PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The proposed rules update incorporated National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) national standards and department forms, update references to incorporated material, amend qualifier competency requirements and the testing timeframe, provide disclosure requirements related to consumer safety, provide a definition, and update the penalty rules.

SUMMARY: The proposed rules incorporate the most recent NFPA national standards, update form and standard references, incorporate updated department forms, reflect changes in qualifier competency requirements and testing timeframe, add a definition of "working day", and update the penalty rules. These amendments ensure most current national standards are adopted and that registration applications, qualifier eligibility

requirements, testing timeframe, added consumer protection, and penalty rules implement recent statutory changes by chapter 2024-170, Laws of Florida. The amendments will streamline the overall application process and will be statutorily compliant with Chapter 527, Florida Statutes.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: The department's economic analysis of the adverse impact of potential regulatory costs of the proposed rule did not exceed any of the criteria established in Section 120.541(2)(a), Florida Statutes. The proposed rules are being amended to comply with statutory changes, update incorporated forms, national standards, references to incorporated material, qualifier eligibility, testing requirements, consumer protection, definition, and penalties. There are no increased regulatory costs associated with these revisions. No interested party submitted additional information regarding the economic impact.

published in NFPA 58, Liquefied Petroleum Gas Code, 2024 ~~2020~~ Edition, for gas appliances and gas piping as published in NFPA 54, National Fuel Gas Code, 2024 ~~2018~~ Edition, and for emergency power supply as published in NFPA 110, Standard for Emergency and Standby Power Systems, 2025 ~~2016~~ Edition, shall be the accepted standards for this state and are hereby adopted and incorporated by reference. The LP Gas Code Handbook, NFPA 58, 2024 ~~2020~~ Edition, and the National Fuel Gas Code Handbook, NFPA 54, 2024 ~~2018~~ Edition, are hereby adopted and incorporated by reference and shall be utilized by the department as a guide in interpreting the provisions of chapter 527, F.S. (1) Conviction of or pleading guilty or nolo contendere to a felony involving moral turpitude; or

(1) Any system or container that fails to comply with Chapter 527, F.S., this rule chapter, and any standards incorporated by reference shall be designated unsafe by department staff by means of issuance of a ~~FDACS-10988, Stop Use Order. Rev. 02/17, as incorporated by reference in Rule 5J-22.002, F.A.C.,~~ to the operator of the system or container.

(2) Containers or systems under stop use order shall not continue in service until all violations have been corrected and the Stop Use Order is released ~~removed~~ by department staff ~~by means of issuance of FDACS-03209, Release, Rev. 02/17, as incorporated by reference in Rule 5J-22.002, F.A.C.~~

5J-20.028 Installation of Containers on Roofs of Buildings.

Installation of containers on roofs of buildings as referenced in NFPA 58, Section ~~6.8.9~~ ~~6.8.7~~, as incorporated by reference in Rule 5J-20.002, F.A.C., is prohibited.

5J-20.047 Connecting or Disconnecting Containers or Systems; Notice to Owner; Transportation.

(1) As used in this rule chapter, “working day” means the period from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. occurring on any day Monday through Friday, excluding state holidays.

~~(2)(1)~~ No person, firm or corporation, other than the owner and those authorized by the owner, shall connect or disconnect any container, or system containing liquefied petroleum gas,

except in an out-of-gas situation, unless due and sufficient notice has been given by any person, firm, or corporation to the owner of the container or system prior to disconnecting or connecting such container or system. Due and sufficient notice shall be received by the owner at least two full (2) working days prior to installing the container or system of said person, firm, or corporation, and shall be evidenced by a signed receipt. Partial working days will not be counted. Acceptable evidence of receipt of notification shall be a signed certified mail receipt, signed receipt of hand delivery, email delivery confirmation, or facsimile transmission receipt. If, after two full working days, the container or system has not been disconnected by the owner, the said person, firm, or corporation, may then disconnect downstream of the system regulator or meter. It shall be mandatory that the person, firm, or corporation who so disconnects any such container, whether empty or full, upon the premises of a consumer, does so in a manner that renders the container tight with valves turned off, the container service valve plugged with brass or steel fittings, and all other container or system openings properly plugged. In addition, any container or system disconnected must be done so in a manner that is in compliance with the requirements of NFPA 58, as incorporated by reference in Rule 5J-20.002, F.A.C. Notices of disconnect shall expire after 30 days. If the container or system is not disconnected prior to the expiration of the disconnect notice, a new notice of disconnect must be issued in compliance with the provisions of this rule.

