PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the notice of proposed rule is to repeal the Rule Chapter and associated rules for the Indian Trace Community Development District (CDD) as the entire rule chapter has been rendered obsolete by local government action.

SUMMARY: During a recent rule review exercise, it was determined that the rules associated with the Indian Trace CDD were rendered obsolete as a result of action of the City of Weston through adoption of City Ordinance No. 18 on 9/2/97. The Ordinance transitioned the CDD to a Chapter 189, Florida Statutes, district. No notification of this action was ever made to the Commission. Having recently become aware of the local

government action, repeal of Rule Chapter 42A-1 and associated rules is necessary.

60CC-1.001 Showing of Interest

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The Commission proposes to amend Rule 60CC-1.001 related to showing of interest statements to provide more uniformity and efficiency in processing representation petitions filed by unions.

SUMMARY: The rule is being amended to provide additional clarity on how showing of interest statements must be prepared and filed with the Commission. The amendments require that the showing of interest cards include a written signature, date, and that they must be written in English, but can include translations into other languages. The cards must be filed with the Commission Clerk under seal and will not be returned. They must be organized in alphabetical order and be accompanied by a corresponding list of names of the individuals who have signed cards. The amended rule also codifies Commission case precedent on the procedure for its administrative review and challenges to the showing of interest.

60CC-1.001 Showing of Interest.

(1) “Showing of interest” means the employee statements required by ss. 447.307(2) and 447.308(1), F.S.

~~(2)(1)~~ A showing of interest must “Showing of Interest” shall consist of original statements on in the form of petitions or individual signature cards. Such statements must contain the legibly printed name of the employee who is in the appropriate bargaining unit for which an election is sought and be personally signed and dated by that employee. The statement shall be signed and personally dated by the employees and must expressly indicate the employee’s desire for authorize the petitioning employee organization to represent such employee employees for the purpose of collective bargaining or must shall state that the employee employees no longer desires desire to be represented by the certified bargaining agent. The term “Signed” as used herein includes any symbol executed or adopted by an employee with present intention to authenticate; provided, however, that statements signed with an “x” must be witnessed.

~~(2) The signed statements shall be filed with the Commission only and will not be returned after filing. The sufficiency of the offered showing of interest shall be determined administratively.~~

(3) The showing of interest must be in English, although translations in other languages are permitted on the signature card.

(4) Any showing of interest that is undated or does not include the month, date, and year of the signature will be deemed invalid.

(5) The showing of interest must be filed under seal with the Commission only and will not be returned after filing. When a petition is electronically filed, the original showing of interest must be filed with the Commission within seven business days of e-filing either by mail, overnight delivery, or hand-delivery. Showing of interest may not be filed electronically or by facsimile.

(6) The showing of interest filed with the Commission must be organized in alphabetical order by last name and be accompanied by a corresponding list of names, also to be filed under seal, that is numbered and arranged in alphabetical order

by last name. Signature cards may be bound together with binder clips or rubber bands for filing purposes. Staples, two-prong fasteners, paper clips, or permanent metal binding are not acceptable.

(7) The initial determination that the showing of interest is numerically sufficient, based on the proposed bargaining unit, will be made administratively. The Commission or its designee will issue either a notice of sufficiency concluding the petition is sufficient for further processing or an order dismissing the petition as insufficient, with an opportunity to cure within twenty days, if applicable.

(8) If a party disagrees with the Commission’s initial determination regarding the sufficiency of a showing of interest, that party may file with the Commission a motion challenging the Commission’s initial determination within ten days of the issuance of the notice of sufficiency. The motion must be accompanied by a corresponding list of names of the employees in the proposed bargaining unit as of the date the petition was filed. The list of employees must be numbered and arranged in alphabetical order by last name. Failure to file a timely motion constitutes a waiver of any objection to the showing of interest.

(9) Upon review of the motion, the Commission or its designee will compare the showing of interest filed by the petitioner to the list of employees filed by the challenging party and issue an order determining whether the showing of interest is sufficient.

(10) Upon request of the petitioner, showing of interest may be supplemented with additional showing of interest as needed to meet the minimum sufficiency requirements, such as in the case of an amended petition. Showing of interest may also be transferred to a subsequently filed petition that involves the same bargaining unit, such as in the event a petition is voluntarily withdrawn or dismissed without prejudice to refiling. However, showing of interest may be transferred to a new petition only once following the dismissal of the original petition involving the same bargaining unit.

64DER26-4 Definitions

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE:

The Ryan White Grant program is a voluntary federal program that issues grant monies to states for HIV/AIDS prevention and treatment. There is no state statute compelling the Department to participate in that grant program nor is there any federal requirement that the Department participate. The Department has, however, applied for the grant as part of the Department’s broad authority to implement

programs and policies that provide for the prevention and control of communicable diseases. See § 381.0011, Fla. Stat. Specifically, the Department has broad authority and discretion to determine which programs, if any, to implement (and the contours of those programs) for the prevention and control of human immunodeficiency virus infection and acquired immune deficiency syndrome. See § 381.003, Fla. Stat.

That authority and discretion have been exercised, in part, by applying for and administering a federal grant program to provide certain medications to low-income individuals with HIV/AIDS. The program, as implemented by the Department includes, among other things, direct dispense medication and the payment of insurance premiums for full healthcare coverage (not just limited to medication) to certain individuals who qualify under the Department's program parameters. The health insurance has been acquired and provided through the Affordable Care Act (ACA) marketplace exchange.

