SUMMARY: Relocating the existing access channel to improve vessel access while maintaining and enhancing seagrass protection.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

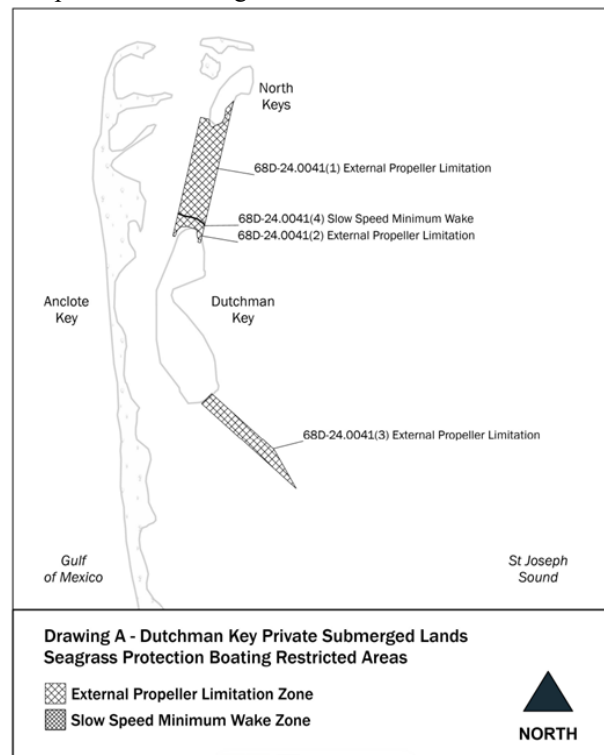
68D-24.0041 Dutchman Key Private Submerged Lands Seagrass Protection Boating Restricted Areas.

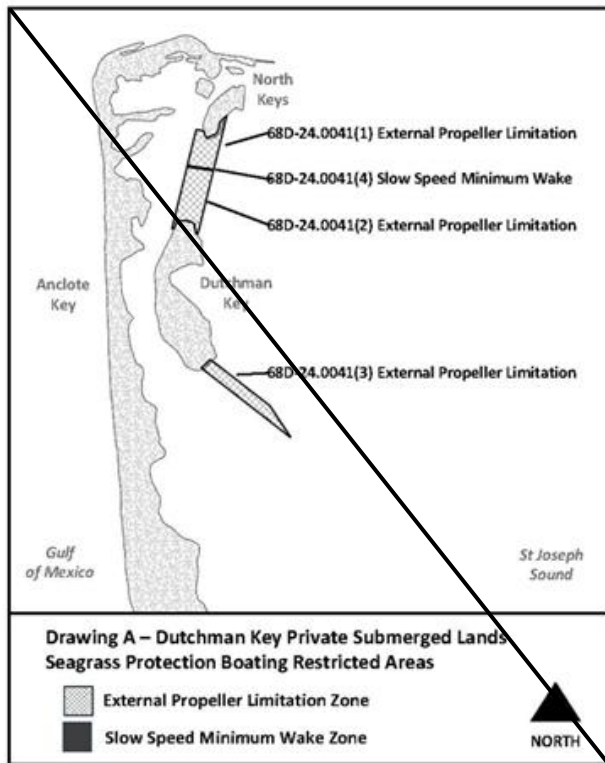
For the sole purpose of protecting seagrass and contiguous seagrass habitat upon privately-owned submerged lands, the following boating restricted areas are established in the vicinity of Dutchman Key in Pasco County:

(1) through (3) No change.

(4) Access channel: a slow speed minimum wake zone consisting of all waters within 20 feet of a centerline beginning at GPS position 28.199597 N, 82.844166 W, then extends through GPS positions 28.199705 N, 82.844250 W; 28.199966 N, 82.844663 W; 28.200099 N, 82.845143 W; 28.200157 N, 82.845626 W; and terminating at GPS position 28.200316 N, 82.846103 W starting from GPS position 28.203739 N, 82.845257 W, bounded by a line running east approximately 666 feet to GPS position 28.203437 N, 82.843217 W, then running south approximately 40 feet to GPS position 28.203330 N, 82.843243 W, then running west approximately 666 feet to GPS position 28.203631 N, 82.845283 W, then running north approximately 40 feet to the starting GPS position.

Sites for measuring sound from vehicles operated on highways shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Standard Sites. Standard measuring sites shall be open and free of sound-reflecting surfaces within a 100' foot radius of the microphone and a 100' foot radius of the microphone point as shown in Figure 1.

