# 55-15.001 Definitions.

For the Purposes of this rule, the following definitions apply:

(1) "Grantees" means Organization(s) receiving grant funding under this rule.

(2) "Awardees" means Such dental practices, or individual dentists selected by the Grantees to provide services through the Veterans Dental Care Grant Program.

(3) "Program" means Veterans Dental Care Grant Program.

(4) "FVF" means the Florida Veterans Foundation.

(5) "Veteran" means the same as the definition located in section 1.01(14), F.S.

(6) "FDVA" means the Florida Department of Veterans' Affairs.

(7) "FBD" means the Florida Board of Dentistry.

(8) "VA" means the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.

# 55-15.002 Program Description.

(1) The FVF will oversee the operation of the Program, which is subject to an appropriation by the Legislature and will serve veterans during the annual funding period. To administer the Program, the FVF will award grants to eligible nonprofits with experience providing veterans with dental care. Any organization that receives funding shall only contract with dental practices or individual dentists currently licensed and in good standing with the FBD.

(2) The FVF, in consultation with the FDVA, a not-forprofit organization that provides charitable dental care, and a dentist in good standing with the FBD, will select Grantees based on a prospective Grantee's ability to facilitate covered services through Awardees to eligible veterans living in one or more of Florida's numerous regions.

(3) The FVF will ensure that Program grant funds are allocated proportionately based on the geographic distribution of the state's veteran population. Therefore, the FVF will seek to select one or more eligible nonprofit organizations with experience in providing dental care to veterans based on their geographic service area or their demonstrated abilities to provide dental care to the required areas of Florida.

(4) Grant applications under the Program will be awarded until funds for the appropriate year are

expended.

### 55-15.003 Veteran Eligibility Requirements.

To qualify for services under the Program, veterans must provide documentation showing that they meet the following requirements:

(1) Must have been issued a DD-214, NGB 22, or Certificate of Discharge.

(2) Must reside in Florida.

(3) Must be at a 300% Poverty Level or below as defined by the federal government, at the time of their application.

(4) Must be less than 100% service-connected disabled.

(5) Must not have a direct service-connected injury impacting their oral health.

### 55-15.004 Grantee Application Requirements.

Organizations applying to be a Grantee will be required to do the following:

(1) Submit their Florida Veterans' Foundation Dental Program Grant Application, Form DPA24-1012, effective date February 13, 2025 (DOS F Rules Link) incorporated herein by reference to the FVF no later than a date set by FDVA. The documents needed to apply for Grantee status can be downloaded from the FVF Website.

(2) Demonstrate that they can facilitate dental care services, including dental maintenance and disease elimination, diagnostics, and dental hygiene for veterans through qualified prospective Awardees.

(3) Coordinate with pertinent organizations to assess veteran dental needs in their geographic area of responsibility. Rulemaking Authority 295.157(5) FS. Law Implemented 295.157 FS. History- New xx-xx-xx.

### 55-15.005 Grantee Workplan Requirements.

To receive a distribution of grant funds, Grantees must have completed the following requirements:

(1) Submitted their Florida Veterans' Foundation Dental Program Grant Application, Form DPA24-1012, effective date February 13, 2025, (DOS F Rules Link) as revised, based on the award amount offered to Grantee, and incorporated herein by reference to the FVF online no more than thirty (30) days after notice of award. The documents needed to apply for grant funding can be downloaded from the FVF Website.

(2) Received confirmation from the FVF that they can facilitate dental care services including dental maintenance and disease elimination, or diagnostics and dental hygiene for veterans through qualified prospective Awardees.

(3) Coordinated with pertinent organizations that veteran dental needs in their geographic area of responsibility still need to be addressed.

### <u>69J-6.001– The My Safe Florida Condominium Pilot</u> <u>Program</u>

(1) Definitions. The following definitions apply to the My Safe Florida Condominium Pilot Program (MSFCP Program) and all rules and forms incorporated therein: (a) Condominium Association or Association – In addition to any entity responsible for the operation of common elements owned in undivided shares by unit owners, any entity which operates or maintains other real property in which unit owners have use rights, where membership in the entity is composed exclusively of unit owners or their elected or appointed representatives and is a required condition of unit ownership.

(b) Final Inspection – The concluding inspection performed by a Wind Certification Entity upon completion of a Mitigation Project. The Final Inspection is used to identify Improvements that are observed as successfully completed on the condominium property.

