PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this rulemaking is to update regulations for the harvest of wild oysters from the Big Bend, which includes Dixie, Levy, and Citrus counties. The effects of this rulemaking would be to create a new management framework for wild oyster harvest from the Big Bend that is aligned with the current state of the resource.

SUBJECT AREA TO BE ADDRESSED: The subject areas addressed in the rule development notice include additional applicable regulations; definitions; size limit; size limit tolerances; bag and vessel limits, harvest and possession limits; distribution of allowed harvest; seasons, open and closed periods; allowable gear, prohibited gear, harvest methods; sale and purchase requirements; open and closed areas; license requirements; oyster harvest monitoring; and other subjects encompassed by the above-cited rules.

6A-4.0021 Florida Teacher Certification Examinations
PURPOSE AND EFFECT: This rule amendment serves to adopt and incorporate the Competencies and Skills Required for Teacher Certification in Florida, Twenty-Ninth Edition, effective January 1, 2027, which revises the competencies and skills for the following examinations: Deaf or Hard of Hearing K–12, Elementary Education K–6 (Language Arts and Reading Subtest), English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) K–12, Prekindergarten/Primary PK–3 (Language Arts and Reading Subtest), and School Counseling PK–12.

SUMMARY: Section 1012.56(10)(b), F.S., requires the State Board of Education to specify, by rule, examination competencies and skills and establish uniform evaluation guidelines and passing scores for the Florida Teacher Certification Examinations (FTCE). Accepted professional practice for assessment programs, such as the FTCE, requires periodic review, including the review and revision of the competencies and skills assessed. Rule 6A-4.0021(9)(gg), F.A.C., specifies that the Department shall review these tests in 5-year cycles.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: This rule amendment adopts passing scores for the new Florida Educational Leadership Examination (FELE), which was previously updated to reflect new competencies and skills. The new passing scores will be effective January 1, 2027, and the effective date for the competencies and skills is being adjusted to January 1, 2026.

Therefore, it is now time to set passing scores for those updated competencies and skills.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Rule amendment is necessary to clarify that for-cause or reasonable suspicion testing may be conducted using a Department approved multi-panel device; to revise the guidelines for for-cause or reasonable suspicion testing to include possession of diuretic drugs without a valid prescription; to remove the provision that a female inmate shall not be required to provide a urine specimen during menstrual cycle; and to remove Forms DC6-2066 and DC6-2067.

SUMMARY: The proposed amendment revises certain drug testing procedures and practices regarding inmates in the custody of the Department.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: The Department used an itemized checklist to conduct an economic analysis and determine if there is an adverse impact or regulatory cost associated with this rule that exceeds the criteria. 33-602.2035 Inmate Substance Abuse Testing.

The Office of Institutions shall be responsible for the development and implementation of the Department's substance abuse testing program.

(1) Definitions.

(a) No Change.

(b) Tester – a correctional officer who has been certified as competent by the manufacturer of the onsite testing device and trained by certified training personnel, affiliated with the Department, on the proper procedures for collecting urine specimens, including the completion and maintenance of the Form DC6-2067, Chain of Custody documentation Form, the handling and disposing of urine specimens, and the administration and interpretation of the on-site testing device. All testing personnel must be approved by the Office of Institutions. ~~The Chain of Custody Form is incorporated by reference in paragraph (1)(d) of this rule.~~

(c) No Change.

(d) Chain of Custody Documentation Form – the chronological documentation of form used to document the identity and integrity of an inmate's specimen from time of collection until the specimen is prepared for shipment to a designated outside laboratory for confirmation testing. The required documentation to be completed ~~This form~~ will be provided by the laboratory conducting confirmation tests on specimens that had a positive result on the on-site testing device. ~~Form DC6-2067, NON FEDERAL FOUR PART DRUG TESTING CUSTODY AND CONTROL FORM (hereinafter referred to as the "Chain of Custody Form") is hereby incorporated by reference. Copies of the form are available directly from the vendor or from the Forms Control Administrator, 501 S. Calhoun Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2500, <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-05328>. The effective date of the form is 6-15.~~

(e) through (h) No Change.

(2) The Department of Corrections conducts the following types of inmate substance abuse testing:

(a) For-Cause or Reasonable Suspicion Testing.

1. Inmates suspected of involvement with drugs or alcohol shall be subject to for-cause testing upon order of the warden, the duty warden, the correctional officer chief of the facility, a designee of one of the above individuals, or the Office of Institutions. An inmate should only be tested ~~for a maximum of four drugs~~ on a for-cause basis using the Department approved multi-panel device, unless extenuating circumstances exist. For-cause tests will only be conducted on inmates who meet the criteria outlined in subparagraphs 2.a. through c., below.

2. For-cause drug testing (also referred to as reasonable suspicion drug testing) means drug testing based on a belief that an inmate is using or has used drugs or alcohol based on specific facts and reasonable inferences drawn from those facts in light

of experience. Such facts and inferences shall be based upon:

a. through c. No Change.

d. Possession of diuretic drugs by an inmate without a valid prescription for such drugs.

3. through 5. No Change.

6. A copy of Form DC6-210, Incident Report, shall be included with ~~attached to~~ the facility's ~~copy of Form DC6-2067~~ Chain of Custody documentation Form for positive specimens sent to the laboratory for confirmation testing. Form DC6-210 is incorporated by reference in Rule 33-602.210, F.A.C.

