PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this rule amendment

is to update and establish in rule the most recent grant program documents for the Small Matching, Special Category, and Abandoned African-American Cemeteries Grant Programs. The rule amendment would make changes to the programs' grant guidelines, grant application forms, grant award agreement forms, and other forms necessary to administer the grant programs.

SUMMARY: The proposed rule amendment would incorporate updated grant program documents as materials incorporated by reference in Rule 1A-39.001.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: The Department used a checklist to conduct an economic analysis and determine whether there is an adverse impact or regulatory costs associated with this rule that exceeds the criteria in section 120.541(2)(a), Florida Statutes. Based on this analysis, it was determined that the Department's proposed rule does not increase fees or otherwise impose any other costs, directly or indirectly, on the regulated industry. Based on this information, the Department determined there will be no adverse impact to small businesses and the potential regulatory costs of the proposed rule do not exceed any of the criteria established in section 120.541(2)(a), Florida Statutes. Additionally, no interested party submitted additional information regarding the economic impact.

53ER25-23 it's good SUMMER fun Bonus Play

SUMMARY: This emergency rule sets forth the provisions for the "it's good SUMMER fun Bonus Play." How to enter, number of winners, and available prizes.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

53ER25-23 it's good SUMMER fun Bonus Play.

(1) General Bonus Play Description.

(a) Bonus Play Period. From May 19 through June 29, 2025 (“Bonus Play Period”), the Florida Lottery will conduct the “it’s good SUMMER fun Bonus Play” (“Bonus Play”) in which Eligible tickets can be entered for chance/s to win a prize.

(b) Eligible Tickets: Non-winning Game Number 1595, Summer Cash; Game Number 1596, Guy Harvey® Florida Big Bills; Game Number 1597, Scorching Hot 7s; and Game Number 7029, Jaws Scratch-Off tickets and any PICK Daily Games™ draw game ticket of a \$1 or greater price/value (PICK games are: PICK 2™, PICK 3™, PICK 4™, and PICK 5™) purchased or issued during the Bonus Play Period. Winning Game Number 1595, Summer Cash; Game Number 1596, Guy Harvey Florida Big Bills; Game Number 1597, Scorching Hot 7s; and Game Number 7029, Jaws tickets are not eligible. Training tickets and tickets with invalid ticket numbers are not eligible. Tickets meeting the criteria described in this paragraph are “Eligible” tickets.

(c) Prizes. During the Bonus Play available prizes are: \$50,000 Polaris® Gift Certificate; \$50,000 Airstream® Gift Certificate; and \$50,000 in The Home Depot® Gift Cards. Additionally, each winner will receive \$4,500 in cash.

(2) How to Enter.

(a) To enter an Eligible ticket, a player may use the Florida Lottery's website at floralottery.com or use the Florida Lottery's Mobile Convenience App ("App").

1. Website. On the home page of the Florida Lottery's website, players click on the Promotions tab and select the “it’s good SUMMER fun Bonus Play.” Players will manually enter the 24-digit number on Eligible Scratch-off tickets and the 19-digit number shown on Eligible PICK tickets.

2. App. On the App, players select the “it’s good SUMMER fun Bonus Play” under the Promotions section. A Promotions button is located on the main menu and on the bottom navigation bar. Players will scan the bar code or manually enter the 24-digit number on Eligible Scratch-off tickets and the 19-digit number on Eligible PICK tickets.

3. Deleted Accounts. If a player deletes his/her account, whether through the App or on the Florida Lottery’s website, all account data, including ticket entries, associated with the email address used to register his/her account will also be deleted. Any entries earned will not be entered into a drawing. A player’s account cannot be reactivated using the email associated with the deactivated account. Should a player establish a new account utilizing a different email address, account data, including ticket entries, cannot be transferred to the newly established account. Tickets entered under the prior account cannot be re-entered utilizing the newly created account.