(c) Final Inspection Report – The Wind Certification Entity will complete the Final Inspection Report, Form DFS-O1-015, effective MM/YY, incorporated herein by reference, and available at

(d) Grant Application – To apply for a mitigation grant, a Condominium Association shall complete and submit, through the Program Portal, Form DFS-O1-014, Grant Application, effective MM/YY, incorporated herein by reference, and available at http://www.mysafecondo.casemanagement.tbtech.com and https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-\_\_\_.

(e) Initial Inspection – The first inspection performed by a Wind Certification Entity prior to starting a Mitigation Project.

(f) Initial Inspection Report – The Wind Certification Entity will complete the Initial Inspection Report, Form DFS-O1-011, effective MM/YY, incorporated herein by reference, and available at https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-

The Inspector will use Form OIR-B1-1802, Uniform Mitigation Verification Inspection Form, incorporated by reference in Rule 69O-170.0155, F.A.C., to perform Initial Inspections on condominium buildings with three (3) or fewer stories. Inspectors will use the Building Type II and III Mitigation Inspection Form when performing Initial Inspections on condominium buildings with four (4) or more stories.

(g) Inspection Application –To apply for an Initial Inspection, a Condominium Association shall complete and submit, through the Program Portal, Form DFS-O1-010, Inspection Application, effective MM/YY, incorporated herein by reference, and available at http://www.mysafecondo.casemanagement.tbtech.com and https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-\_\_\_\_

(h) Inspector – A licensed or certified inspector, hired or employed by a Wind Certification Entity, authorized to perform inspections pursuant to section 215.55871, Florida Statutes (F.S.)

(i) Mitigation Project – The Improvements made to a condominium property based on the recommendations by the Wind Certification Entity in an MSFCP Program Initial Inspection Report.

(j) Program Portal – The MSFCP Program's internet portal located at the following website: http://www.mysafecondo.casemanagement.tbtech.com.

(k) Reimbursement Request – After the Mitigation Project and Final Inspection are complete, a Condominium Association shall complete and submit, through the Program Portal, Form DFS-O1-016, Reimbursement Request, effective MM/YY, incorporated herein by reference, and available at http://www.mysafecondo.casemanagement.tbtech.com and https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-\_\_\_\_.

(1) Story – The portion of a building included between the upper surface of a floor and the upper surface of the floor or roof next above. A story is measured as the vertical distance from top to top of two successive tiers of beams or finished floor surfaces and, for the topmost story, from the top of the floor finish to the top of the ceiling joists or, where there is not a ceiling, to the top of the roof rafters.

(m) Wind Certification Entity (WCE) – an entity the Department of Financial Services has contracted with to provide hurricane mitigation inspections in accordance with section 215.55871, F.S.

(2) Required Documentation. Condominium Associations must upload the documentation required by the MSFCP Program through the Program Portal.

(a) Before voting to participate in the MSFCP Program, a Condominium Association must provide unit owners the Disclosure Notice, Form DFS-O1-012, effective MM/YY, incorporated herein by reference, and available at http://www.mysafecondo.casemanagement.tbtech.com, and https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-

(b) As part of the Grant Application, Condominium Associations must submit a notarized and completed Intended Contractors List and Commitment to Complete, Form DFS-O1-013, effective MM/YY, incorporated herein by reference, and available at

http://www.mysafecondo.casemanagement.tbtech.com, and https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-\_\_\_\_

Contractors must be licensed by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation under the provisions of chapter 489, F.S. (3) Service Area Requirement. The MSFCP Program will utilize a geographic informational system (ArcGIS) to analyze the condominium's latitudinal and longitudinal coordinates and its geographic relationship to the absolute boundaries of the fifteen (15) mile buffer of the state's coastline to determine eligibility.

(4) Application Process. Instructions and requirements for participating in the MSFCP Program can be found in the Condominium Association Guide, Form DFS-O1-009, effective MM/YY, incorporated herein by reference, and available at http://www.mysafecondo.casemanagement.tbtech.com, and https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-

(5) A Condominium Association's Grant Application will be denied if the actual construction of the Mitigation Project begins prior to Grant Application approval.

(6) A Condominium Association that fails to select a licensed contractor to perform the Mitigation Project will be denied for a mitigation grant.

(7) Eligible Improvements. Improvements, listed in section 215.55871(5)(e), F.S., must be recommended in the Initial Inspection Report and observed in the Final Inspection Report to be eligible for a mitigation grant. The MSFCP Program will not provide mitigation grant funds for any construction that is not recommended in the Initial Inspection Report. The statements in the Initial Inspection Report and Final Inspection Report dictate MSFCP Program eligibility, regardless of other information or statements made outside the Initial Inspection Report or Final Inspection Report. When recommended by a hurricane mitigation inspection report, grants for eligible associations may be used for the following improvements:

(a) Opening protection.

