PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The proposed rule amendments arise from JAPC's reviews of dentistry rules that were part of the 1st year of the 5-year rule review that state agencies are undergoing. The changes set forth the effective date of accreditation standards adopted by the board teaching hospitals and eliminates vague open-ended requirements for information required by the Board for obtaining a teaching permit.

SUMMARY: To update the rule text regarding the issuance of teaching permits.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

(1) There is a planned change to the CASH POP draw game, which is the addition of a \$20 price point to the dollar amount play selections.

(2) In preparation for the addition of the \$20 price point, the functions below will be suspended:

(a) The ability to make a consecutive draw choice will be suspended after midnight, ET, on August 7, 2026; and

(b) After the close of the 11:45 p.m. (ET) draw on August 9, 2026, CASH POP and GROUPER® Super Sampler ticket sales will be suspended.

(3) All game functions and options resume on Monday, August 10, 2026 at 6:00 a.m. (ET).

(4) Except as provided herein, all other provisions of Rule 53ER23-45 shall remain in full force and effect.

SUMMARY: This emergency rule describes the CASH POP™ draw game and sets forth the specifics of the game; determination of prizewinners; estimated odds of winning; and value of prizes in the game.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

53ER26-40 CASH POP™.

(1) How to Play CASH POP™.

(a) CASH POP is a Draw lottery game (also known as an online terminal game) in which a player selects one number from 1 through 15, inclusive, for a chance to win a cash prize. The selection of a single number is one (1) “play.”

(b) Players may choose play amounts of \$1.00, \$2.00, \$5.00, \$10.00, or \$20.00 per play. The play amount will determine the possible cash prize generated by the system. The prize structure and odds are set forth in subsection (2).

(c) For purposes of this rule, a “playslip” is defined as an original paper playslip issued and approved by the Florida Lottery for the CASH POP game or a digital playslip for the CASH POP game generated using the Florida Lottery Mobile Convenience app (“app”). Except where necessary to differentiate between a paper playslip and a digital playslip, the term “playslip” shall be inclusive of both types of playslips.

(d) Players may make their CASH POP ticket selections by: using a playslip; using a Florida Lottery vending machine (“vending machine”), if a vending machine for Draw game ticket purchases is available at the retailer location; telling the retailer their desired selections; or by requesting the Play it Again feature.

(e) Playslip.

1. Paper Playslips.

a. A CASH POP paper playslip contains five (5) panels. The manner of play described in this section is for a single panel; each of the five panels is played in the same manner. Each panel has three (3) sections.

(I) The first section lists numbers one (1) to fifteen (15). On a playslip, a player must mark at least one number to play. A player may mark additional numbers, up to fifteen, for additional plays. A player may mark the “Play All” spot to play all fifteen numbers. All numbers chosen are played in the next available drawing. A player may also mark Quick Pick (QP) for the terminal to randomly select one number. A player will mark his/her desired choice/s using blue or black ink or a pencil.

(II) In the second section of a panel on a playslip, a player will mark the dollar amount he/she wishes to play. The possible play amounts are \$1.00, \$2.00, \$5.00, \$10.00, or \$20.00. Only one (1) play amount can be chosen per panel on a playslip, and the play amount chosen will be applied to each number played in that panel. If a player does not mark a dollar amount, the default will be \$1.00.

(III) In the third section of a panel on the playslip, a player may select the number of consecutive drawings he/she wishes

to play. (Consecutive drawings are also known as advance play.) The number of consecutive drawing choices are one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4), five (5), or ten (10). The count for the number of consecutive drawings includes the next available drawing at the time a ticket is purchased. For example, choosing four (4) consecutive drawings will give the player a total of four (4) drawings, the next available drawing plus the next three (3) drawings for a total of four (4). If a player chooses one (1) consecutive drawing, only the next available drawing is played, and the player will have no additional drawings played. The number/s played and play amount will be the same for each consecutive drawing. Only one value for the number of consecutive drawings can be chosen on a panel. If no number of consecutive drawings is chosen, the play is for the next available drawing only.