4. Regardless of whether a player chooses to participate in the Bonus Play by using the web browser or the App, the following provisions shall apply:

a. a player will be prompted to either register or login;

b. the player must use the same account login information to enter tickets;

c. the player will only be required to register one time; and

d. the player's entry history will be cumulative among the entry platforms.

(b) Any attempt by a player to use more than one account by using multiple or different email addresses, identities, registrations, logins, or any other methods will subject the player and any associated entries to disqualification. If a player wins a prize, the name a player uses to register must match the name shown on his/her identification used to make a claim, except for a person who has made a legal name change. A person who has made a legal name change must provide a copy of a marriage certificate/judgment/court order, as applicable, as proof of a differing name. Fictitious names and business names will not be accepted and shall subject the player and any associated entries to disqualification.

(c) The odds of winning depend on the number of entries submitted and received by the Lottery. All entries are subject to validation by the Lottery and will be disqualified if eligibility requirements are not met.

(d) Lottery tickets should not be mailed to the Lottery. Tickets received in the mail by the Lottery for entry into the Bonus Play will not be entered and will not be returned.

(3) Earning Entries and Prize Choice.

(a) To earn entries into a Bonus Play Drawing, a player may enter ticket numbers by scanning the barcode on the bottom of Eligible ticket/s using his/her mobile device or by manually entering the 24-digit number on Eligible Scratch-off tickets or the 19-digit number on Eligible PICK tickets on the website or Mobile App. A player may earn multiple entries during an entry period; however, a player can only win one Bonus Play Drawing prize per entry. A player may enter a maximum of 200 tickets per day. Each ticket number can only be entered one time and cannot be entered again for another drawing. Players may enter Eligible ticket/s into the Bonus Play at any time during the Bonus Play Period, except that entry capabilities on the website and App will be unavailable from 12 a.m. through 6 a.m. ET due to routine maintenance and may be unavailable at other times if there are technical difficulties. Entries must be made by 11:59:59 p.m. (ET) on the last day of a Drawing Entry Period to be entered into that drawing. See subsection (4) for Drawing Entry Periods.

(b) Number of Drawing Entries Received. For Eligible tickets, a player will receive the following entries:

*PICK Daily Games tickets cannot be entered during the first two (2) hours following their purchase.

**A PICK ticket having a purchase price that is not in an even \$1.00 increment will be rounded down to the lower dollar amount for determining the number of entries earned. For example, a \$0.50 purchase will earn no entries, a \$1.50 purchase earns the player one (1) entry, a \$2.50 purchase earns the player two (2) entries, and so forth.

(c) At the time the player enters a ticket into the Bonus Play, the player will be required to choose his/her desired prize: \$50,000 Polaris Gift Certificate plus \$4,500 Cash; \$50,000 Airstream Gift Certificate plus \$4,500 Cash; or \$50,000 in The Home Depot Gift Cards plus \$4,500 Cash. (Making a prize choice is not a guarantee of winning a prize.) Upon the player's prize choice, all entries associated with the ticket entered will be deemed entries for that prize and will not be deemed entries for any other prize in the Bonus Play. Upon the choice of a prize and entry of the associated ticket, the prize choice is final and cannot be changed. Entries associated with a given ticket cannot be divided among two or more prizes. (For example, a player enters Game Number 1597, SCORCHING HOT 7s, which has 10 entries. All 10 entries will be applied to the player's prize choice, and the 10 entries cannot be divided with one or more other prizes.) A player will make a prize choice for each ticket entered, and the prize choice for each ticket entered is independent of the prize choice for any other ticket. A player may choose the same prize for each ticket entered. The odds of winning a given prize depends on the number of entries allocated by all players for each prize.