(b) Roof-related improvements, as follows:

1. For buildings with a pitched roof:

a. Reinforcing roof-to-wall connections.

b. Improving the strength of roof-deck attachments.

c. Providing secondary water resistance for the roof.

d. Replacing the roof covering, if necessary, for any of the improvements listed in sub-subparagraphs a.-c.

2. For buildings with a flat roof, if improvements to protect the property that which complied with the current applicable building code at the time have been previously installed, the association must use a mitigation grant to install improvements that do both of the following:

a. Comply with or exceed the applicable building code in effect at the time the association applied for the grant.

b. Provide more hurricane protection than the improvements that the association previously installed.

(8) Assigning Funds. A Condominium Association shall not assign any mitigation grant funds under the MSFCP Program to any other person or entity. A Condominium Association that assigns, encumbers, or transfers, or any attempt thereof, an interest in a mitigation grant, will be denied for a mitigation grant.

Pursuant to Section 255.065(3)(d), Florida Statutes

On August 20, 2024, the Palmetto Community Redevelopment Agency (PCRA) received a public/private (P3) unsolicited proposal from ReEnvision Palmetto, LLC for the acquisition and development of seven (7) parcels located within the Palmetto Community Redevelopment Area accounting for a total of 4.52-acre. The lots are located at: 800 5th Street West (1.69 acre/2793500059), 401 6th Avenue West (.64 acre/2798300159), 11th Street West 619 (.66 acre/2651700003), 602 11th Street West (.63 Street acre/2655600109), 607 11th West (.15 acre/2651100006), 709 4th Avenue West (.32 acre/2794300059), 301 7th West (.54 Avenue acre/3105300109), Palmetto Florida. The CRA Board has agreed to convey these parcels as their contribution to the development of the project.

On December 16, 2024, the CRA Board held the first duly noticed public meeting pursuant to section 255.065(3)(c), Florida Statutes.

On January 6, 2025, the CRA Board conducted its second duly noticed public meeting on ReEnvision Palmetto, LLC unsolicited proposal pursuant to section 255.065(3)(c), Florida Statutes. The CRA Board heard public comments from the public at the meeting. The CRA Board made a first motion to remove the parcel located at 301 7th Avenue West (.54 acre/3105300109) from the list of parcels eligible to be conveyed to ReEnvision with a unanimous vote of 5-0. A second motion was made that ReEnvision Palmetto, LLC unsolicited proposal for the six (6) parcels identified above was in the public's interest in a unanimous vote of 5 to 0 based upon the following:

1. The benefits to the public.

a. This unsolicited proposal from ReEnvision Palmetto LLC offers several benefits to the public, such as;

i) Increase the housing supply, enhanced housing choices, tailored solutions to targeted community needs. Increase transportation infrastructure as required by the 2022-2028 Community Redevelopment Plan.

ii) Economically, the project will increase the City's property tax revenue by at least \$500,000/year, pay \$500,000+ in municipal impact fees, create 100+ development and construction jobs prior to completion, and create roughly 50+ additional permanent jobs for residents. This new economic activity will spread to every neighborhood in Palmetto, directly or indirectly.

iii) From a housing standpoint, the project will produce up to 100 multifamily apartment units, 25+ senior units, and 20+ townhomes with some amenities. These units will all be affordable housing units servicing residents at 120% Area Median Income and below.

iv) One of the most important benefits is for the City's longterm growth, the project will help to market the City of Palmetto as a vibrant and desirable place to live, work, and play, thereby serving as a catalyst for the continued revitalization of our underserved areas of Urban Palmetto.

2. The financial structure of and the economic efficiencies achieved by the proposal.

a. ReEnvision Palmetto LLC estimates that the total development cost, inclusive of all residential and some mixeduse retail, will be ~\$105M. To finance this project, they would secure commercial bank financing at 10% LTC or \$10M and will partner with other investors for additional funding for the project. They propose to leverage all funding with owner's equity and 4% or 9% tax credit funding through the State of Florida towards the construction of the total development.