5J-20.052 Consumer Safety.

(1) The installation of liquefied petroleum gas powered generators must be completed by a licensed Category I LP Gas Dealer or Category V LP Gas Installer.

(2) When a liquefied petroleum gas powered generator is installed by a Category V LP Gas Installer, the initial fill of liquefied petroleum gas may be provided by a Category I LP Gas Dealer based upon a contractual agreement with the Category V LP Gas Installer. The name, address, phone number, and license number of the Category I LP Gas Dealer providing this service must be disclosed on the installation contract with the consumer. All future purchases and deliveries of liquefied petroleum gas to the consumer must be contracted or arranged directly with a Category I LP Gas Dealer.

(3) Any proposal, estimate, quote, or contract related to the installation of a liquefied petroleum gas powered generator for use by a consumer must disclose, and be acknowledged by signature of the consumer, the estimated operating time of the proposed installation. The operating time is the amount of time,

at maximum load applied to the generator, that the consumer can expect the system to operate based on the proposed liquefied petroleum gas storage capacity offered as part of the installed system or the pre-existing tank.

(4) The department may waive the requirements of Section 527.07, Florida Statutes, during a state of emergency as declared by an executive order of the Governor or if a liquefied petroleum system is deemed unsafe by the department. The department shall issue such waivers in writing to a licensed Category I LP Gas Dealer. Any such waiver shall expire 30 days from the issue date unless otherwise specified in the waiver.

5J-20.061 Qualifier and Master Qualifier Examinations; Applicant Qualifications and Testing Requirements.

(1) Applicants for examination for competency must submit FDACS-03584 LP Gas Qualifier and Master Qualifier Registration Application, Rev. 08/26 ~~09/20~~, as incorporated by reference in Rule 5J-20.004, F.A.C., along with the required non-refundable examination fee set forth in Section 527.0201(1) or 527.0201(5)(a), F.S.

(2) No change.

(3) The examination for competency must be completed within 90 days after the application has been accepted by the department.

(4)(3) Testing Requirements – Areas of competency.

(a) Qualifiers:

1. through 4. No change.

5. As evidence of reasonable competency and qualification, Category I and Category V Qualifier applicants must have a minimum of 1 year of verifiable experience in the liquefied petroleum gas industry within the 10 years preceding submission of the application for Qualifier examination. Acceptable experience shall include work with a liquefied petroleum gas company where the applicant performed activities that fall within one or more of the following categories:

a. Maintenance of gas facilities and equipment.

b. Gas storage and distribution facility operations and safety.

c. Gas transportation, delivery, product transfer.

d. Gas tanks, cylinders and equipment.

e. Gas liquid and vapor distribution systems and equipment.

f. Gas equipment and appliance service, installation and repair.

(b) No change.

~~(5)(4)~~ All areas of competency as described in subsection ~~(4) (2)~~ above shall be given equal weight during grading of the examination.

5J-20.064 Renewal of Qualifier and Master Qualifier Certificates.

In order to renew their qualification, all Qualifiers and Master Qualifiers shall submit a renewal fee, registration application and documentation of a minimum of 16 continuing education hours using FDACS-03584, LP Gas Qualifier and Master Qualifier Registration Application, Rev. 08/26 05/19, as incorporated by reference in Rule 5J-20.004, F.A.C.

5J-20.065 Re-examination Procedures.

An applicant who fails any part of an examination is eligible to be re-examined on those parts failed. The applicant must submit FDACS-03584 LP Gas Qualifier and Master Qualifier Registration Application, Rev. 08/26 05/19, as incorporated by reference in Rule 5J-20.004, F.A.C., and the applicable non-refundable examination fee as set forth in either Sections 527.0201(1) or 527.0201(5)(a), F.S., for the type of examination being taken. Re-examinations must be completed within 90 calendar days of the original examination; however, no examinee is permitted to retake the failed examination more than two times within the 90-day period. If the applicant does not successfully complete and obtain a passing grade on the examination re-take within the 90-day period, the examinee shall be given a failing grade. After a 30-day period, the applicant must reapply to retake the entire examination.

5J-20.080 Enforcement Actions and Administrative Penalties.

(1) through (2) No change.

(3) Stop Use Orders. The department shall issue a ~~FDACS-10988, Stop Use Order, Rev. 02/17, as incorporated by reference in Rule 5J-22.002, F.A.C.~~, whenever necessary to effectuate the statutory duties of the department in the interests of public health, safety, and welfare and to promote public safety where the installation, operation, maintenance, or condition of a liquefied petroleum gas container or system, including a cylinder storage unit, fails to comply with the codes

adopted in Rule 5J-20.002, F.A.C., or with any provision of Chapter 527, F.S., or this rule chapter.

