(1) In order to operate a nurse registry as defined under section 400.462, F.S., the owner shall make application for a

license as required by Rule 59A-35.060, F.A.C. on the Health Care Licensing Application, Nurse Registry, AHCA Form 3110-7004, March 2016, incorporated by reference and available at <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-07162>, and the Health Care Licensing Application Addendum prescribed in subsection 59A-35.060(1), F.A.C. Applicants for renewal of a nurse registry license may submit the Health Care Licensing Online Application, Nurse Registry, AHCA Form 3110-7004OL, March 2016, incorporated by reference and available at <https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-07163>. The application forms are available online at: <http://ahca.myflorida.com/HQALicensureforms> or, for online renewal submissions, at: <http://apps.ahca.myflorida.com/SingleSignOnPortal>. The application shall be accompanied by a \$2,000 licensure fee. The application and other pertinent information can be obtained at the AHCA website: <http://ahca.myflorida.com/HQALicensureforms>. The receipt of a license from AHCA shall be based upon compliance with all applicable rules and laws, as evidenced by a signed application and upon the results of a survey conducted by AHCA representatives.

(2) For renewal and change of ownership licensure, the application forms and licensure fee in subsection (1) must be submitted as required in section 408.806(2), F.S. and Rule 59A-35.060, F.A.C.

(3) through (7) No Change

(8) If a change of address is to occur, or if a nurse registry intends to change the counties served within the geographic service area, or open or close a satellite office, the nurse registry must complete and submit the Health Care Licensing Application, Nurse Registry, AHCA Form 3110-7004, ~~August 2023~~ ~~March 2016~~, within the timeframe prescribed in paragraph 59A-35.040(2)(b), F.A.C. For changes of address and addition of satellite offices, the nurse registry must submit, with the application, evidence that the location is zoned for a nurse registry for the new address and evidence of legal right to occupy the property in accordance with sections 400.506(1)(c) and 408.810(6), F.S.

(9) A nurse registry has the following responsibility in terms of hours of operation:

(a) No change.

(b) When the administrator, or the designated alternate, are not on the premises during designated business hours, pursuant to paragraph ~~59A-18.004(9)(a), F.A.C.~~ ~~59A-18.004(8)(a), F.A.C.~~, a staff person must be available to answer the phone and the door and must be able to contact the administrator, or the alternate, by telecommunications during the designated business hours. This individual can be a clerical staff person.

Pursuant to Section 465.014, F.S., an applicant seeking in order to be registered as a pharmacy technician in Florida, an applicant must complete have completed a pharmacy technician training program approved by the Board. The standards for approval of a registered pharmacy technician training program are as follows.

(1) Preapproved pharmacy technician training programs. Automatically approved training ~~The standard for approval of Registered Pharmacy Technician Training programs provided~~

or offered by accredited institutions or entities is dependent upon whether the program or institution is, as of July 1, 2025,:

(a) Accredited ~~accredited~~ by a regional, ~~or~~ national ~~accrediting agency; a regional or national institutional accrediting agency;~~ or a specialized accrediting agency recognized by the Secretary of the United States Department of Education;

(b) Accredited ~~accredited~~ by an ~~accrediting agency that qualifies for whose accreditation establishes eligibility to participate in the~~ Title IV federal student aid financial assistance program administered by United States Department of Education; or

(c) Offered ~~Pharmacy technician training programs within Florida's the public-school system of the State of Florida that comply with the Florida Department of Education Curriculum Framework for Pharmacy Technician (2025-2026 2018-2019), program number 8418200 H170500; which is incorporated herein by reference and which can be obtained at https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-19598 10356 or https://www.fldoe.org/core/fileparse.php/20821/urlt/8418200-2526.rtf; or http://www.fldoe.org/core/fileparse.php/18567/urlt/H170500-1819.rtf.~~

(d) Pharmacy technician training programs recognized by the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board (PTCB); ~~or;~~

(e) No Change.

(2) Federal Armed Services programs. Training ~~The standard for approval of pharmacy technician training programs developed provided~~ by a branch of the federal armed services ~~shall be whether the curriculum of such course was developed on or before December 1, 2025, are approved. June 1, 2018.~~

(3) Other non-employer based programs. Programs ~~The standard for approval of all programs offered or accredited by an entity not listed in subsection (1) or (2), and which are not employer based must programs, is whether the program:~~

(a) Be ~~Meets the requirements of and is~~ licensed by the Commission for Independent Education pursuant to Chapter 1005, F.S., or the equivalent licensing authority of another state or jurisdiction or is within the public school system of the State of Florida;

(b) Include ~~Offers a course of study that includes~~ classroom study and clinical instruction that includes the following:

1. Introduction to pharmacy and health care systems: Confidentiality and Patient Privacy requirements including HIPAA compliance and patient rights;

~~a. Confidentiality,~~

~~b. Patient rights and Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA).~~