The federal government implemented enhanced subsidies in 2021 that helped maintain ACA insurance premiums at a certain level. The federal government ended those enhanced subsidies for ACA insurance premiums in 2025. As a result, ACA insurance costs have increased by almost double. Concurrently, the federal government has not increased Ryan White Grant funding to offset the ACA insurance cost increases.

The Department is allotted a finite sum of money under the Ryan White Grant and a much smaller amount of state dollars is allocated yearly by the legislature for this program. Under the program eligibility and program parameters as they existed under Chapter 64D-4, Florida Administrative Code, the Department would not have sufficient funds through the 2026 calendar year, such that it could have to terminate all services to all eligible persons. Approximately 32,000 persons with HIV/AIDS could lose access to some or all medications as a result.

As a result, the Department initiated rulemaking to amend its rules and also adopted Emergency Rules 64DER26-1, 64DER26-2, and 64DER26-3 (Emergency Rules), after concluding that the exhausting of funds would create an immediate danger to the public health, safety, or welfare because without any continued medication, the viral loads in 32,000 infected persons could elevate and could facilitate transmission of HIV within the state. Accordingly, the Department attempted by emergency rule to mitigate that situation and ensure the greatest number of people can receive some direct dispense medication within the constraints of available funding, which is the baseline federal requirement under the grant.

In anticipation of the allocation of additional funding on or before April 1, this emergency rule adjusts program requirements to serve the greatest number of persons within budgetary limitations.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: The program parameters are set by existing rules. The federal enhanced subsidies for ACA insurance ended late 2025. The Department is engaged in non-emergency rulemaking procedures to ensure public participation in the rulemaking process. Due to the rapidly evolving nature of the status of the program and in order to be able to serve the greatest number of people, there is no other feasible mechanism under the Administrative Procedure Act to revise the existing program parameters other than an emergency rule that modifies existing rules and supersedes Emergency Rule 64DER26-1.

SUMMARY: The emergency rule will update definitions of "HIV/AIDS Patient Care Programs," "low income," "federal poverty level," and other defined terms.

For the purpose of Emergency Rules 64DER26-5 and 64DER26-6 ~~this chapter~~, the words and phrases below are defined as follows:

uninsured or underinsured individuals living with HIV/AIDS disease, authorized under 42 U.S.C. §300ff-26. Services are provided through the distribution of medications directly to eligible individuals ~~clients~~ ~~or by the purchase of health insurance that includes coverage for HIV/AIDS medications;~~

(c) ADAP Program for Medication Co-Payment and Medication Deductibles ~~Premium Plus Insurance Program~~, a component of ADAP designed to assist eligible individuals ~~clients~~, as defined in Emergency Rule 64DER26-6 ~~rule 64D-4.007~~, F.A.C., who have insurance and need assistance with medication premiums, copays, and/or medication deductibles; and

(d) State Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) Program, as defined by 24 C.F.R. Part 574 (04/01/13), a housing program, funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and administered by the state, that is intended to prevent the condition of homelessness from occurring to individuals or families living with HIV/AIDS; or if already homeless, to transition the individuals or families back into stable housing as soon as possible, as well as to create a strategy for long term housing stability for persons living with HIV/AIDS. (b) For HOPWA, 80 percent of a county’s median income, as defined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, County Income Limits 2025 ~~2022~~, effective

The federal government ended those enhanced subsidies for ACA insurance premiums in 2025. As a result, ACA insurance costs have increased by almost double. Concurrently, the federal government has not increased Ryan White Grant funding to offset the ACA insurance cost increases.

The Department is allotted a finite sum of money under the Ryan White Grant and a much smaller amount of state dollars is allocated yearly by the legislature for this program. Under the program eligibility and program parameters as they existed under Chapter 64D-4, Florida Administrative Code, the Department would not have sufficient funds through the 2026 calendar year, such that it could have to terminate all services to all eligible persons. Approximately 32,000 persons with HIV/AIDS could lose access to some or all medications as a result.

As a result, the Department initiated rulemaking to amend its rules and also adopted Emergency Rules 64DER26-1, 64DER26-2, and 64DER26-3 (Emergency Rules), after concluding that the exhausting of funds would create an immediate danger to the public health, safety, or welfare because without any continued medication, the viral loads in 32,000 infected persons could elevate and could facilitate transmission of HIV within the state. Accordingly, the Department attempted by emergency rule to mitigate that situation and ensure the greatest number of people can receive some direct dispense medication within the constraints of available funding, which is the baseline federal requirement under the grant.

In anticipation of the allocation of additional funding on or before April 1, this emergency rule adjusts program requirements to serve the greatest number of persons within budgetary limitations.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: The program parameters are set by existing rules. The federal enhanced subsidies for ACA insurance ended late 2025. The Department is engaged in non-emergency rulemaking procedures to ensure public participation in the rulemaking process. Due to the rapidly evolving nature of the status of the program and in order

to be able to serve the greatest number of people, there is no other feasible mechanism under the Administrative Procedure Act to revise the existing program parameters other than an emergency rule that modifies existing rules and supersedes Emergency Rule 64DER26-2.

SUMMARY: These updates will clarify eligibility and documentation requirements for individuals who wish to apply for assistance from HIV/AIDS Patient Care Programs and the HOPWA Program and includes updates to the application. It will also provide that an individual may confirm eligibility up to 45 days prior to expiration of their Notice to Eligibility to avoid a lapse in eligibility.

If homeless: a statement from the shelter in which the applicant resides or visits; physical observation of location of residence by eligibility staff; a written statement from the applicant describing living circumstances may be used, signed and dated by the applicant. Eligibility staff may provide assistance with writing the statement; or a statement from a social service agency attesting to the homeless status of the applicant.