(4) Entry Periods and Drawings. The Florida Lottery will conduct two (2) drawings during the Bonus Play. Winners for each drawing will be randomly selected from entries submitted and received before midnight (ET) of a Drawing Entry Period end date, as identified in the table below. Entries from one Drawing Entry Period are not carried over into the subsequent Drawing Entry Period. Winners will be randomly selected using a certified random number generation process. The drawing shall be public, held in Tallahassee, Florida, and witnessed by an accountant employed by an independent certified public

accounting firm. The Drawing Entry Periods, Drawing Dates, and Winner Announced dates are:

(a) Winners in Bonus Play Drawings will be announced and posted on floralottery.com on the "WINNERS ANNOUNCED" dates, set forth in the table above, or as soon thereafter as possible.

(b) In each Bonus Play Drawing, a total of twenty (20) valid entries will be drawn by the Florida Lottery. Prizes will be awarded in the quantities set forth in the table in subsection (5), below. Remaining entries will be alternates and used in the order in which they were drawn and in the order of need to select alternate prize winners in the event a prize winner cannot be notified, as set forth in subsection (7), below, or fails to timely provide required claim documentation as set forth in subsection (8), below, or in the event an entry is disqualified. A player can only win one prize in a Bonus Play drawing. If a second/subsequent entry for a player is pulled in a drawing, that second/subsequent entry will be disqualified.

(5) Available Prizes, Prize Values, and Number of Winners:

(6) Other Gift Certificates/Cards Prize Details.

(a) Polaris and Airstream Gift Certificates. Gift Certificates will be delivered to the Polaris or Airstream dealership, as

applicable, of the winner's choice and shall be designated for the winner's use at the chosen dealership. The entire Gift Certificate Prize (\$50,000) does not have to be used in a single purchase.

(b) The Home Depot Gift Cards. A player winning The Home Depot Gift Cards will be issued 25 physical Gift Cards, each with a \$2,000 value, for a grand total of \$50,000. Any Gift Cards that are lost, stolen, misplaced, mutilated, or otherwise damaged will not be reissued and, the player will not be otherwise compensated.

(c) Any purchase in excess of the prize amount and/or not covered by the Gift Certificate/Card due to provider policies are not included as part of a prize and will not be otherwise compensated.

(d) Should the entity issuing the Gift Certificates/Cards, whether under its current name, operating under another name, or otherwise merged with another entity, their parent companies, subsidiaries, divisions, banks/financial institutions, and/or other entities responsible for honoring the Gift Certificates/Cards declare bankruptcy or in any manner be unable to honor or refuse to honor the Gift Certificates/Cards awarded in this Bonus Play, no cash compensation or other manner of compensation shall be provided.

(e) Gift Certificates and Cards are not redeemable for cash and cannot be sold or transferred.

(f) Any Gift Certificates and Cards not able to be issued during the Bonus Play for any reason or not redeemed by winners will not otherwise be awarded, and no player will otherwise be compensated.

(g) Prize Values and Taxes Paid. The reportable taxable value of the Gift Certificate/Cards Prize includes the value of the Gift Certificate/Cards Prize plus the value of the federal income tax withholding paid by the Florida Lottery. (Taxes on the cash portion of a prize will not be paid by the Florida Lottery.) The retail value of the Gift Certificate/Cards Prize and the estimated reportable taxable value is:

(7) Winner Notification. The Florida Lottery will attempt to notify each winner by telephone or email using the contact information provided in the winner's registration data within one business day after the winners are posted on the Florida Lottery's website. The Florida Lottery deems the winner's registration data as the winner's official contact information. Issuing an email or leaving a telephone message on voicemail, if available, shall constitute notification. The Florida Lottery will not attempt to further locate a winner if attempts to reach the winner by telephone or email are unsuccessful. If the Florida Lottery is unable to have contact by telephone or email with a winner within ten (10) calendar days of the date the winners are posted on the Lottery's website, the winner will forfeit his/her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will select an alternate winner in accordance with subsection (4), above. If the Florida Lottery is unable to have contact by email or telephone with the alternate winner within ten (10) calendar days of the date of notification, the alternate winner will forfeit his/her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will select the next alternate winner. This process will continue until an alternate is contacted or the Florida Lottery has exhausted the list of alternates due to unsuccessful notification attempts or due to failure by a winner or an alternate winner to timely provide required claim documentation as set forth in subsection (8), below. The Florida Lottery is not responsible or liable for system failures of any sort or type, including, but not exclusively, computer failures, email service failures, and telephone/voicemail failures. If a prize cannot be awarded for any reason, the prize will not be awarded; and winners will not otherwise be compensated.