3. The qualifications and experience of the private entity that submitted the proposal and such an entity's ability to perform the project.

a. Mikhail Scott is the managing principal of ReEnvision Palmetto LLC, a multifamily development, sales, property management, community engagement, and maintenance company based in the City of Palmetto. Founded in 2024, as a derivative of Indelible Solutions Inc. The company has a skilled team comprised of nine (9) personnel in addition to Mr. Scott: a business development specialist, 2 real estate brokers, a certified public accountant, a property manager, community engagement specialist, a construction financing professional, and a builder contractor.

b. The ReEnvision Palmetto team has worked in the real estate and development industry for over 30 years combined on both the residential and commercial track.

4. The project's compatibility with regional infrastructure plans.

a. The proposed project would require a rezone of the city lots. The project was preliminary vetted with the City Land Use and Zoning Department as well as the Building Department. The project will follow all Code requirements to obtain all zoning changes necessary to begin construction.

5. Public comments submitted at the meeting. The public comments were specifically related to how excited the residents were to see this much needed project is finally coming to fruition. In making its decision, the City considered all public comments, and the Mayor and Commissioners specifically made comments in response supporting their decisions. Since the City Commission and the public will have further opportunities to review, consider, and comment upon the comprehensive agreement for the development of all 6 parcels, the City believes the comments made will be sufficiently addressed in the forthcoming agreements.

2. The factors considered in making such public interest determination.

The factors that were taken into account by the City when making its public interest determination, as outlined earlier, include:

Consistency with the city's comprehensive plan and zoning laws.

Financial feasibility and the economic viability of the project.

Addressing affordable housing needs in alignment with state and federal housing goals.

Redevelopment of the City's underserved areas.

Economic benefits to the city include increased tax base, addressing slum and blight, job creation, and infrastructure improvements.

Community input on what the direct needs are for their communities.

Environmental impacts.

The allocation of risk and responsibility between the public and private parties.

Compliance with applicable laws.

Community input

3. The City's findings based on each considered factor.

The city must present specific findings regarding each of the factors considered. These findings should explain how the city evaluated each factor and the conclusions it reached based on the proposal. For instance:

The City concludes that the ReEnvision Palmetto LLC proposal aligns with the local comprehensive plan (after rezoning, modifications as discussed above, if approved) and the proposed financial ability to complete the project which includes commercial bank debt, investor equity, and CRA contributions towards development.

The findings include an assessment of how well the proposal addresses the revitalization of our underserved areas and the overwhelming need for affordable housing. The proposed housing development will provide a combination of rental and homeownership units, some public/private parking, and the working class of citizens and some senior residents will be able to enjoy the desired location to call their new home.

The passage of this motion was 5-0.

#### Program Summary

The Florida Division of Emergency Management (Division) is pleased to announce the availability of Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) funds as a result of the recent Presidential Disaster Declaration for the Severe Storms, Straight-line Winds, and Tornadoes event (FEMA 4794-DR-FL), which was declared on June 17, 2024.

HMGP funding is authorized by Section 404 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief Act. This funding helps communities implement measures to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and property from natural hazards and their effects. The Division encourages all potential applicants to submit applications for projects that address eligible mitigation activities. The amount of HMGP funding available to the state is based on the total federal disaster assistance for the Presidential Disaster Declaration. The HMGP funding for this notice is for regular funds only and does not include funding options for initiative, codes and standards, or planning setasides. Applications submitted for the latter obligations will not be accepted under this funding notice.

### Current Changes

As of October 7, 2024, 27P-22 of the Florida Administrative Code is now updated to establish the Division of Emergency Management Enterprise Solution (DEMES) system as the required method to submit applications to the Division for the HMGP. Hard copies are no longer being accepted, nor is there a requirement to submit an original signed application into DEMES as an attachment, thus removing this redundancy. In order to ensure each project has been approved by an authorizing agent, a single-page form will be required as the final step in the application submission process (<u>Attachment F</u>) If you have been granted access to DEMES for a past event, please use your existing account and do not re-register. If you have problems accessing your account, please use the DEMES contact below.

### Application Timeline

The application period will close May 21, 2025. The Division encourages potential applicants to submit complete applications before the close of the application period. Applications will only be accepted from eligible applicants as defined in the *Minimum Program Eligibility* section of this notice.

DEMES Registration: If you have not already registered for access to DEMES, please see the instructions in <u>Attachment H</u> to do so.

A complete submission of your applications, and all required supporting documentation, should be uploaded to DEMES no later than

May 21 2025, 11:59 p.m. (EDT)

It is imperative that your access request for DEMES is received by the Division no later than 5:00 p.m. EDT on May 21, 2025, in order to meet the application deadline.