2. Pharmacy law: Federal and Florida specific statutes and regulations;

- a. Federal law;
 - b. Florida State law;
 - e. Florida State rules;
 - d. Pharmacy technician Florida rules and law.
3. Pharmaceutical Concepts – Medical medical terminology, medication safety (including error prevention) abbreviations, and prescription handling; symbols:
- a. Medication safety and error prevention;
 - b. Prescriptions and medication orders.
4. Records and Inventory management, Inventory and inventory control, billing processes, handling of pharmaceutical supplies, labeling requirements, and compliance for controlled substances;:
- a. Pharmaceutical supplies;
 - b. Medication labeling;
 - e. Medication packaging and storage;
 - d. Controlled substances;
 - e. Adjudication and billing.
5. Communication and Ethics: Interpersonal skills relations, diversity awareness, empathetic communication communications, and professional ethics;:
- a. Diversity of communications;
 - b. Empathetic communications;
 - e. Ethics governing pharmacy practice;
 - d. Patient and caregiver communication.
6. Pharmaceutical calculations: Accurate computation of medication dosages and related calculations.
- (c) Applies directly to the Board of Pharmacy on approved form DH-MQA 1239 “Application for Registered Pharmacy Technician Training Programs.” and includes All applications must include the following information:
1. No Change.
 2. Curriculum Copy of curriculum, catalog or other course descriptions; and,
 3. No Change.
- (d) Utilize principles of adult education through effective teaching methods and learning experience. Uses materials and methods that demonstrate that:
1. Learning experiences and teaching methods convey the content stated above.
 2. Time allocated for each participant shall be sufficient to meet the objectives of each activity.
 3. Principles of adult education are utilized in determining teaching strategies and learning activities.
- (e) Employ qualified Demonstrates that the faculty and demonstrate is qualified to teach the subject matter by complying with the following:
1. Evidence The program shall provide evidence of academic preparation or experience in the subject matter with by submitting a job description, resume or curriculum vitae

which describes the faculty member’s work experience and level of academic preparation.

2. When the subject matter of an offering includes pharmacy technician practice, a licensed pharmacist or registered pharmacy technician with expertise in the content area must be involved in the planning and instruction.

3. Clinical instruction supervision by licensed pharmacists or registered pharmacy technicians. Pharmacy technician faculty supervising learning experiences in a clinical area in this State shall be licensed or registered.

(4) Employer sponsored training programs. Programs All other pharmacy technician training programs not identified in subsections (1) (3) must be employer sponsored by a Florida permitted pharmacy; or affiliated group of pharmacies under common ownership and, must:

(a) through (c) No Change.

(d) Give participants an opportunity to evaluate learning experiences, instructional methods, facilities and resources used for the program and offering. To ensure participants will be given an opportunity to evaluate the program, the applicant must submit a sample evaluation to be reviewed by the Board;:

(e) Include a final assessment with Ensure that self-directed learning experiences, including but not limited to home study, computer programs, internet or web based courses evaluate participant knowledge at the completion of the learning experience. The evaluation must include a minimum of one hundred (100) questions, requiring. The participant must achieve a minimum score of seventy percent (70%) on the evaluation to receive the certificate of completion. The evaluation must be graded by the provider.

(f) Designate a Program Director. Ensure input from a licensed pharmacist or registered pharmacy technician in overall program planning and evaluation unless the director is a licensed pharmacist or registered pharmacy technician; to assume responsibility for registered pharmacy technician training program. If the contact person is not a licensed pharmacist or registered pharmacy technician, provision shall be made for insuring licensed pharmacist or registered pharmacy technician input in overall program planning and evaluation.

(g) Maintain Establish written policies and procedures; for implementation of the registered pharmacy technician training program.

(h) Maintain a system of record-keeping which stores records for at least three (3) years; provides for storage of program information.

(i) Have Maintain program records for a period not less than three (3) years during which time the records must be available for inspection by the board or department;:

(j) Issue Furnish each participant with an authenticated Certificates individual Certificate of Completion; and-

(k) No Change.

(5) Reenrollment in employer-sponsored training programs. Any student who failed to complete an employer sponsored training program within the time periods established in paragraph (4)(c) must be terminated from the program. ~~Reenrollment is. After termination, the Program Director may allow a student to reenroll in the program,~~ at the Program Director's discretion and pursuant to the program's ~~written~~ policies and procedures. ~~Reenrollment requires completion of. Reenrolled students must complete the entire program with no credit for prior work, including all required program hours, and no coursework or hours previously completed may be carried forward into the subsequent enrollment.~~

The following are technical changes to the Notice of Proposed Rule (NOPR) and eight forms for Rules 62-6.004, 62-6.011, 62-6.019, 62-6.020, 62-6.021, 62-6.023:

62-6.004 Application for System Construction Permit.

(1) No person must cause or allow construction of a system without first applying for and obtaining a system construction permit.  APPROVAL LAKE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 2026-11
 The Florida Department of Commerce (“Department”) hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by

Lake County, Florida (the “County”), Ordinance No. 2026-11 (the “Ordinance”).

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Green Swamp Area is designated by section 380.0551, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. The County is a local government within the Green Swamp Area.
2. The Ordinance was adopted by the County on March 10, 2026, and rendered to the Department on March 26, 2026.
3. The Ordinance amends Section 9.02.00 of the Lake County Code, Land Development Regulations, entitled Tree Protection, to clarify and standardize requirements related to tree protection, removal, and mitigation in connection with development projects.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. See, section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes.
5. “Land development regulations” include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. See, section 380.031(8), Florida Statutes. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.
6. The Ordinance is consistent with the County’s Comprehensive Plan as required by Section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, generally, and is specifically consistent with Goal 1-1, Policy I-1.1.8, and Policy III-3.2.5.
7. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. See Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes.
8. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in Rule 28-26.003, Florida Administrative Code.
9. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development in Rule 28-26.003, Florida Administrative Code, as a whole and specifically with the following principle:

- (a) Minimize the adverse impacts of development on resources of the Floridan Aquifer, wetlands, and flood-detention areas.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that the Lake County Ordinance No. 2026-11 is consistent with the Lake County’s Comprehensive Plan and the Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby APPROVED.

This Final Order becomes final 21 days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below.