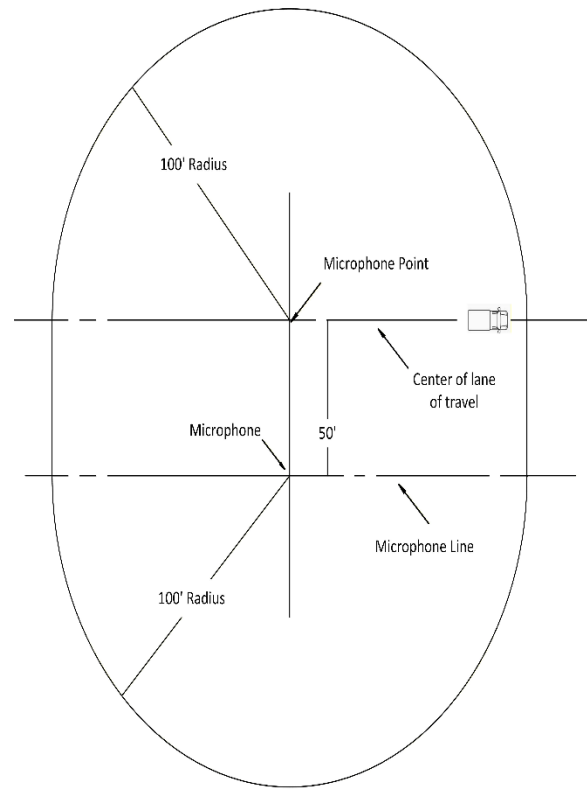

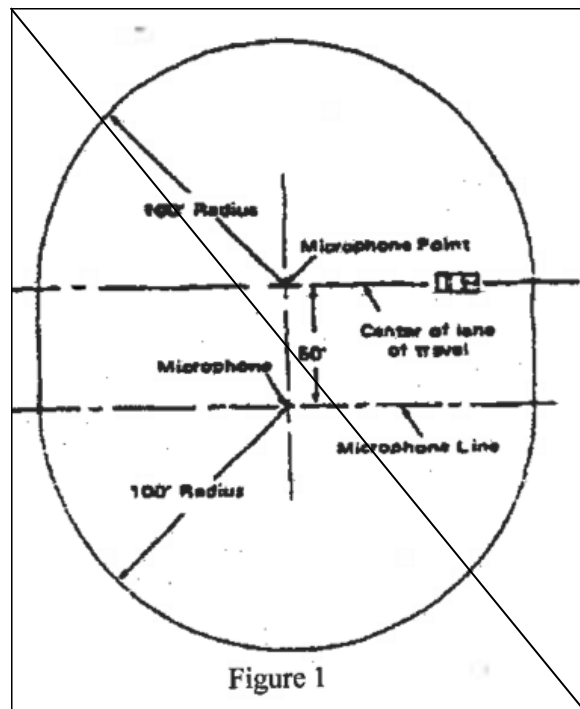

(2) Restricted Sites. Restricted measuring sites which do not meet standard site requirements because of large sound-reflecting surfaces within the clear area (see Figure 2) may be

used by applying correction factors determined from the following procedure.