b. A separate ticket will be produced for each panel and for each drawing. A system-generated prize amount will print beneath each number played. For each consecutive drawing, if any, a separate ticket will print, and the prize amount/s may differ for the number/s played. The prize amount/s in a subsequent drawing are not determinative or dependent on the prize amount/s of a previous drawing.

c. Players should carefully check their playslip for accuracy of their desired selections since CASH POP tickets cannot be canceled. If an error is made in a panel, the player will mark the Void box. Marking the Void box will apply to all choices made in a panel.

d. The total cost to play one panel on a ticket is equal to the number of numbers played times the play amount times the number of consecutive draws.

e. Paper playslips must be Florida Lottery approved. Paper playslips may be processed through a Florida Lottery full-service vending machine or processed by a Florida Lottery retailer to obtain a ticket.

2. Digital Playslip. How to Create a Digital Playslip. From the Landing Page on the app, a player should select the CASH POP game icon and then click on “Pick Numbers.” The player may either select his or her numbers from one (1) through (15) or use the “Random Numbers” or “Shake to Play” feature for the app to provide the player a random number. A player must also select the play amount (\$1.00, \$2.00, \$5.00, \$10.00, or \$20.00), which will apply to all numbers played, and, if more than the default of one drawing is desired, select the number of consecutive drawings. Players may also use the “My Favorites” feature to save the digital playslip for later use. Once a digital playslip is created and the player clicks “Create Playslip,” a barcode will be displayed. The player will present the barcode appearing on his/her mobile device to the retailer to purchase a ticket through the retailer terminal or may use the barcode to purchase a ticket through a vending machine that provides for Draw game purchases. Illustrative instructions for creating a

CASH POP digital playslip are available by clicking on the “How to Play” button on the main CASH POP page.

(f) Vending Machine. If a vending machine is available at a retailer location and if the vending machine has the options set forth herein, the vending machine may be used by a player to make Quick Pick (QP) selections; manual selections; and process both paper and digital CASH POP playslips.

(g) Telling the Retailer. Retailers are authorized to manually enter player choices. Players electing to make their CASH POP ticket selections by telling the retailer must specify the number/s desired to be played, the play amount, and the consecutive number of drawings. A player may also tell the retailer to use the Quick Pick feature for the terminal to randomly select one or more numbers (1 through 15). If Quick Pick is chosen by a player, a player must also tell the retailer the play amount and the number of consecutive drawings desired.

(h) Play it Again.

1. A player may request to “Play it Again” to replay a previously purchased CASH POP ticket. If requested, a retailer shall process the original ticket provided by the player and print new ticket/s which will have the same selected number/s, play amount, and number of consecutive drawings as the original ticket, except as provided in subparagraph (1)(h)2. New possible prize amount/s will be generated.

2. In the event of a Lottery decision to step down the CASH POP game, an original ticket will be rejected and cannot be replayed if the number of drawings on the ticket exceeds the number of drawings that are available at the time of requested ticket replay. Tickets older than sixty (60) days cannot be replayed.

(2) CASH POP Prizes and Odds.

(a) The odds of any one of the numbers, one (1) through fifteen (15), coming up in a drawing are 1 in 15.

(b) Odds of winning a given prize for a single number, for each play amount:

(c) The CASH POP prize structure will be replenished automatically as each ticket is sold in each prize tier. The odds remain the same as set forth above.

(3) CASH POP Drawings.

(a) CASH POP game drawings are conducted five times daily, seven days per week, for the approximate times: 8:45:05

a.m.; 11:45:05 a.m.; 2:45:05 p.m.; 6:45:05 p.m.; and 11:45:05 p.m. All times are Eastern Time (ET). Ticket sales for a specific CASH POP drawing will close approximately five (5) seconds prior to that drawing. Any ticket sold after the close will be printed with the next available CASH POP draw date and time. Draw times and dates cannot be chosen by a player, and tickets purchased are for the next available drawing. Any consecutive drawings chosen by a player are those directly after the next available drawing.