(4) through (5) No change.

(6) Notice of noncompliance. Any department investigation or inspection that reveals minor violations of this rule chapter for which the department has reason to believe that the violator was unaware of the rule or unclear as to how to comply with it, will result in the issuance of a notice of noncompliance as the department's first response to the violation. The following shall be considered minor violations for which a notice of noncompliance shall be issued for the first occurrence only:

(a) through (d) No change.

~~(e) Conducting LP gas activities as defined in Section 527.01, F.S., under the Category IV, or Category VI, licensure categories, without a license, including while any licensure application is pending, where the unlicensed activity did not contribute to or cause an LP-gas related accident.~~

(f) through (g) renumbered (e) through (f) No change.

(g) Failure to include the name and qualifier number of the person providing services as required by Section 527.067(2), F.S.

(7) Violations. For the purposes of imposing the penalties and enforcement actions provided for in Sections 527.13 and 527.14, F.S., violations shall be designated as either Tier I or Tier II.

(a) Tier I Violations. Tier I violations shall result in imposition of a fine of up to \$1,000. The following violations shall be considered Tier I violations:

1. through 4. No change.

~~5. Except as otherwise stated in paragraph (6)(e), above, Conducting LP gas activities as defined in section 527.01, F.S., without a license, including while any licensure application is pending, or while the license is inoperative because of failure to renew, or conducting LP gas activities after the qualification status of the duly-designated Qualifier or Master Qualifier has expired, where the unlicensed activity did not contribute to or cause an LP-gas related accident.~~

6. through 12. No change.

13. Selling, filling, refilling, delivering, or using an LP gas container for fuel ~~any gas or compound, or for any other purpose, without permission of the owner,~~ in violation of Section 527.07, F.S.

14. through 19. No change.

20. Failure to disclose, with consumer signature, the estimated operating time of a generator as required by Rule 5J-20.052, F.A.C.

(1) Purpose. This rule implements section 332.136, F.S., establishing an airport pilot program for the Sarasota Manatee Airport Authority to further the long-term feasibility of alternative airport permitting procedures, such as those provided in sections 553.80, 1013.30, 1013.33, and 1013.371, F.S.

(2) Definitions. As used in this rule, the following terms have the following meanings, unless the context indicates another or different meaning or intent:

(a) "Airport" shall mean the Sarasota Bradenton International Airport, located in unincorporated Sarasota and Manatee Counties and the municipality of Sarasota.

(b) "Airport grounds" shall mean all lands owned by the authority.

(c) "Authority" shall mean the Sarasota Manatee Airport Authority, an independent special district created by Chapter 2003-309, Laws of Florida, as amended, which is the owner and operator of the Airport.

(d) "Host local government" means:

1. The municipality or county that would, in the absence of the exemption provided by this section, exercise jurisdiction to enforce permitting requirements, plan reviews, building and zoning requirements, and inspection fees for existing and proposed development within the airport boundaries, whether undertaken by the authority, itself, or by one of its tenants; or

2. A unit of local government that is responsible for maintaining public facilities serving the airport.

(3) Updated airport master plan.

(a) The authority shall prepare and adopt an updated airport master plan in accordance with 49 U.S.C. section 47101 and section 333.06(4), F.S., which shall be subject to review and acceptance by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT).

(b) The updated airport master plan must address public facilities and services including roads, sanitary sewer, solid

waste, drainage, potable water, parks and recreation, and public transportation. For each such facility or service, it shall identify the level-of-service standard established by the applicable host local government, identify the entity that will provide the service to the airport, and describe any financial arrangements between the authority and other entities relating to the provision of the facility or service. It shall also determine the impact of existing and proposed airport development reasonably expected over the term of the airport master plan on each service or facility and any deficiencies in such service or facility which the development will create or to which it will contribute.

(c) Before adopting the updated airport master plan, the authority shall send a draft of it to the host local governments who shall have 90 days to conduct a review and provide comments to the airport authority. Within 10 days thereafter, the authority shall advertise the commencement of this review period in a newspaper of general circulation. It shall also hold an informal informational session for public participation, which shall be announced in the advertisement at least 10 days in advance. Following receipt and consideration of all comments, the authority shall hold a public hearing, after which, it may adopt the updated airport master plan as originally drafted, or as it might be revised based on the comments received from the local governments and members of the public.