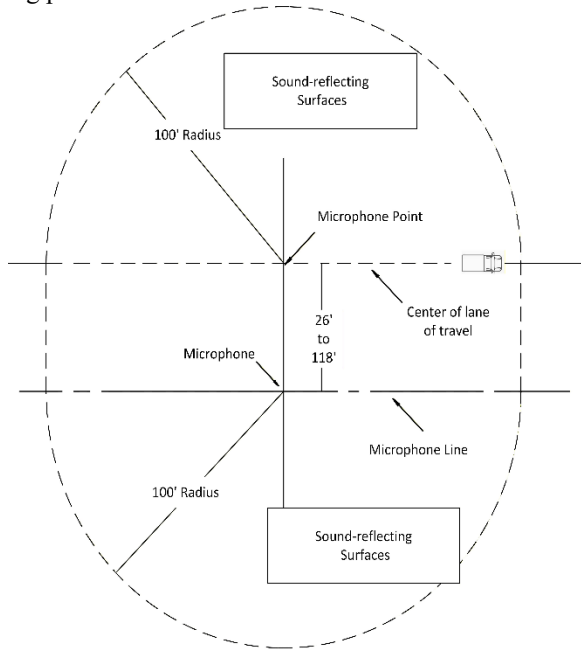

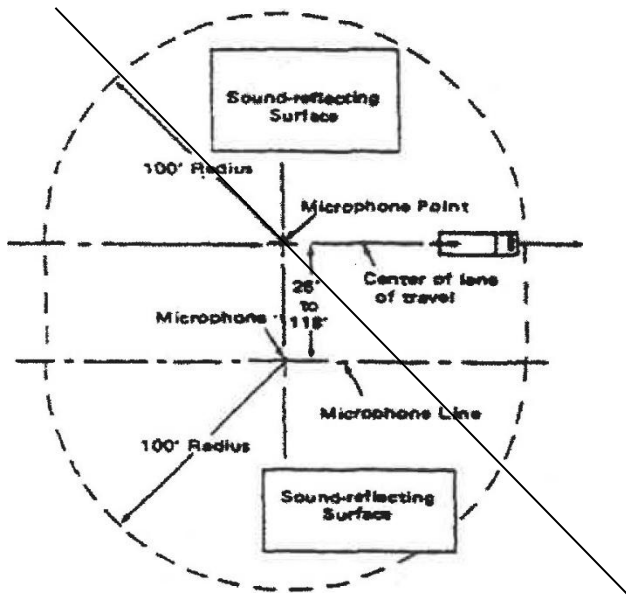
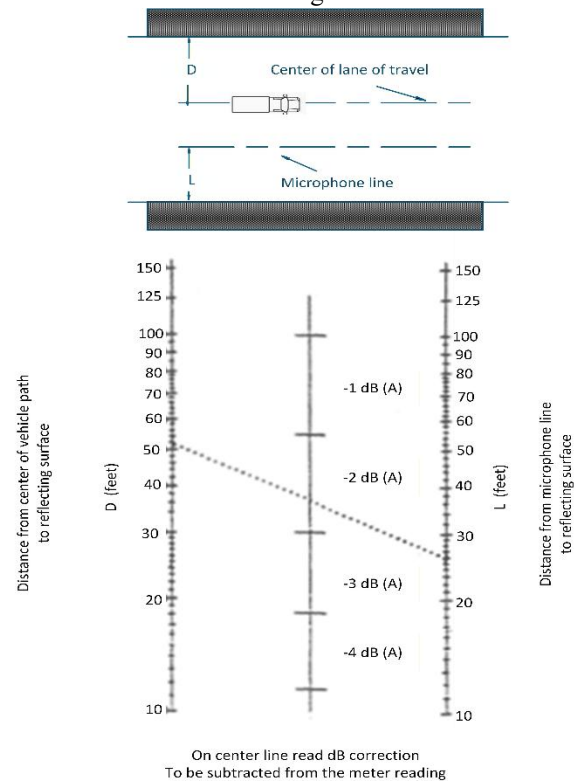

(a) Distance from sound-reflecting surfaces. The distances between the microphone line and its nearest sound-reflecting surface and between the centerline of the lane of travel and its nearest sound-reflecting surface shall be measured. These distances shall be located on the nomogram in Figure 3 on their respective axes, and the two marks shall be connected by a straight line. The point on the central axis that is intersected by the straight line indicates the dB correction factor that shall be applied to the sound level reading obtained from each vehicle passing through the site. (The dotted line in Figure 3 illustrates a -2dB correction for sound-reflecting surfaces at 52' feet from the center of the lane of travel and 25' feet from the microphone line.)

1. through 2. No change.

3. Sound-reflecting surfaces not basically parallel to the lane of travel shall be 100 feet or more from the microphone and microphone point. This restriction does not apply to surfaces that are perpendicular to the lane of travel and behind the parallel surface for which corrections are made, such as a fence, or the side walls of a building.

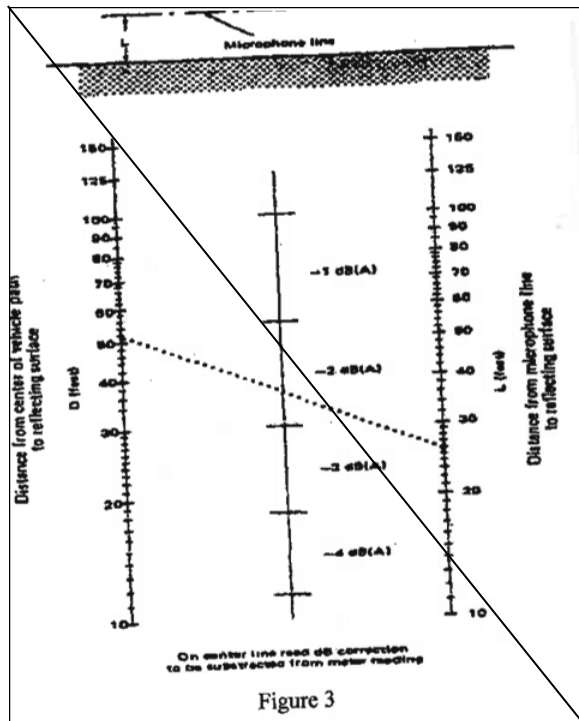
