PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the rulemaking is to amend existing rule language to clarify that students meeting the definition in section 766.1115(3)(d)15., Florida Statutes, are eligible to participate in the Volunteer Health Care Provider Program as described in that section.

SUMMARY: The proposed amendments clarify the types of licensure, certification, or documentation that must be held by a volunteer health care provider participating in the Volunteer Health Care Provider Program and adds paragraph (g) to subsection 64I-2.004(1), F.A.C., to clarify that health care provider students may provide volunteer health care services if certain conditions are met.

(2) All persons who desire to make such shipments shall first secure a special permit for such shipments by application on forms under Rule 20-100.004, F.A.C., to be furnished by the Department of Citrus. A single application for permits may cover a full shipping season, however a separate permit must be used for each shipment. The permit application shall

affirmatively show that the fresh citrus fruit so shipped will be converted into a product which comes within the definition of "commercial processing" as defined herein. A maturity inspection certificate shall be obtained for each shipment and a copy of this certificate shall accompany the special permit as evidence of maturity compliance.

A single application for permits may cover a full shipping season, however a separate permit must be used for each shipment. Special Transportation Permits may be issued to persons, firms or organizations approved by the Department of Citrus, and engaged in the business of transporting gift fruit shipments for a number of individual express or gift fruit shippers.

62-308.100 Synthetic Turf.

(1) Scope.

(a) "Synthetic turf" is defined by s. 125.572(1), F.S.

(b) ~~(a)~~ Pursuant to s. 125.572, F.S., this rule ~~only~~ establishes minimum standards for the installation of synthetic turf, ~~as defined by section 125.572(1), F.S.~~, on single-family residential properties of 1 acre or less in size. Pursuant to s. 125.572(3), F.S., local governments may not regulate synthetic turf in a manner inconsistent with these minimum standards. This rule does not establish nor require any new department-issued permit or authorization for the installation of synthetic turf, ~~nor~~

~~does it prohibit any local government ordinance, resolution, order, rule or policy that regulates synthetic turf provided it complies with s. 125.572, F.S., and this rule. A local government is prohibited from adopting or enforcing any ordinance, resolution, order, rule, or policy that regulates synthetic turf which is inconsistent with the standards adopted under this rule.~~

~~(b) Nothing in this rule prohibits a local government from restricting the installation of synthetic turf on rights of way owned or giving legal right or control to an entity other than the residential property owner.~~

~~(c) These standards do not modify the property rights of any entity, including any fee simple interests or any less-than-fee interests, such as easements or rights of way.~~

(3) Color. Green synthetic turf shall be allowed. ~~No local government may prohibit the use of green synthetic turf.~~

GENERAL SUBJECT MATTER TO BE CONSIDERED: The Florida Department of Education (Department) announces a public comment period and public hearing for proposed revisions to Florida's Perkins State Plan related to the allocations for the Rural Innovation Grant. The public comment period runs from March 24, 2026, to April 24, 2026. An online public hearing will be held March 24, 2026.

The Rural Innovation Grant is funded by the federal Perkins grant and provides funding for career and technical education programs in counties designated as rural or nonrural counties with rural municipalities. Rural areas are defined by the state and documented by the Rural Economic Development Initiative (REDI), which recognizes those rural or economically distressed counties or communities designated pursuant to sections 288.0656 and 288.06561, Florida Statutes, as REDI qualified. The designation of the REDI counties is updated periodically. Only rural counties and nonrural counties with rural municipalities as identified by REDI shall be considered for participation in this funding.

The Department proposes to make the following changes to the State Plan regarding this allocation beginning with the 2027-2028 program year.

- The formula for calculating the allocations for rural counties will be changed from a base allocation of \$50,000 plus a proportionate share of the remaining total state allocation to a base allocation of \$50,000 plus an inverse proportionate share of the remaining total state allocation. The inverse proportionate share will give smaller counties a larger share of the allocation.
- The allocation for nonrural counties with rural municipalities will be \$25,000.