(d) Upon adoption by the authority and acceptance by the FAA and FDOT:

1. The updated airport master plan shall be published on the authority's website, and it shall be updated thereafter at least every 10 years; and

2. The updated airport master plan shall be a permissive alternative to compliance by the authority with local government land development regulations.

(4) Exclusive Local Enforcement Agency. Upon adoption of an updated airport master plan in accordance with this rule, the authority shall constitute the exclusive local enforcement agency under Part IV of Chapter 553, F.S., having jurisdiction within the lands subject to the airport master plan, to conduct plans reviews, issue permits, and make inspections of buildings and to enforce and to ensure compliance with the Florida Building Code and the Florida Fire Prevention Code regarding development undertaken within the airport boundaries, whether undertaken by the authority, itself, or by one of its tenants. The authority must use personnel or contract providers appropriately certified under Part XII of Chapter 468, F.S., to perform the plan reviews and inspections required by the codes. Such improvements shall be exempt from all other state building codes, county or municipal land development regulations, building codes, permitting requirements, plan reviews, or inspection fees, except as provided in section 553.80, F.S.

(5) Preemption. Except as otherwise provided herein, this section supersedes the requirements of Part II of Chapter 163, F.S., and all existing land use approvals granted by local governments to the authority upon adoption of an updated airport master plan in accordance with the provisions of this rule.

(6) By December 1, 2027, FDOT shall submit recommendations to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives about how to expand the pilot program to additional airports, amend the pilot program to increase its effectiveness, or terminate the pilot program.

(1) Pursuant to section 400.506(12), F.S., each nurse registry shall prepare and maintain a written comprehensive emergency management plan, in accordance with the ~~Comprehensive~~ Emergency Management Planning Criteria Plan for Nurse Registries, AHCA Form 3110-1017, ~~March 2026~~ ~~May 2015~~, incorporated by reference and available at <https://flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-19581> <https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-05234>. This document is available from the Agency for Health Care Administration at <https://ahca.myflorida.com/health-quality-assurance/emergency-preparedness-resources> http://ahca.myflorida.com/MCHQ/Emergency_Activities/index.shtml. The plan shall describe how the nurse registry establishes and maintains an effective response to emergencies

(2) The nurse registry shall review its emergency management plan on an annual basis and in accordance with section 408.821(1), F.S. make any substantive changes. Plans with any substantive changes will be forwarded for review to the entities identified in subsection (1).

(3) A significant modification to a previously approved plan must be submitted within 30 days after the change. For the purposes of this rule, “significant modification” means a change to the information provided in support of the minimum required plan criteria, procedures, memorandums of understanding, contracts, or agreements identified in the plan, or appendices that alters the execution of the plan and the required arrangements made therein. Changes in spelling or grammar are not considered significant modifications for the purposes of this rule. Changes in the telephone numbers of those administrative staff who are coordinating the nurse registry’s emergency response must be reported to the county emergency management office and to the county health department. For nurse registries with multiple counties on their license, the changes must be reported to each county health department and each county emergency management office. The phone telephone numbers must include numbers where the coordinating staff can be contacted outside of the nurse registry’s regular office hours. All nurse registries must report these changes, whether their plan has been previously reviewed or not, as defined in subsection (1).

(a) Changes in the name, address, phone number, email address or position of staff identified in the plan are not considered significant modifications for the purposes of this rule. Changes to that information must be submitted to the county emergency management agency as part of the emergency management plan submitted annually. For nurse registries with multiple counties on their license, the changes must be reported to each county health department and each county emergency management office.

(b) Changes in the phone numbers of the administrative staff who are coordinating the nurse registry’s emergency response must be reported to the county emergency management office and to the county health department. The phone numbers must include numbers where the coordinating staff can be contacted outside of the nurse registry’s regular office hours.

(c) If a change to the emergency management plan is required to be submitted due to a significant modification, the change must be identified and described.

(d) A change to the emergency management plan due to a significant modification does not alter the annual review date unless the change is due to a change of ownership of the facility.

(e) All nurse registries must report these changes, whether their plan has been previously reviewed or not, as defined in subsection (1).

Additionally, this amendment makes technical updates to certified school match programs. It adds advanced practice registered nurses and certified nursing assistants to the nursing services, includes audiologists and audiology assistants in therapy services, and updates the allowable benefits for behavioral services. This amendment to the State Plan will have no federal fiscal impact for federal fiscal year 2026-2027, and the effective date is August 17, 2026.
