SUMMARY: The rulemaking will cover amending a rule to include necessary definition(s) and creating a rule setting the minimum flow for Jackson Blue Spring.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: Upon review of the proposed changes to the rule, the District has determined that the amendments will not exceed any one of the economic analysis criteria in a SERC as set forth in Section 120.541(2)(a), F.S.

40A-8.021 Definitions.

(1) through (18) no change.

(19) “Jackson Blue Spring” is the first magnitude spring located in Jackson County at 30 degrees 47 minutes 25.8536 seconds north latitude and -85 degrees 08 minutes 24.3181 seconds west longitude.

(20) “Jackson Blue Spring Median Flow” means the median of Jackson Blue Spring Daily Flow beginning on January 1, 2005, and extending through present or for the most recent 30 years of record, whichever is shorter.

(21) “Jackson Blue Spring Daily Flow” means the average daily flow at Northwest Florida Water Management District Station 005042 (Jackson Blue Spring), or its successor located in Jackson County, Florida.

(22) “Jackson Blue Spring Median Baseline Flow” means the median of Jackson Blue Spring Daily Flow values between January 1, 2005, and December 31, 2024, adjusted to remove the impacts of groundwater withdrawals.

40A-8.061 Minimum Flow for Jackson Blue Spring.

The Governing Board hereby establishes the following minimum flow. The Governing Board finds that the following minimum flow is the limit at which further withdrawals would be significantly harmful to the water resources or ecology of the area.

(1) The minimum Jackson Blue Spring Median Flow is 92.2 cubic feet per second. The minimum flow of 92.2 cubic feet per second represents an allowable flow reduction of 10.7%, or 11.1 cubic feet per second, from the Jackson Blue Spring Median Baseline Flow of 103.3 cubic feet per second.

(2) The District will evaluate the minimum flow for Jackson Blue Spring every five years as part of the regional water supply planning process to determine the extent to which the Jackson Blue Spring Median Flow has been reduced due to withdrawals as of the date of each evaluation. Each evaluation will include a review of:

(a) Flow data.

(b) Water withdrawals.

(c) Aquifer water levels, and

(d) Rainfall data.

Each evaluation is independent from and not a determination of water use permit compliance or environmental

resource permit compliance. Permit compliance is a regulatory function that is not within the scope of this subsection.

SUMMARY: The amended rule specifies Florida Medicaid reimbursement for cell and gene therapy products and removes the sunset provision from the rule text pursuant to section 120.536(5), Florida Statutes (F.S.).

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: A checklist was prepared by the Agency to determine the need for a SERC. RULE TITLES: MMTc Authorization Procedures, Caregiver Background Screening and Request for Close Relative Status

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Pursuant to Ch. 2025-199, § 15, Laws of Florida, this rulemaking initiates nonemergency rulemaking to replace emergency rules 64ER21-10 and 64ER23-2, adopted by the Department to implement section 381.986, Florida Statutes.

SUMMARY: These rules set forth MMTc authorization procedures, background screenings for caregivers who are not identified as close relatives, and a process to substantiate close relative of a qualified patient status.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within

one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

Pursuant to Ch. 2025-199, § 15, Laws of Florida, rules adopted to replace emergency rules are exempt from ss. 120.54(3)(b) and 120.541, F.S.

64-4.216 MMTC Authorization Procedures.

(1) An MMTC may not cultivate marijuana until it has received cultivation authorization from the department.

(2) An MMTC may not process marijuana until it has received processing authorization from the department.

(3) An MMTC may not dispense marijuana or marijuana delivery devices until it has received dispensing authorization from the department.

(4) An MMTC must obtain cultivation authorization prior to receiving processing authorization.

(5) An MMTC must obtain processing authorization prior to receiving dispensing authorization.

(6) Marijuana may not be present at any MMTC facility prior to the MMTC's receipt of the appropriate written notice of approval of the facility to cultivate, process, or dispense marijuana or marijuana delivery devices.

(7) Within 180 calendar days of licensure, an MMTC shall request cultivation authorization by submitting a completed DH8027-OMMU-02/2026, "Request for Authorization," effective 02/2026, incorporated by reference herein and available at <https://flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-19220> or at <https://knowthefactsmmj.com/rules-and-regulations/>, to OMMULicenseOperation@FLHealth.gov. An MMTC must have the ability to begin cultivating marijuana upon requesting cultivation authorization. An MMTC must submit a separate "Request for Authorization" form for each facility identified in the original application for which it is requesting cultivation authorization.

(a) Upon receipt of a completed "Request for Authorization" form, the department will inspect the MMTC's cultivation facility(ies) and operations within 14 business days.

(b) The inspection will be conducted to determine compliance with section 381.986, F.S., the department's rules, and the representations made in the MMTC's application on file with the department. The department will send written notice to the MMTC after completion of the inspection either granting cultivation authorization or omissions, deficiencies, application deviations, or violations.