Minimum Program Eligibility

*Eligible Applicants*: According to the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 44 §206.434(a), the following parties are eligible to apply for Hazard Mitigation Grant Program funds: State agencies:

- State agencies;
- Local governments who have an approved Local Mitigation Strategy (LMS) in accordance with 44 CFR §201.6, prior to receipt of HMGP subgrant funding for projects;
- Private non-profit organizations or institutions that own or operate a private non-profit facility as defined in 44 CFR §206.221(e); and
- Indian tribes or authorized tribal organizations

However, be advised that pursuant to Rule 27P-22, Florida Administrative Code, all project applications must go through the Local Mitigation Strategy Working Group (LMSWG) of the county where the project will take place. Any application submitted in DEMES without a signed endorsement letter, from either the Chair or Vice-Chair of an LMSWG, will be denied. *Eligible Activities:* Activities include mitigation projects that will result in protection of public or private property from natural hazards. Activities for which implementation has already been initiated or completed are not eligible for funding. Eligible projects include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Acquisition (demolition or relocation) of existing atrisk structures
- Aquifer (recharge, storage and recovery) serve primarily as a drought management tool and reduce flood risk
- Dry Floodproofing structures by sealing the structure to keep floodwaters out
- Elevation of flood prone structures
- Flood Risk Reduction (Localized or Non-localized) lessen the frequency or severity of flooding
- Generator for critical facilities or are an integral part of a larger eligible project
- Infrastructure Retrofit modifications to the existing infrastructure to reduce or eliminate the risk of future damage and increase protection
- Mitigation Reconstruction of properties that cannot be elevated
- Safe Room to provide immediate life-safety protection from severe wind events
- Secondary Power Source to increase power system resilience
- Stabilization to reduce risk to structures/infrastructure from erosion
- Structural Retrofit modifications addressing the structural element of a building/facility that are essential to increase protection
- Wildfire Mitigation at-risk structures and associated loss of life from the threat of future wildfires
- Wind Retrofit modifications to the existing structure to reduce or eliminate the risk of future damage and increase protection

*Ineligible Activities:* The state will not consider funding requests for the following:

- Construction of new facilities (Nevertheless, the cost associated with Code Plus upgrades to new facilities may be considered);
- Equipment such as emergency pumps, vehicles, and communication devices;
- Stand-alone studies, design, and planning-related activities, not directly related to the design and implementation of a proposed mitigation project;
- Tree removal, debris removal, and other forms of maintenance; or
- Projects already in progress (Construction may not begin until the contract between the State and

subrecipient is executed and the project has met requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act).

*Eligibility Criteria:* All projects submitted must meet *minimum criteria* to be considered for funding. An eligible project must:

- Conform to the requirements stated in this Notice of Funding Availability;
- Conform to the Florida State Hazard Mitigation Plan and the respective community's LMS;
- Conform to the funding priorities for the disaster, as established in the appropriate LMS;
- Demonstrate cost-effectiveness;
- Be technically feasible;
- Benefit the designated disaster area;
- Conform to all applicable environmental laws and regulations, as well as Executive Orders;
- Solve a problem independently or constitute a functional part of a solution;
- Benefit a National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) participating community that is not on probation or suspended from the NFIP; and
- Meet all applicable State and local codes and standards.

### Cost-Share Requirements

The HMGP is a cost-reimbursement grant program, with FEMA contributing up to 75-percent of the total amount approved under the grant award to implement eligible, cost-effective mitigation measures. The applicant must provide the remaining 25-percent non-federal share. Contributions, cash, and in-kind services are acceptable as part of the non-federal share. Requirements for in-kind contributions can be found in 2 CFR §200.306. In-kind contributions must be directly related to the eligible project cost and are those personnel, materials, equipment and supplies owned, controlled, and operated by the applicant or a third-party contributor.

Applicants may use the Global Match concept as part of the 25percent non-federal share. Global Match permits a potential applicant to meet the non-federal share match by receiving credit for state and/or local government funds that were committed to a similar type of project(s). These similar nonfederally funded projects require a separate application submission, must meet all of the HMGP eligibility requirements, and be submitted under the same disaster. This means that if Global Match is approved, the applicant may receive up to 100-percent federal share. Phased projects are not eligible for Global Match.

### Pre-Award Costs

Prior to receiving a grant award, pre-award costs may be requested. Pre-award costs include items such as engineering, environmental study, permitting, and other "soft" costs associated with a construction project. *Construction activities are not considered pre-award costs*. Pre-award costs must be requested, in writing, by submitting a signed pre-award request form at application submittal and included in the budget as separate line-item. Directions for getting this form are included in *Attachment A*.

