**PURPOSE AND EFFECT:** The proposed rule amendments will reclassify some shellfish harvesting areas to protect the health of shellfish consumers and to provide access to renewable shellfish resources. The proposed rule amendment will also clarify requirements related to commercial shellfish activities. The rulemaking updates the National Shellfish Sanitation Program Model ordinance to the 2023 revision, defines the terms “marina” and “mooring area,” adds language to allow remote buying, clarifies wet storage requirements and corrective actions, and clarifies tagging requirements.

**SUBJECT AREA TO BE ADDRESSED:** The rulemaking will address shellfish harvesting areas and management plans, will update standards and requirements related to harvesting and processing shellfish, and will revise rule text to clarify the obligations of regulated persons.

60LER26-1          Amendment of Rule 60L-32.0071, F.A.C.

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: Executive Order 26-033 declared a state of emergency for the State of Florida because drought conditions posed a severe threat to the State of Florida. Executive Order 26-080 extended Executive Order 26-033 as a result of continued extreme drought conditions and wildfire risks, which

now require that timely precautions are taken to protect the communities, critical infrastructure, and general welfare of this State.

**REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES:** The procedure is fair in that it temporarily provides all agencies with the ability to provide necessary compensation to the additional employees that need to be deployed for the purpose of avoiding the prevention, hindrance, or delay of actions coping with the emergency; provides at least the procedural protections given by other statutes, the State Constitution, or the United States Constitution; and takes only action that is necessary to protect the public interest under the emergency procedures in a manner that treats all similarly affected state employees fairly.

**SUMMARY:** This rule modifies Rule 60L-32.0071, F.A.C., to allow agencies to provide extraordinary payment to employees at the bureau chief or bureau chief comparable level under certain circumstances.

**60LER26-1 Amendment of Rule 60L-32.0071, F.A.C.**

Rule 60L-32.0071 is amended as follows:

60L-32.0071 Selected Exempt Service Extraordinary Payment Plan.

(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection 60L-34.0031(3), F.A.C., an agency may propose, for Department approval, an agency-wide plan to compensate excluded Selected Exempt Service (SES) employees below the bureau chief or bureau chief comparable level who are directed to work hours in excess of the contracted hours in the regular work period in response to an unforeseen extraordinary event or occurrence to provide agency mission critical services to the public subject to the following:

(1) through (6) renumbered (a) through (f) No Change.

(2) An agency with an activated SES extraordinary payment plan as provided in subsection (1) may provide extraordinary payment to excluded SES employees at the bureau chief or bureau chief comparable level who are directed to work hours in excess of the contracted hours in the regular work period in order to cope with the emergency conditions underlying Executive Order 2026-033, and any extensions thereto. Agencies are not required to submit to the Department an additional SES extraordinary payment plan in order to provide compensation under this subsection.
