#### NOTICE TO CONSTRUCTION MANAGERS

The University of Florida Board of Trustees announces that continuing CM-At-Risk services will be required for the project listed below:

UF-MP26, Annual Campus Continuing Services for Minor  
Projects

Typical projects assigned under this contract may include new construction, renovation, remodeling, reroofing and other building maintenance, equipment installation, pre-engineered metal buildings, greenhouses, pole barns, asbestos abatement, and fire code corrections. Areas requiring renovation or remodeling may include research laboratories, classrooms, library and media centers, historic buildings, offices and related functions, outpatient clinics, reception and waiting areas, lobbies and corridors, atriums, courtyards and plazas, modular, residential and dormitories, athletic facilities, and associated roadways, sitework including underground utilities, sidewalks, landscaping and other appropriate work. Projects could be located on the University of Florida main campus or at any other UF facilities throughout the State of Florida. The current project budget cannot exceed the state approved minor project threshold, and the value may change in accordance with the Statutes which reference increasing the threshold annually based on the Consumer Price Index. The statutes also reference that this value is the construction cost in 287.055 (2)(g).

These are open-ended contracts for a period of two years with an option to renew for two additional two-year periods at owner discretions. Ten (10) contracts will be awarded. One (1) of the 10 contracts may be awarded to a new firm with no direct contract with UF in the last three years and must have at least 3 years of commercial experience. This criterion will be verified with the application submittals prior to the shortlist processes.

Typically, the contract for an assigned project's construction management services will begin at the 60% Construction Document stage or later but may include preconstruction activities, including, but not limited to budget studies and estimates, value engineering, analysis of the design documents for constructability, coordination, detailing, materials, and systems, development and maintenance of the construction schedule, production of detailed jobsite management plans, development of strategies for the procurement of trade contracts, and development of a Guaranteed Maximum Price

(GMP) proposal based on the latest Construction Documents. If the GMP proposal is accepted and executed, the construction manager becomes the single point of responsibility for performance of the construction of the project and shall "publicly bid trade packages" as required by Florida law. The management fee, general condition, staffing for an assigned project will be derived from the 2026 version of Construction Fee Guidelines established by the University. Failure to arrive at an acceptable GMP as provided in the agreement, may result in non-execution of the project Purchase Order and Authorization for Construction.

Applicants will be evaluated based on their quality of experience and representative projects, qualifications of the proposed personnel, satisfaction of project criteria, including schedule, references, bonding capacity, Building Information Modeling / ACC capabilities, commitment to sustainability, and responses to questions posed both in the shortlist and interview phases. At the time of application, the applicant must be licensed to practice as a General Contractor in the State of Florida. Similarly, at the time of application, if the applicant is a corporation, must be chartered by the Florida Department of State to operate in Florida.

The Selection Committee may reject any and all proposals and stop the selection process at any time.

Applicants desiring to provide construction management services for the project shall submit a proposal only after thoroughly reviewing the Construction Manager Qualifications Supplement Instructions, and other background information. The qualifications package shall be provided as described in the instructions indicated which are provided separately.

As required by Section 287.133, Florida Statutes, an applicant may not submit a proposal for this project if it is on the convicted vendor list for a public entity crime committed within the past 36 months. The selected construction manager must warrant that it will neither utilize the services of, nor contract with, any supplier, subcontractor, or consultant in excess of \$15,000.00 in connection with this project for a period of 36 months from the date of their being placed on the convicted vendor list.

The Final Order was in response to a Petition for an emergency permanent Variance from RLR Investments LLC located at 1750 N 80 Ave., Ocala, FL 34482, filed December 10, 2025, and advertised on December 16, 2025, in Vol. 51, No. 242, of the Florida Administrative Register. No comments were received in response to the petition. The Final Order on the Petition for Variance grants the Petitioner a variance from Rule 2.8.2.4, ASME A17.1, 2019 Edition, as adopted by Rule 61C-5.001 Florida Administrative Code that may require a means to include a system for testing fire-alarm initiating devices without entering the hoistway in jurisdictions enforcing the NBCC or NFPA72, provided it uses approved air-sampling or enclosed-device methods that meet strict rules for rated access panels, secure self-closing doors, noncombustible protective cages with required strength and clearances, limited hoistway intrusion, and coordination of installation locations with the elevator installer, because the Petitioner has demonstrated that the purpose of the underlying statute has been met and that Petitioner would suffer a substantial hardship if required to comply with this rule (VW2025-132).

At the time of application, the applicant must be licensed to practice as a General Contractor in the State of Florida. Similarly, at the time of application, if the applicant is a corporation, must be chartered by the Florida Department of State to operate in Florida.

Notice of Florida Building Code Binding Interpretation

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the Binding Interpretation Panel has issued a binding interpretation pursuant to Section 553.775, Florida Statutes, in response to a petition submitted by Whitecaps South Condominium Association, Inc, and accepted by BOAF on January 12, 2026. The following is a summary of the interpretation:

Question: Whether the Sanibel Building Official erred by determining that the Whitecaps South condominium units are “places of lodging” based on the definition of that term in the Florida Building Code Section 106.5, rather than applying the definition of a “place of lodging” in the federal standards, as adopted in 28 CFR 36.104.

Answer: Notwithstanding the reference to a “resort condominium” in the definition of a “place of public accommodation” in Section 106.5 of the Florida Building Code (FBC), Accessibility, 8th Edition, a privately owned, non-owner-occupied property containing dwelling units that are rented to the public for periods of less than 30 days is generally classified as transient lodging. Accordingly, the projects in question are subject to the requirements of Sections 201.1.1 and 224 of the FBC, Accessibility.