(b) One number from one (1) through fifteen (15) will be selected in each drawing. Computer automated drawings will be used and verified by a certified public accounting firm. Animated versions/digital reveals will be available on the Florida Lottery’s website. Players may also use the Florida Lottery app, visit a Lottery retailer, or call (850)921-PLAY (7529) to obtain the winning number and/or check their ticket to see if it’s a winner.

(c) The Florida Lottery shall not be responsible for incorrect circulation, publication, or broadcast of official winning numbers.

(4) CASH POP Rules and Prohibitions.

(a) By purchasing a CASH POP ticket, the player agrees to comply with and abide by all rules and regulations of the Florida Lottery and applicable law.

(b) CASH POP prize payments, taxation, deadlines for claiming, and other related matters shall be in accordance with rules of the Florida Lottery governing payment of prizes. A copy of the current rule can be obtained from the Florida Lottery, Office of the General Counsel, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4011.

(c) Subject to retailer hours of operation and gaming system availability, CASH POP lottery tickets are available for purchase daily between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and midnight, Eastern Time (ET).

(d) CASH POP tickets cannot be canceled.

53ER26-41 Retailer Incentive: August 10 – September 21, 2026.

(1) General Incentive Provisions.

(a) Incentive Period: August 10 – September 21, 2026, dates inclusive.

(b) Participating Games: All Scratch-Off games. “All” Scratch-Off games include any Scratch-Off game available, or had been available, for sale during the respective timeframes, defined in subparagraph (1)(c)1., and PICK Daily Games™ (PICK 2™, PICK 3™, PICK 4™, and PICK 5™) with/without FIREBALL, collectively PICK, and CASH POP™ Draw Games.

(c) There are two (2) comparison periods; One for Scratch-Off game sales and one for combined PICK and CASH POP Draw Game sales.

1. Scratch-Off Games: August 10 – September 20, 2026 (hereafter 2026) to be compared with August 11 – September 21, 2025 (hereafter 2025).

2. PICK and CASH POP Draw Games: August 10 – September 20, 2026 (hereafter 2026) to be compared with August 11 – September 21, 2025 (hereafter 2025).

(d) Incentive Awards Available. One thousand dollars (\$1,000) and five hundred dollars (\$500) related to the Scratch-Off portion of the Incentive. Five hundred dollars (\$500) related to the PICK and CASH POP portion of the Incentive.

(e) Retailer Eligibility Requirements.

1. This Incentive is open to Florida Lottery Retailers that have been actively and continuously contracted with the Lottery, with no contractual breaches, from August 11, 2025 through and including September 21, 2026. Retailers selling draw games from their sales counter/Flex terminal beginning August 11, 2025 are eligible for an Incentive award for both the Scratch-Off and PICK and CASH POP portions of this Incentive. Retailers must be active and selling for the full duration of the Incentive Period and comparable prior year period to receive an Incentive award.

2. Temporary suspensions (for other than contractual breaches) do not disqualify a Retailer location as long it has recorded sales for the 2025 and 2026 periods.

3. Ticket sales through vending machines will be included. However, Retailers who sell tickets only through vending machines are excluded from participating in this Incentive.

4. If a Retailer has more than one (1) location, each location will be considered independently.

5. Retailers having a change in ownership between the 2025 periods and the 2026 periods are not eligible.

(2) Scratch-Off Game Requirements.

(a) Scratch-Off Game Book Activations.

1. Scratch-Off Games Launching August 10, 2026. All three (3) Scratch-Off games launching on August 10, 2026 (Game 1641, Power 20X; Game 1642, \$500,000 Cash Blitz; and Game 5063, Ca\$h in Hand) ticket books must be activated between 6:00 a.m. and 11:59 p.m. (ET) on August 10, 2026.

2. Scratch-Off Games Launching September 21, 2026. All five (5) Scratch-Off games launching on September 21, 2026 (Game 1643, Wild 9s; Game 1644, Money Roll; Game 1645, Black Pearls; Game 1646, \$2,000,000 Spectacular; and Game 1647, \$15,000,000 Platinum Payout) ticket books must be activated between 6:00 a.m. and 11:59 p.m. (ET) on September 21, 2026.