### Procurement

Any procurement of property or services under a federal award must conform to 2 CFR §200 Subpart D (§§ 200.317 - 200.327). This also includes any activities performed as a part of the preaward request.

### Sub-Recipient Management Costs

Per FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Assistance Program and Policy Guidance, dated March 23, 2023, HMGP projects awarded under disasters, on or after the effective date, are eligible for sub-recipient management costs (SRMC) up to a hard cap of 5 percent of their eligible and actual project costs. SRMC is a separate pool of funding and will not be calculated as part of the benefit-cost analysis (BCA). SRMC will be reimbursed at a 100 percent federal cost share following the submission of compliant source documentation in conformance with 2 CFR 200 Subpart E. Additional information on SRMC can be found in the attached HMGP SRMC Request Form (*Attachment G*). Any applicant requesting SRMC will need to complete and upload this form along with their application in DEMES.

### County Funding Allocation

To ensure funds are distributed equitably, designated counties have been assigned a portion of the total HMGP grant. The amount is based on a calculation of the proportional share of the total federal assistance under the Public Assistance (PA), Individual Assistance (IA), and Small Business Administration (SBA) programs. Commitment of project funds by the Division is contingent upon receipt of appropriate Legislative Budget Authority.

These figures are shown in <u>Attachment B</u> and represent the estimated amount of HMGP funds currently available. HMGP funding is available only to those counties that have a current FEMA-approved LMS. Project applications will be considered only if:

- (1) The application is accompanied by an endorsement by the LMS Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson stating that the project is included in the current LMS; and,
- (2) If more than one project is submitted, the endorsement indicates the prioritization. A sample project submission letter is shown in <u>Attachment *C*</u>.

The Division will attempt to fund each submitted project in priority order until the county's allocation has been exhausted. In accordance with Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) 27P-

22.006, the Division uses the following tiered allocation system up until the State application deadline with FEMA:

# Tier 1

The available HMGP funds are allocated to counties included in the relevant Presidential Disaster Declaration in proportion to each county's share of federal disaster funding from the Public Assistance (PA), Individual Assistance (IA), and Small Business Administration (SBA) Disaster Loan Program as of 120 days after a Disaster Declaration as reported by FEMA. Eligible projects submitted by each county included in the relevant Presidential Disaster Declaration will be funded in order of priority as outlined in the LMS until the allocated funds are exhausted or all eligible projects are funded.

### Tier 2

Any allocation remaining after all eligible projects in any declared county are funded shall be re-allocated to those counties included in the relevant Presidential Disaster Declaration whose allocation was not sufficient to fund all submitted eligible projects. The order of priority for reallocating funds is detailed in Attachment D.

*Tier 3* In the event that funds remain after the Tier 1 and Tier 2 processes, any remaining funds will be offered on a statewide basis as described in Attachment D.

Please see Attachment D for a detailed explanation of funding tiers.

Funding Availability and Notification

FEMA notifies the State of HMGP funding availability at the following milestones:

# Initial 30-Day Estimate

This is an early estimate only and not an actual commitment of funding by FEMA. Funding may increase or decrease based on actual disaster claims during the declaration period. These estimates are provided for planning purposes and to jump-start the HMGP application process.

# Obligation prior to 12 Months

Prior to the 12-month lock-in, FEMA will only obligate funds up to 75% of any current estimate. This is to eliminate the risk of over-obligating funds for any given disaster in the event the 12-month lock-in is lower than initially estimated.

# 12 Months from the Date of Declaration

This represents the State's Lock-in Amount. It is the maximum amount available the state can expect to receive from FEMA. In rare occurrences, FEMA may conduct a

subsequent review 18 months after the declaration, but only at the request of the State. The estimate from that review may cause the final lock-in to fluctuate up or down depending on the findings.

It is important for potential applicants to recognize that HMGP funds are contingent upon FEMA's reexamination of the disaster figures at the given time intervals. A county's funding allocation can increase or decrease after application submission.

### Technical Assistance

The Division is in the process of scheduling HMGP application development workshop webinars and will be in touch with these counties in the next few weeks to finalize dates and times. The webinars will focus on the declared counties so that their project-specific concerns can be addressed by state staff.

This funding helps communities implement measures to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and property from natural hazards and their effects. The Division encourages all potential applicants to submit applications for projects that address eligible mitigation activities. The amount of HMGP funding available to the state is based on the total federal disaster assistance for the. Presidential Disaster Declaration. The HMGP funding for this. notice is for regular funds only and does not include funding options for initiative, codes and standards, or planning setasides. Applications submitted for the latter obligations will not. be accepted under this funding notice.