(8) How to Claim a Drawing Prize.

(a) To claim a prize won in a Bonus Play Drawing, a winner must submit to the Florida Lottery a completed Winner Claim Form DOL-173-2, Revised 2/2023, or Spanish Winner Claim Form DOL-173-2S, Revised 2/2023, and a copy of acceptable identification as set forth in the Florida Lottery's rule governing payment of prizes. Forms DOL 173-2 and DOL 173-2S are hereby incorporated by reference and may be obtained at any Florida Lottery office or retailer, from the Florida Lottery's website at floralottery.com, or by writing to: Florida Lottery, Claims Processing, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4016.

(b) A copy of the current prize payment rule (Emergency Rule 53ER23-20, Payment of Prizes) can be obtained from the Florida Lottery, Office of General Counsel, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32301.

(c) The required documents must be received by the Florida Lottery no later than ten (10) calendar days after the Florida Lottery has first notified the winner by telephone (notification by telephone is deemed complete by leaving a voicemail message, if available) or email (issuing an email

constitutes notification). If the Florida Lottery does not receive the required documents from a winner by the tenth calendar day after notification, the winner will forfeit his/her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will award the prize to an alternate winner as described in subsection (4), above. The same timeframe for a winner to return required documentation to the Florida Lottery shall apply to an alternate winner. If a winner mails (United States mail, Federal Express, UPS, or other mailing/shipping service) the required documentation to the Lottery, and the mailing is not received by the Florida Lottery by the deadline set forth herein, the Lottery will choose an alternate in accordance with subsection (4), above. The risk of mailing remains with the player. The Lottery is not responsible or liable for lost, stolen, misdirected, misplaced, damaged, destroyed, or delayed mail.

(9) Award of Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery's timely receipt of a winner's required documentation, the Florida Lottery will award the prize to that winner, subject to an analysis for Florida state-owed and child support debt.

(10) Analysis for State-Owed Debt and Child Support Debt – \$4,500 Cash Portion. Prior to the award of the \$4,500 Cash portion of a prize, winners will be analyzed for child support debt and Florida state-owed debt. If more than one prize is awarded to the winner, a separate analysis shall occur prior to payment of each prize. If the winner is identified as owing outstanding debt to any state agency or owes child support, the debt will be offset in accordance with Section 24.115, Fla. Stat. If the debt is less than \$4,500, the balance after the debt is offset shall be awarded. If the debt is greater than \$4,500, the entire \$4,500 will be applied to the outstanding debt.

(11) Taxes. Except as specifically defined herein, all federal, state, and/or local taxes and/or other costs and fees on all prizes will be the responsibility of winners. The reporting and subsequent payment of any additional federal, state, and/or local taxes shall be the responsibility of winners.

(12) A player can only win one prize in a Bonus Play drawing.

(13) A winner in this Bonus Play is not required to submit the Eligible ticket he or she entered to claim a prize.

(14) Other Restrictions and Provisions.

(a) A player must be at least 18 years of age.

(b) All prizes are subject to the provisions of Chapter 24, Fla. Stat., and rules promulgated thereunder. Prizes will be paid in accordance with the Florida Lottery's rule governing payment of prizes, Emergency Rule 53ER23-20, Payment of Prizes. DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION NOTICE OF INTENT TO GRANT VARIANCE