(c) Within seven (7) calendar days of the MMTC's receipt of a written notice of omissions, deficiencies, application deviations, or violations, the department must receive from the MMTC a written corrective action plan that details the correction(s) to resolve the omissions, deficiencies, deviations, or violations identified in the written notice and the date the correction(s) were or will be completed. The department will send written notice to the MMTC approving or denying the MMTC's corrective action plan.

(d) All corrections must be completed within 30 calendar days of the MMTC's receipt of the department's written notice identifying the omissions, deficiencies, deviations, or violations.

(e) The MMTC's cultivation facility(ies) and operations are subject to inspection to confirm that the omissions, deficiencies, deviations, or violations have been resolved and that the corrective action plan has been implemented and completed.

(8) Within 270 calendar days of licensure, an MMTC shall request processing authorization by submitting a completed "Request for Authorization" form to OMMULicenseOperation@FLHealth.gov. An MMTC must have the ability to begin processing marijuana upon requesting processing authorization. An MMTC must submit a separate "Request for Authorization" form for each facility identified in the original application for which it is requesting processing authorization.

(a) Upon receipt of a request for processing authorization, the MMTC's processing facility(ies) and operations will be inspected by the department within 14 business days.

(b) The inspection will be conducted to determine compliance with section 381.986, F.S., the department's rules, and the representations made in the MMTC's application on file with the department. The department will send written notice to the MMTC after completion of the inspection either granting processing authorization or omissions, deficiencies, application deviations, or violations.

(c) Within seven (7) calendar days of the MMTC's receipt of a written notice of omissions, deficiencies, application deviations, or violations, the department must receive from the MMTC a written corrective action plan that details the

correction(s) to resolve the omissions, deficiencies, deviations, or violations identified in the written notice and the date the correction(s) were or will be completed. The department will send written notice to the MMTC approving or denying the MMTC's corrective action plan.

(d) All corrections must be completed within 30 calendar days of the MMTC's receipt of the department's written notice identifying the omissions, deficiencies, deviations, or violations.

(e) The MMTC's processing facility(ies) and operations are subject to inspection to confirm that the omissions, deficiencies, deviations, or violations have been resolved and that the corrective action plan has been implemented and completed.

(9) Within 365 calendar days of licensure, an MMTC shall request dispensing authorization by submitting a completed "Request for Authorization" form to OMMULicenseOperation@FLHealth.gov. An MMTC must have the ability to dispense marijuana upon requesting dispensing authorization. An MMTC must submit a separate "Request for Authorization" form for each facility identified in the original application for which it is requesting dispensing authorization.

(a) Upon receipt of a request for dispensing authorization, the MMTC's dispensing facility(ies) and operations will be inspected by the department within 14 business days.

(b) The inspection will be conducted to determine compliance with section 381.986, F.S., the department's rules, and the representations made in the MMTC's application on file with the department. The department will send written notice to the MMTC after completion of the inspection either granting dispensing authorization or identifying any omissions, deficiencies, application deviations, or violations.

(c) Within seven (7) calendar days of the MMTC's receipt of a written notice of omissions, deficiencies, application deviations, or violations, the department must receive from the MMTC a written corrective action plan that details the correction(s) to resolve the omissions, deficiencies, deviations, or violations identified in the written notice and the date the correction(s) were or will be completed. The department will send written notice to the MMTC approving or denying the MMTC's corrective action plan.

(d) All corrections must be completed within 30 calendar days of the MMTC's receipt of the department's written notice.

(e) The MMTC's dispensing facility(ies) and operations are subject to inspection to confirm that the omissions, deficiencies, deviations, or violations have been resolved and that the corrective action plan has been implemented and completed.

(10) Failure to comply with the requirements of this rule is grounds for disciplinary action, up to and including, license revocation.

64-4.223 Caregiver Background Screening and Request for Close Relative Status.

(1) Background Screening Requirement. Except as provided in subsection (5) below, individuals applying for a caregiver Medical Marijuana Use Registry (MMUR) identification card must complete a level 2 background screening in accordance with section 381.986(9), F.S., and this rule.

(2) Background Screening Procedures.

(a) Caregiver applicants required to undergo level 2 background screening must comply with the following procedures:

1. A caregiver applicant must submit to the department a completed DH8048-OMMU-05/2023, "Caregiver Background Screening Acknowledgment and Information," effective 05/2023, incorporated by reference and available at <https://flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-19221> or at <https://knowthefactsmmj.com/rules-and-regulations/>. The "Caregiver Background Screening Acknowledgment and Information" form must be signed by the caregiver applicant and submitted to the department via email at MMUR_Applications@FLHealth.gov. The form must be signed and dated prior to the submission of fingerprints to a Livescan Service Provider. If the form is signed and dated after the submission of fingerprints to a Livescan Service Provider, the department will not process the background report.