### Current Changes

As of October 7, 2024, 27P-22 of the Florida Administrative. Code is now updated to establish the Division of Emergency Management Enterprise Solution (DEMES) system as the required method to submit applications to the Division for the HMGP. Hard copies are no longer being accepted, nor is there a requirement to submit an original signed application into DEMES as an attachment, thus removing this redundancy. In order to ensure each project has been approved by an authorizing agent, a single-page form will be required as the final step in the application submission process (<u>Attachment F</u>) If you have been granted access to DEMES for a past event, please use your existing account and do not re-register. If you have problems accessing your account, please use the DEMES contact below.

# Application Timeline

The application period will close May 21, 2025. The Division encourages potential applicants to submit complete applications before the close of the application period. Applications will only be accepted from eligible applicants as defined in the *Minimum Program Eligibility* section of this notice.

DEMES Registration: If you have not already registered for access to DEMES, please see the instructions in <u>Attachment H</u> to do so.

A complete submission of your applications, and all required supporting documentation, should be uploaded to DEMES no later than

#### May 21, 2025, 11:59 p.m. (EDT)

It is imperative that your access request for DEMES is received by the Division no later than 5:00 p.m. EDT on May 21, 2025, in order to meet the application deadline.

# Minimum Program Eligibility

*Eligible Applicants*: According to the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 44 §206.434(a), the following parties are eligible to apply for Hazard Mitigation Grant Program funds: State agencies;

Local governments who have an approved Local Mitigation Strategy (LMS) in accordance with 44 CFR §201.6, prior to receipt of HMGP subgrant funding for projects;

Private non-profit organizations or institutions that own or operate a private non-profit facility as defined in 44 CFR §206.221(e); and

Indian tribes or authorized tribal organizations

However, be advised that pursuant to Rule 27P-22, Florida Administrative Code, all project applications must go through the Local Mitigation Strategy Working Group (LMSWG) of the county where the project will take place. Any application submitted in DEMES without a signed endorsement letter, from either the Chair or Vice-Chair of an LMSWG, will be denied.

*Eligible Activities:* Activities include mitigation projects that will result in protection of public or private property from natural hazards. Activities for which implementation has already been initiated or completed are not eligible for funding. Eligible projects include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Acquisition (demolition or relocation) of existing atrisk structures
- Aquifer (recharge, storage and recovery) serve primarily as a drought management tool and reduce flood risk
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- Elevation of flood prone structures

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- Mitigation Reconstruction of properties that cannot be elevated
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- Secondary Power Source to increase power system resilience
- Stabilization to reduce risk to structures/infrastructure from erosion
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- Wind Retrofit modifications to the existing structure to reduce or eliminate the risk of future damage and increase protection

*Ineligible Activities:* The state will not consider funding requests for the following:

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- Equipment such as emergency pumps, vehicles, and communication devices;
- Stand-alone studies, design, and planning-related activities, not directly related to the design and implementation of a proposed mitigation project;
- Tree removal, debris removal, and other forms of maintenance; or
- Projects already in progress (Construction may not begin until the contract between the State and subrecipient is executed and the project has met requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act).

*Eligibility Criteria:* All projects submitted must meet *minimum criteria* to be considered for funding. An eligible project must:

- Conform to the requirements stated in this Notice of Funding Availability;
- Conform to the Florida State Hazard Mitigation Plan and the respective community's LMS;
- Conform to the funding priorities for the disaster, as established in the appropriate LMS;
- Demonstrate cost-effectiveness;
- Be technically feasible;

- Benefit the designated disaster area;
- Conform to all applicable environmental laws and regulations, as well as Executive Orders;
- Solve a problem independently or constitute a functional part of a solution;
- Benefit a National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) participating community that is not on probation or suspended from the NFIP; and
- Meet all applicable State and local codes and standards.

# Cost-Share Requirements

The HMGP is a cost-reimbursement grant program, with FEMA contributing up to 75-percent of the total amount approved under the grant award to implement eligible, cost-effective mitigation measures. The applicant must provide the remaining 25-percent non-federal share. Contributions, cash, and in-kind services are acceptable as part of the non-federal share. Requirements for in-kind contributions can be found in 2 CFR §200.306. In-kind contributions must be directly related to the eligible project cost and are those personnel, materials, equipment and supplies owned, controlled, and operated by the applicant or a third-party contributor.