The Department of Environmental Protection gives notice of its intent to grant a variance under Section 403.201, F.S., from the provisions of Rule 62-302.530(70), F.A.C., to the Iluka Resources, Inc. The file has been assigned (File No. MMR_131098-081, OGC No. 24-2284). The variance will allow temporary relief from the turbidity standard in six mitigated wetlands not meeting water quality standards for turbidity in conditions where there is no practicable method to reduce turbidity beyond long-term natural processes. The project is located at the Green Cove Mine in Sections 8, 9, 16, 17, 20, 21, 28, and 29 in Township 7 South, Range 26 East; and in Section 24, Township 7 South, Range 25 East. The variance is being granted because the petitioner has demonstrated there is no practicable means known or available for the adequate control of the pollution involved. The Department's file on this matter is available for public inspection during normal business hours, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except legal holidays, at the Department of Environmental Protection, Mining and Mitigation Program, MS 3577, 2600 Blair Stone

Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400; telephone (850)245-7554; MiningAndMitigation@floridadep.gov during normal business hours, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except legal holidays.

This action is final and effective on the date filed with the Clerk of the Department unless a petition for an administrative hearing is timely filed under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S., before the deadline for filing a petition. On the filing of a timely and sufficient petition, this action will not be final and effective until further order of the Department.

Because the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate final agency action, the hearing process may result in a modification of the agency action or even denial of the application.

A person whose substantial interests are affected by the Department's action may petition for an administrative proceeding (hearing) under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S. Pursuant to Rule 28-106.201, F.A.C., a petition for an administrative hearing must contain the following information:

(a) The name and address of each agency affected and each agency's file or identification number, if known; (b) The name, address, any e-mail address, any facsimile number, and telephone number of the petitioner, if the petitioner is not represented by an attorney or a qualified representative; the name, address, and telephone number of the petitioner's representative, if any, which shall be the address for service purposes during the course of the proceeding; and an explanation of how the petitioner's substantial interests will be affected by the agency determination; A statement of when and how the petitioner received notice of the agency decision; (c) A statement of all disputed issues of material fact. If there are none, the petition must so indicate; (d) A concise statement of the ultimate facts alleged, including the specific facts that the petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the agency's proposed action; (e) A statement of the specific rules or statutes that the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the agency's proposed action, including an explanation of how the alleged facts relate to the specific rules or statutes; and (f) A statement of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action that the petitioner wishes the agency to take with respect to the agency's proposed action.

The petition must be filed (received by the Clerk) in the Office of General Counsel of the Department at 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Mail Station 35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000, or via electronic correspondence at AgencyClerk@dep.state.fl.us. Also, a copy of the petition shall be mailed to the applicant at the address indicated above at the time of filing.

Petitions for an administrative hearing must be filed within 14 days of publication of the notice or within 14 days of receipt of the written notice, whichever occurs first.

Under Section 120.60(3), F.S., however, any person who has asked the Department for notice of agency action may file a petition within 14 days of receipt of such notice, regardless of the date of publication. The failure to file a petition within the appropriate time period shall constitute a waiver of that person's right to request an administrative hearing under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S., or to intervene in this proceeding and participate as a party to it. Any subsequent intervention (in a proceeding initiated by another party) will be only at the discretion of the presiding officer upon the filing of a motion in compliance with Rule 28-106.205, F.A.C.

Under subsection 62-110.106(4), F.A.C., a person whose substantial interests are affected by the Department's action may also request an extension of time to file a petition for an administrative hearing. The Department may, for good cause shown, grant the request for an extension of time. Requests for extension of time must be filed with the Office of General Counsel of the Department at 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Mail Station 35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000, before the applicable deadline for filing a petition for an administrative hearing. A timely request for extension of time shall toll the running of the time period for filing a petition until the request is acted upon.

Mediation is not available in this proceeding.

Once this decision becomes final, any party to this action has the right to seek judicial review pursuant to Section 120.68, F.S., by filing a Notice of Appeal pursuant to Rules 9.110 and 9.190, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure, with the Clerk of the Department in the Office of General Counsel, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, M.S. 35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000; and by filing a copy of the Notice of Appeal accompanied by the applicable filing fees with the appropriate District Court of Appeal. The Notice of Appeal must be filed within 30 days from the date this action is filed with the Clerk of the Department.
