 68C-22.007 Indian River County Zones
 PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The Commission is proposing amendments to the existing Indian River County manatee

protection rule in portions of the county to ensure appropriate manatee protection while addressing zone complexity and changes in habitat use.

SUMMARY: The proposed rule would amend subparagraph 68C-22.007(1)(a)1., F.A.C. from Idle Speed (All Year) to Slow Speed (All year), paragraph 68C-22.007(1)(e), F.A.C. from seasonal No Entry (November 15 through March 31) to Idle Speed (All Year), and amend paragraph 68C-22.007(b)(6), F.A.C. to extend the existing Slow Speed (All Year) zone south by approximately 1.25 miles, to include the unregulated Prang Creek area.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: the nature of the rule and the preliminary analysis conducted to determine whether a SERC was required.

(1) For the purpose of protecting manatees and manatee habitat in Indian River County, the following year-round and seasonal zones are established, which shall include all associated and navigable tributaries, lakes, creeks, coves, bends, backwaters, canals, channels and boat basins, unless otherwise designated or excluded:

(a) Idle Speed Zone (Year-round) –

Indian River, Sebastian River Area: All waters within 1000 feet of the westerly shoreline of Indian River, southerly of a line which bears North 90° 00' 00" East (True) running through the northernmost point of land of the peninsula over which US Highway 1 (State Road 5) passes (approximate latitude 27° 51' 12" North, approximate longitude 80° 29' 27" West), and northerly of a line which bears North 90° 00' 00" East (True) from a point on the westerly shoreline of Indian River 700 feet northwesterly of the intersection of the extension of the centerline of County Road 505 with the westerly shoreline of Indian River (approximate latitude 27° 50' 46" North, approximate longitude 80° 29' 05" West),~~

Indian River, Porpoise Point to Head Cove Area: All waters of Indian River within 1000 feet of the general contour of the westernmost shoreline of Porpoise Point and the Moorings residential development including all waters of Porpoise Bay, Head Cove Pocket, Head Cove and all associated waters, southerly of a line which bears South 90° 00' 00" West (True) from the westernmost point of the shoreline of Porpoise Point (approximate latitude 27° 35' 41" 30" North, approximate longitude 80° 20' 51" West), northerly of a line which bears South 90° 00' 00" West from the westernmost point of an~~

unnamed island at the southern end of Head Cove (approximate latitude 27° 34' 28" North, approximate longitude 80° 20' 22" West), and northerly of the westerly extension of the northerly shoreline of the canal between Island Drive and Harbor Lane.




RULES OF THE BUREAU OF FIRE, ~~AND ARSON,~~ AND EXPLOSIVES INVESTIGATIONS

69D-4.001 Initial Investigation of Fires.

(1)(a) Purpose. The purpose of this rule is to assist local fire officials and law enforcement officers in determining the responsibilities with respect to the initial or preliminary

assessment of fire scenes and in determining whether probable cause exists to refer such scenes to the Division for an investigation pursuant to Section 633.112, F.S. Experience shows that the most effective deterrent to arson lies in a commitment by fire officials, law enforcement, and the Division to direct investigative resources to those fires that are the result of carelessness or design and to more effectively prosecute offenders that commit the crime of arson. This rule imposes no new obligations on local fire officials or law enforcement, but serves solely to clarify the conditions that necessitate the engagement and assistance of the Bureau of Fire, ~~and Arson,~~ and Explosives Investigations; resources upon the occurrence of a fire or explosion.

(b) Scope. Pursuant to Section 633.112, F.S., the State Fire Marshal is required to investigate any fire in which property has been damaged or destroyed and where there is probable cause to believe that the fire was the result of carelessness or design. The Bureau of Fire, ~~and Arson,~~ and Explosives Investigations of the Division of Criminal Investigations ~~Investigative and Forensic Services~~ is a law enforcement agency whose personnel are sworn law enforcement officers pursuant to ~~Chapter~~ 943, F.S. The State Fire Marshal is charged with enforcing all laws and rules adopted pursuant thereto for purposes of the prevention of fire and explosion through the regulation of conditions which could cause fire or explosion, pursuant to Section 633.104~~(2)(a)~~, F.S. The purpose of the Bureau of Fire, ~~and Arson,~~ and Explosives Investigations is to investigate crimes or criminal activity related to fires. This section sets forth the requirements and procedures for such investigations.

(2) Definitions. For purposes of this section, the following words or terms have the following definitions:

(a) “The bureau” means the Bureau of Fire, ~~and Arson,~~ and Explosives Investigations of the Division of Criminal Investigations ~~Investigative and Forensic Services~~, Department of Financial Services.

FINAL ORDER

APPROVING CITY OF LAKELAND ORDINANCE NO. 6124

The Department of Commerce (“Department”) hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by the City of Lakeland, Florida, (the “City”) Ordinance No. 6124 (the “Ordinance”).

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Green Swamp Area is designated by section 380.0551, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. The City is a local government within the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern.
2. The Ordinance was adopted by the City on December 15, 2025, and rendered to the Department on January 7, 2026.
3. The Ordinance amends the City’s Land Development Code, including but not limited to, establishing a minor subdivision review process, removing final plat approval authority from the planning and zoning board and delegating that authority to the City Manager, and establishing procedures for the issuance of early start construction permits prior to the recording of the final plat. Additionally, the Ordinance revises the planning and zoning board review and approval requirements for subdivision plats in the Green Swamp Area of Critical and State Concern.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. See section 380.05(6), Fla. Stat.
5. “Land development regulations” include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. Section 380.031(8), Fla. Stat. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.
6. The Ordinance is consistent with the City’s Comprehensive Plan generally, as required by section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, and specifically Policy FLU-1.10A, Policy FLU-1.10B, Policy FLU-1.14R, Policy INF-5.1D, and Objective CIE-1.2.
7. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must also be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. See section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in rule 28-26.003(1), Florida Administrative Code.

8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development as a whole, and specifically complies with the following:

(a) Minimize the adverse impacts of development on resources of the Floridan Aquifer, wetlands, and flood-detention areas.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that the City of Lakeland Ordinance No. 6124 is consistent with the City’s Comprehensive Plan and the Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby APPROVED.

This Order becomes effective 21 days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below.

FloridaCommerce also has funding available in the Economic Development (ED) program category for job creation and/or retention activities.

Approximately \$22 million in FFY 2025 funding is available for the program categories. The FFY 2025 list of non-entitlement units of local government will be available on FloridaCommerce’s website at FloridaJobs.org/CDBGApplicantInfo prior to the application cycle opening. The application process is conducted in accordance with sections 290.0401 – 290.048, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 73C-23, Florida Administrative Code.

The application cycle will further be conducted in accordance with the Small Cities CDBG Program’s administrative procedure, and all applications shall be scored consistently with the criteria described therein. The administrative procedure is publicly available on FloridaCommerce’s website at FloridaJobs.org/CDBGApplicantInfo.

The FFY 2025 application cycle for all the above-mentioned program categories of funding will open on April 6, 2026, and close at 5:00 p.m., Eastern Time (ET), on May 5, 2026. Completed applications must be submitted using the Florida Small Cities CDBG Application for Funding Form publicly available at FloridaJobs.org/CDBGApplicantInfo and must be received before 5:00 p.m., ET on May 5, 2026.

Electronic applications will be accepted online. An email request for a link to submit the application must be sent to CDBG@commerce.fl.gov by 5:00 p.m., ET on May 1, 2026. Instructions and access to upload the completed documents will be provided by return email.