3. A minimum of one (1) book must be activated for each Scratch-Off game listed above. If a Retailer satisfies all other requirements set forth in this Emergency Rule and does not activate all of the games’ ticket books as described herein, the Retailer is not eligible to receive a Scratch-Off Incentive award.

(b) Minimum Sales. A Retailer must have: A minimum of \$300 in total Scratch-Off sales for the 2025 period; a minimum of \$600 in total Scratch-Off sales for the 2026 period; and based on their assigned Tier, the minimum sales percentage increase for the 2026 period over the 2025 period, as set forth in the table in paragraph (2)(d). (A Retailer must have the minimum Scratch-Off sales for both the 2025 and 2026 periods to qualify for an Incentive award, irrespective of the percentage increase over the 2025 period.)

(c) Based on Scratch-Off 2025 period sales, Retailers will be placed into one of four Tiers (Tiers 1 – 4). The 2025 period Scratch-Off sales will be compared to the 2026 period Scratch-Off sales.

(d) Tiers, Total Scratch-Off Ticket Sales for the 2025 Period, and Minimum Sales Percentage Increase for the 2026 Period over the 2025 Period are:

(f) Scratch-Off sales will be measured based on book settlement. The Lottery reserves the right to review book settlement and return practices to ensure validity of the final results.

(3) PICK and CASH POP Draw Game Requirements.

(a) Minimum Sales. A Retailer must have a minimum of \$4,000 in combined PICK and CASH POP Draw Game sales for both the 2025 and 2026 periods.

(b) Based on their 2025 combined PICK and CASH POP Draw Game sales, Retailers will be placed into one of four Tiers (Tiers 1 – 4) (reference the table in paragraph (3)(c)). The 2025 period combined PICK and CASH POP Draw Game sales will be compared to the 2026 period sales. Retailers with the greatest percentage increase in 2026 period sales over their 2025 period sales may be eligible for an Incentive award. (A Retailer must have the minimum combined PICK and CASH POP Draw Game sales for both the 2025 and 2026 periods to qualify for an Incentive award, irrespective of a percentage increase over the 2025 period.)

(c) PICK and CASH POP Draw Game Sales for the 2025 period and Number of \$500 Incentive Awards by Tier:

(d) A Retailer's percentage change for combined PICK and CASH POP Draw Games sales must exceed the state-wide combined PICK and CASH POP Draw Games sales percentage change (2025 period versus the 2026 period).

(4) All percentage sales changes will be calculated to two (2) decimal points. In the event of a tie for either Scratch-Off sales or combined PICK and CASH POP Draw Game sales, an Incentive award will be based on a Retailer's highest percentage increase of combined PICK, CASH POP, and FANTASY 5® with/without EZmatch™ Draw Game sales during the 2026 Incentive Period compared to the 2025 Incentive Period. If a second tie-breaker is required, an Incentive award will be based on a Retailer's highest percentage increase of total Lottery sales (all draw games, including those that are not part of this Incentive, plus all Scratch-Offs) during the 2026 Incentive Period compared to the 2025 Incentive Period.

(5) Payment Provisions.

(a) Incentive Awards Deemed Compensation. All Incentive awards are deemed compensation and will be reported to the IRS (Internal Revenue Service).

(b) Incentive Award Payments. Retailers will be paid Incentive awards via check. For any check that has been uncashed within 90 days of issuance, and if the Retailer is in arrearage to the Florida Lottery, the funds issued for the Incentive award shall be applied to the balance owed.

(c) A Retailer must be active and in good contractual standing at the time an Incentive award is distributed to receive its Incentive award; this is irrespective of whether the Retailer would otherwise qualify.

(d) Incentive awards that are not awarded, or are unable to be awarded, for any reason will not otherwise be awarded.

(e) If there is a conflict with a provision set forth in this Emergency Rule and any flyers, brochures, promotional materials, including, but not limited to, point of sale, television, radio and print advertising, and other promotional media/materials, the terms of this Emergency Rule shall prevail.