(b) through (c) No Change.

(3) Procedures.

(a) Chain of Custody Documentation.

1. At a minimum, the Form DC6-2067, Chain of Custody documentation Form must include inmate and tester identification, initialed or signed by both the inmate and the tester, date of collection, and type of test (i.e., random, for-cause). The Chain of Custody documentation Form DC6-2067 also may include the time of collection, if the test was initiated due to substance abuse program participation, and identification of all individuals who had custody of the specimen from the time of collection until the specimen was prepared for shipment to the laboratory. Once the outside laboratory receives the specimen, it will become the laboratory's responsibility to maintain a chain of custody throughout the testing process.

2. The Form DC6-2067, Chain of Custody documentation Form allows for comments by the tester regarding any unusual observations. Any failure by the inmate to cooperate with the collection process and any unusual nature (e.g., discolored urine or urine containing foreign objects) of a specimen shall be noted.

3. The tester shall ensure that all collected urine specimens being sent to a designated outside laboratory for confirmation testing are properly labeled and sealed with a security label included with the ~~as provided on Form DC6-2067, Chain of Custody documentation Form~~. The tester shall also ensure that the Form DC6-2067, Chain of Custody documentation Form for all collected urine specimens is completed in accordance with Department procedure 602.010(4).

4. If an inmate is unable or unwilling to enter his or her initials or signature on the Form DC6-2067, Chain of Custody documentation Form, the tester will make a notation in the comment section of the form and leave the space blank. The tester will not under any circumstances sign the Form DC6-2067, Chain of Custody documentation Form for an inmate.

(b) Specimen Collection Procedures.

~~3. A female inmate shall not be required to provide a urine specimen during her menstrual cycle.~~

6.7. The inmate is expected to provide a minimum of 30 ml

of urine. If the inmate provides less, the tester shall again attempt to collect an adequate specimen. If the inmate cannot immediately provide an adequate specimen, the procedure outlined in subparagraph (3)(b)7.8., below shall apply.

8. through 12. renumbered 7. through 11. No Change.

(c) through (d) No Change.

(e) Testing of urine specimens.

1. through 6. No Change.

7. Positive test results. The tester shall inform the inmate of the positive results of the on-site testing device. The inmate will then be given the opportunity to sign Form DC6-2065, Affidavit for Admission of Drug Use.

a. through b. No Change.

c. If the inmate does not sign Form DC6-2065, the following steps shall be taken:

(I) Once the urine specimen has been securely closed by the tester, the tester shall attach a security seal from the Form DC6-2067, Chain of Custody documentation Form across the lid of the sample cup under the inmate's observation.

(II) The tester shall instruct the inmate to place his or her initials on the Form DC6-2067, Chain of Custody documentation Form verifying that the urine specimen was collected and sealed under the inmate's observation and that the specimen cup identification is correct.

(III) through (IV) No change.

(1) The Commission may issue Fishing Education Event License Exemption permits, or FEEL Permits (Permit), exempting event participants, organizers, and volunteers associated with recreational fishing events described in subsection (2) from the freshwater and saltwater fishing license and permit requirements established in section 379.354, Florida Statutes, for the duration of a specified event.

(2) For purposes of this rule, an “event” means a single, organized, time-limited occasion at a specified location conducted for the primary purpose of providing science-based recreational shore or land-based fishing education programs to novice fishers.

(3) An individual or entity interested in hosting an event may apply for a Permit by completing and submitting a Permit application through the Commission’s online licensing system at least 30 business days prior to the start of the event. The Permit application must include the following information:

(a) The event name;

(b) The name of the sponsoring organization;

(c) The event date;

(d) The event location and address;

(e) The expected number of participants;

(f) The expected age range of participants;

(g) The expected number of volunteers and staff;

(h) The name, email address, and phone number of the event coordinator or point of contact; and

(i) A brief description of the educational portion of the event that includes information on ethical angling practices, fishing regulations including size, season, and bag limits, licensing requirements, an overview of fishing techniques, and instruction on equipment, knots, and casting.

(4) Permit approval is based on compliance with all of the following conditions:

(a) Receipt of a completed Permit application by the Commission;

(b) The event must be focused on teaching fishing techniques and best practices to novice fishers, and, at a minimum, the curriculum must include information addressing the topics listed in paragraph (3)(i);

(c) The event may not last longer than 8 hours within any 24 hour period;

(d) Fishing during the event must be conducted from shore or must be land-based and not conducted from a vessel;

(e) The event must be held at a single location; and

(f) The event must not be for profit and must not be a fundraiser or a competitive tournament.

(5) The Permit must be available for immediate inspection by the Commission at the event site for the duration of the event.

(6) The Permit is only valid for the duration of the authorized event for which the permit has been issued.

(7) Any fishing technique, gear, best practices, or information provided during a permitted event must comply with all applicable Commission, State of Florida, and Federal rules, regulations, policies, and permit conditions. Failure to comply with any such applicable rules, regulations, policies, and permit conditions may result in revocation of the Permit and denial of future Permit applications.

(8) The Permit does not exempt permittees, organizers, participants, or volunteers from applicable fishing regulations including size limits, bag limits, slot limits, gear restrictions, seasons, or any other harvest restrictions. Exemptions are not available for limited-entry activities.