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### Pre-Award Costs

Prior to receiving a grant award, pre-award costs may be requested. Pre-award costs include items such as engineering, environmental study, permitting, and other "soft" costs associated with a construction project. *Construction activities are not considered pre-award costs*. Pre-award costs must be requested, in writing, by submitting a signed pre-award request form at application submittal and included in the budget as separate line-item. Directions for getting this form are included in *Attachment A*.

# Procurement

Any procurement of property or services under a federal award must conform to 2 CFR §200 Subpart D (§§ 200.317 - 200.327). This also includes any activities performed as a part of the preaward request.

### Sub-Recipient Management Costs

Per FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Assistance Program and Policy Guidance, dated July 30, 2024, HMGP projects awarded under

disasters, on or after the effective date, are eligible for subrecipient management costs (SRMC) up to a hard cap of 5 percent of their eligible and actual project costs. SRMC is a separate pool of funding and will not be calculated as part of the benefit-cost analysis (BCA). SRMC will be reimbursed at a 100 percent federal cost share following the submission of compliant source documentation in conformance with 2 CFR 200 Subpart E. Additional information on SRMC can be found in the attached HMGP SRMC Request Form (<u>Attachment G</u>). Any applicant requesting SRMC will need to complete and upload this form along with their application in DEMES.

### County Funding Allocation

To ensure funds are distributed equitably, designated counties have been assigned a portion of the total HMGP grant. The amount is based on a calculation of the proportional share of the total federal assistance under the Public Assistance (PA), Individual Assistance (IA), and Small Business Administration (SBA) programs. Commitment of project funds by the Division is contingent upon receipt of appropriate Legislative Budget Authority.

These figures are shown in <u>Attachment B</u> and represent the estimated amount of HMGP funds currently available. HMGP funding is available only to those counties that have a current FEMA-approved LMS. Project applications will be considered only if:

- (1) The application is accompanied by an endorsement by the LMS Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson stating that the project is included in the current LMS; and,
- (2) If more than one project is submitted, the endorsement indicates the prioritization. A sample project submission letter is shown in <u>Attachment *C*</u>.

The Division will attempt to fund each submitted project in priority order until the county's allocation has been exhausted. In accordance with Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) 27P-22.006, the Division uses the following tiered allocation system up until the State application deadline with FEMA: *Tier 1* 

The available HMGP funds are allocated to counties included in the relevant Presidential Disaster Declaration in proportion to each county's share of federal disaster funding from the Public Assistance (PA), Individual Assistance (IA), and Small Business Administration (SBA) Disaster Loan Program as of 120 days after a Disaster Declaration as reported by FEMA. Eligible projects submitted by each county included in the relevant Presidential Disaster Declaration will be funded in order of priority as outlined in the LMS until the allocated funds are exhausted or all eligible projects are funded. *Tier 2*  Any allocation remaining after all eligible projects in any declared county are funded shall be re-allocated to those counties included in the relevant Presidential Disaster Declaration whose allocation was not sufficient to fund all submitted eligible projects. The order of priority for re-allocating funds is detailed in <u>Attachment D</u>.

#### Tier 3

In the event that funds remain after the Tier 1 and Tier 2 processes, any remaining funds will be offered on a statewide basis as described in <u>Attachment D</u>.

Please see <u>Attachment D</u> for a detailed explanation of funding tiers.

### Funding Availability and Notification

FEMA notifies the State of HMGP funding availability at the following milestones:

#### Initial 30-Day Estimate

This is an early estimate only and not an actual commitment of funding by FEMA. Funding may increase or decrease based on actual disaster claims during the declaration period. These estimates are provided for planning purposes and to jump-start the HMGP application process.

#### Obligation prior to 12 Months

Prior to the 12-month lock-in, FEMA will only obligate funds up to 75% of any current estimate. This is to eliminate the risk of over-obligating funds for any given disaster in the event the 12-month lock-in is lower than initially estimated.

### 12 Months from the Date of Declaration

This represents the State's Lock-in Amount. It is the maximum amount available the state can expect to receive from FEMA. In rare occurrences, FEMA may conduct a

subsequent review 18 months after the declaration, but only at the request of the State. The estimate from that review may cause the final lock-in to fluctuate up or down depending on the findings.

It is important for potential applicants to recognize that HMGP funds are contingent upon FEMA's reexamination of the disaster figures at the given time intervals. A county's funding allocation can increase or decrease after application submission.

#### Technical Assistance

The Division is in the process of scheduling HMGP application development workshop webinars and will be in touch with these counties in the next few weeks to finalize dates and times. The webinars will focus on the declared counties so that their project-specific concerns can be addressed by state staff.
