Period"), the Florida Lottery will conduct the LIMITED-TIME \$500 RAFFLE (September 22 – October 26, 2025) ("Promotion").

(a) Up to, through, and including, the issuance of the 9,999,999<sup>th</sup> Raffle ticket, or until the end of the Promotion Period, whichever occurs first, one Raffle ticket will be issued to players who purchase a single ticket for \$10 and greater of CASH POP<sup>TM</sup>, PICK Daily Games<sup>TM</sup> (PICK games are: PICK

2<sup>TM</sup>, PICK 3<sup>TM</sup>, PICK 4<sup>TM</sup>, and PICK 5<sup>TM</sup>), FANTASY 5<sup>®</sup>, CASH4LIFE<sup>®</sup>, JACKPOT TRIPLE PLAY<sup>TM</sup>, FLORIDA LOTTO<sup>®</sup>, MEGA MILLIONS<sup>®</sup>, or POWERBALL<sup>®</sup> draw game tickets. The single purchase of \$10 and greater must be for the same game and must be for a single ticket. A single ticket purchase of \$10 and greater that includes Advance Play qualifies for the issuance of a Raffle ticket. GROUPER<sup>®</sup>, GROUPER<sup>®</sup> Super Sampler, and QuickTicket<sup>TM</sup> purchases and Continuation tickets do not qualify.

- (b) Upon the issuance of the 9,999,999<sup>th</sup> Raffle ticket, Raffle tickets will no longer be issued.
- (c) Players holding Raffle tickets will have a chance to win a cash prize of \$500.
  - (2) How to Enter.
- (a) A purchase that meets the requirements described in subsection (1), above, will trigger a terminal or vending machine, as applicable, to automatically print one Raffle ticket. A Winning Alert will sound when a Raffle ticket is generated. A prize alert symbol will print on qualifying draw game tickets. Upon the issuance of the 9,999,999th Raffle ticket, no additional Raffle tickets will be issued. Should a problem arise concerning the transaction, it is a player's responsibility to seek resolution with the retailer and the Florida Lottery prior to leaving the retail or Lottery office location. Each Raffle ticket will contain a unique number that will automatically be entered into the next available Raffle drawing; the next available Raffle draw date will print on a Raffle ticket. Players shall keep their original Raffle ticket/s throughout the Promotion Period, which will be needed for determining if a prize has been won and for redeeming a prize won, if any.
- (b) The odds of winning depend on the number of Raffle tickets issued, which constitute entries (one entry per Raffle ticket issued), during each drawing entry period. Upon the occurrence of the issuance of the 9,999,999<sup>th</sup> Raffle ticket, all non-winning Raffle tickets, irrespective of the draw dates shown on Raffle tickets, will be entered into the upcoming drawing, if any, and subsequent Promotion drawings, if any remain. All entries are subject to validation by the Florida Lottery and will be disqualified if eligibility requirements are not met.
  - (3) Drawings and Number of Prizes.
- (a) The Florida Lottery will conduct five (5) drawings in the Promotion to select winning Raffle ticket numbers. Drawings will be held on the dates listed in the table, below, from entries generated by 11:59:59 (ET) on the Drawing Entry Period end date. Drawings will be public, held in Tallahassee, Florida, and witnessed by an accountant employed by an independent certified public accounting firm.
- (b) Only Raffle tickets issued during a Drawing Entry Period will be entered into the associated drawing. Except that, upon the occurrence of the issuance of the 9,999,999<sup>th</sup> Raffle

ticket, if such occurs prior to the end of the Promotion Period, all non-winning Raffle tickets issued throughout the Promotion Period (less Raffle tickets previously drawn as winners), irrespective of the drawing dates shown on Raffle tickets, will be entered into an upcoming drawing, if any, and subsequent Promotion drawings, if any remain.

(c) As players are not required to register for a drawing, the only evidence of a winning Raffle ticket is the original Raffle ticket. Players shall retain their original Raffle ticket/s throughout the entire Promotion Period, as it will be required to show proof of a win and be required to redeem a prize won, if any.

Aside from publication on the Lottery's website, the Lottery will not attempt to further notify any winner. A player may also

check his/her Raffle ticket at any Lottery retailer or Lottery office or by scanning the Raffle ticket via "Check My Ticket" on the Florida Lottery's app.

Only an original Raffle ticket shall be honored for prize redemption; a copy, photograph, and the like, in any form or in any medium will not be accepted. If a player mails in a winning Raffle ticket, the player shall include, in legible writing, his/her name, mailing address, telephone number, and an email address, along with the original Raffle ticket. Any mailing must be post-marked on or before the applicable WINNING RAFFLE TICKET REDEMPTION DEADLINE date, set forth in the table under subsection (3), above. The risk of mailing remains with the player. The Lottery is not responsible for delays in mailing or lost/stolen mail. Raffle tickets redeemed in person must be redeemed by the applicable WINNING RAFFLE TICKET REDEMPTION DEADLINE date by 11:59:59 p.m. (ET), set forth in the table under subsection (3), above, subject to retailer and Lottery office operating hours.

(c) A player can only win one prize per Raffle ticket.

(d) Should any winning Raffle ticket not be redeemed, the prize associated with that winning Raffle ticket will not be awarded, and the player will not otherwise be compensated. In the event that 9,999,999 Raffle tickets are not issued by the end of the Promotion Period, any remaining tickets will not otherwise be issued.

- (6) Taxes. All federal, state, and/or local taxes and/or other costs and fees on all prizes will be the responsibility of winners.
  - (7) Other Restrictions and Provisions.