2. A caregiver applicant must submit a full set of fingerprints to a Livescan Service Provider and, at the time of submission, give to the Livescan Service Provider the Department's Originating Agency Identifier (ORI) number. Applicants may request the department's ORI number by sending an email to OMMUBGS@FLHealth.gov. If a person's fingerprints are rejected twice for image quality, the person must participate in the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) name check procedure for fingerprint submissions rejected twice due to image quality. The department will notify caregiver applicants if their fingerprints are rejected twice due to image quality and will provide direction regarding the FBI name check procedure.

(b) After successful submission of fingerprints or successful compliance with the FBI name check procedure the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) will send a background report to the department. The department will not process the background report unless it has received a completed "Caregiver Background Screening

Acknowledgment and Information” form from the caregiver applicant, as provided in subparagraph (2)(a)1. If the completed form is not received by the department within six months from the date the fingerprints were submitted to a Livescan Service Provider), the department will not process the background report, the individual must resubmit fingerprints to a Livescan Service Provider pursuant to paragraph (2)(a).

(c) After receipt of the background report, the department may send to the caregiver applicant a request(s) for additional information or clarification necessary to complete the background screening process. After assessing the background report and any additional information received from the caregiver applicant, the department will issue notice in writing to the caregiver applicant stating whether the caregiver applicant passed the background screening.

(d) Upon receipt of notice from the department stating that the caregiver applicant has passed the background screening, the caregiver applicant may apply for a caregiver MMUR identification card, as provided in Rule 64-4.011, F.A.C. Caregiver applicants must pass level 2 background screening before applying for a caregiver MMUR identification card.

(3) Fingerprint Retention Fees and Notifications.

(a) A caregiver’s fingerprints will be retained in the Applicant Fingerprint Retention and Notification Program (AFRNP).

(b) The annual fee for participation in the AFRNP is \$6.00 per individual fingerprint record. There is no fee for the initial year of participation. Caregivers must remit the \$6.00 AFRNP retention fee to the department by mail and include with the payment a completed DH8050-OMMU-05/2023, “Fingerprint Retention Fee Payment,” effective 05/2023, incorporated by reference and available at <https://flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-19222> or at <https://knowthefactsmmj.com/rules-and-regulations/>.

(c) The department will notify caregivers in writing at least thirty calendar days in advance of the date the annual retention fee is due to the department.

(d) Failure to remit the annual retention fee on or before the due date provided by the department may result in removal of the caregiver’s fingerprints from the AFRNP. Upon removal of fingerprints from the AFRNP, a caregiver will be unable to renew their caregiver MMUR identification card in accordance with Rule 64-4.011, F.A.C., and must resubmit to a level 2 background screening as provided in this rule in order to continue serving as a caregiver.

(e) A caregiver must provide notice in writing to the department when the caregiver is no longer serving as a caregiver for a qualified patient so that the caregiver’s fingerprints may be removed from the AFRNP.

(4) Disclosure of Arrest Reports and Continuing Background Screening.

(a) Caregivers required to undergo level 2 background screening shall notify the department in writing if the caregiver is arrested for any disqualifying offense enumerated in section 435.04, F.S., or for an offense under Chapter 837, 895, or 896, F.S., or similar law of another jurisdiction. Such notice shall be provided to the department via email to MMUR_Applications@FLHealth.gov within 14 calendar days of the caregiver’s arrest and shall include the following information:

1. Name of the caregiver;
2. Date of birth of the caregiver; and
3. A copy of the arrest report, if available.

(b) If the department receives any arrest notification concerning a caregiver that renders the caregiver ineligible to serve as a caregiver, the department will send notice in writing to the caregiver revoking the caregiver’s MMUR identification card.

(5) An individual who is a close relative of the qualified patient, as defined in section 381.986(1)(b), F.S., is not required to pass a level 2 background screening in order to become a caregiver for the qualified patient. Caregiver applicants seeking to substantiate close relative status must submit a completed DH8049-OMMU-05/2023, “Close Relative Acknowledgment Form,” effective 05/2023, incorporated by reference and available at <https://flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-19223> or at <https://knowthefactsmmj.com/rules-and-regulations>. The “Close Relative Acknowledgment Form” must be submitted to the department via email at MMUR_Applications@FLHealth.gov or mailed to P.O. Box 7618, Tallahassee, Florida 32314.

(6) The department will notify the caregiver applicant in writing whether the request for close relative status has been approved or denied. Upon approval of the caregiver applicant’s request for close relative status, the caregiver applicant may apply for a caregiver MMUR identification card in accordance with Rule 64-4.011, F.A.C., and without submitting to a level 2 background screening as provided in this rule.