1. The benefit to the public. As stated in the WWTP proposal, the Project will provide for the timely and cost-effective design, construction, financing, and maintenance of the WWTP. The District's existing wastewater treatment plant located in Unit 23 is nearing the end of its useful life and the District's current facilities do not provide for the required capacity necessary to facilitate the population growth the District anticipates occurring over the next 20-year planning period (2044). The Team's collaborative proposal and approach allows the District flexibility in how the District proceeds with the design, construction, financing, maintenance, and operation of the WWTP. The Project will also provide the District with the ability to provide and maintain high-quality and cost-effective utility services for residents for at least the next twenty years with no additional significant investments. The Project will also allow for the capability of installing a public access reuse system which would provide District utility customers with high-quality reuse water for irrigation and other appropriate purposes. All of these public benefits flowing from the WWTP Project will also cause the necessary capacity and access needed for lot owners in currently undeveloped areas of the District to begin to plan for the eventual development of their lot(s), which in turn generates additional growth and revenue for the District to provide higher and better services. As stated in the WWTP proposal, the SP, Haskell, and Ardurra team will provide needed funds, design, engineering, procurement, construction, training, ongoing maintenance and operational support as desired by the District. The WWTP will enhance and benefit the environment and the health, safety, and welfare of landowners and persons inhabiting the District, through the continued provision, inter alia, of centralized and professionally maintained central wastewater collection, treatment, disposal and reuse facilities and services.

2. The financial structure of and the economic efficiencies achieved by the proposal. As stated in the WTP proposal, the Team is agnostic to the sources of the District's funding. The District currently has identified approximately 30 million dollars in revenue from special assessments levied on benefited property owners throughout the District in 2024, in the amount of \$2,700.00 per Equivalent Residential Connection ("ERC"), with the first annual installment due in October 2025 and being payable over 15 years, to fund, in particular, the new WWTP. The District also anticipates securing a state loan from an

approved funding program to provide for additional required project funding. The Team's flexibility will allow the District to continue to follow its current plan for the financing of the WWTP and will allow the District to continue to collect the special assessment in the manner originally provided for. The proposal notes that SP is also able to provide all, part or none of the capital needed to fully implement the solution and can, in many cases, act as matching funds required for grants. Furthermore, SP's ability to capitalize on an "as needed" basis can help keep the project both on budget and on track. Consequently, the WWTP proposal provides economic efficiencies not only in relation to financing but also with respect to the project's overall cost and timeline.

3. The qualifications and experience of the private entity that submitted the proposal and such entity's ability to perform the project. As stated in the WWTP proposal and shown through successful past developments, the Team has the qualifications and experience to timely and efficiently complete the WWTP. Sustainability Partners is a US-based, Public Benefit Company with a history of helping governmental entities develop and renew their essential infrastructure and meet their sustainability goals. SP can facilitate all, or any, of the necessary components (design, engineering, procurement, installation, ongoing maintenance and funding) that empower a community to improve its critical infrastructure and, thereby, better serve its constituents. 4. The project's compatibility with regional infrastructure plans. The WWTP Project is compatible with the regional infrastructure and the County's comprehensive plan (the District does not have land use authority under the terms of its Charter). The Project will address the District's well-documented need for an updated, centralized and professionally maintained central wastewater collection, treatment, disposal and reuse facility. The project will provide for the capacity needed for the District's pursuit of a proactive development strategy. The overall improvements to be made by the Project, will also assist the District and community in achieving an environmentally responsible plan for the reuse of water, including but not limited to, the irrigation of lawns and recreations areas, including the District's two 18-hole golf courses and related practice facilities.

5. Public comments submitted at the meeting. At the Board of Supervisors' June 3, 2025, first publicly noticed meeting on the Team's unsolicited proposal, a majority of the public comments were in favor of pursuing the WWTP project via the Team's unsolicited proposal. At least one comment questioned the District's plan to finance the WWTP, and if the Team's unsolicited proposal would cause the District to alter its financing plan. At the Board of Supervisors' meeting of July 1, 2023, the second publicly noticed meeting, the District received no further public regarding the WWTP project via the Team's unsolicited proposal. Since the Board of Supervisors and the public will have further opportunities to review, consider, and comment upon, and in the case of the Board of Supervisors. approve, the interim agreement and/or comprehensive agreement for the WWTP and the other components of the Project, the District believes the comments made will be sufficiently addressed in the forthcoming agreements.

The district has also determined that the Team's unsolicited proposal meets each of the Project Approval, Project Qualification Requirements and other applicable requirements set forth in section 255.065, Florida Statutes and that the Team's unsolicited proposal is for a Qualifying Project within the meaning of section 255.065.

SECTION 4. The District Clerk is directed to publish in the Florida Administrative Register, for at least seven (7) days, a report that includes this Resolution and make publicly available the unsolicited proposal.

SECTION 5. All prior adopted Resolutions in conflict with any of the provisions of this Resolution are hereby repealed and replaced with the provisions provided for herein.

SECTION 6. If any portion of this Resolution proves to be invalid, unlawful, or unconstitutional, it shall not be held to invalidate or impair the validity, force, or effect of any other parts of this Resolution.

SECTION 7. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.

The passage of this resolution was moved by Supervisor Beverly Phillips, seconded by Supervisor Greg Norton, and upon being put to a vote, the Resolution was approved by a vote of 5-0.

The District President thereupon declared this resolution duly passed and adopted on the 1st day of July, 2025.
